## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

November 15<sup>th</sup> (when it doesn't fall on a Sunday) is the Feast of St Albert the Great, O.P., most famous for being the principal teacher of St Thomas Aquinas, O.P. In the history of the empirical sciences, he is sometimes referred to simply as “Albertus Magnus.” The Midwest or Central Province of Dominican Friars here in the U.S. has him as their special patron. They are the Province of St Albert the Great, with their headquarters in Chicago.



In the thirteenth century when St Albert lived, peering into the nature of things and exploring the mysteries of creation were sometimes looked upon with great suspicion. Many thought that such knowledge was beyond the reach of the human mind, or at least that man should not delve into the “whys and wherefores” of the world we live in; it was regarded as pride, as treading on God's domain.

But Albert was fascinated with all of creation; there was no field of scientific investigation that he did not want to explore. In the course of his long life, he wrote about botany, astronomy, chemistry, physics, biology, geography and meteorology, just to name a few!

For St Albert there was no conflict between science and faith. He was first and foremost a man of deep faith. St Albert knew that God was both the Author of creation and the Author of revelation, and that there cannot ultimately be any conflict between the two. Any seeming contradictions are due, not to any fault on God's part, but rather on our own limited human understanding. As someone once said, ‘Mystery’ is not an absence of intelligibility but rather a superabundance of truth.

St Albert the Great was born sometime before the year 1200 and died on November 15, 1280, outliving his more famous student, St Thomas Aquinas, by about 5 years. His relics are venerated in the crypt of our Dominican church of St Andrew in Cologne, Germany.

St Albert the Great, man of science and faith, pray for us!

1. Go to [flocknote.com/login](https://flocknote.com/login)
2. Enter your email address (the address that already received Flocknote emails)
3. Click "Reset or create a password" below the big blue "Sign In" button.
4. After that, click the yellow "Rest my password" button, and follow the prompts from there. Flocknote will send you a link to create a password.

Once you have your Flocknote login and password, log in to Flocknote. Once in Flocknote on the St. Denis dashboard you will see a large picture block of Bishop Barron that says, "You've got Word on Fire ENGAGE." Click on the orange button that says "Visit WoFDigital.org" and you have arrived!

Now that we are allowed to celebrate Mass in public, with precautions, we will continue to live stream all three weekend Mass, as well as our weekday Masses, for anyone who chooses to or who must remain at home at this time. Simply visit [saintdenisparish.org](http://saintdenisparish.org) and click on the box entitled "Live Streaming" to access St Denis Masses from home. Until we can figure out if it's possible to record the Masses through the digital camera installed in church, the recording of one Mass and uploading to YouTube will not continue. We will keep you posted.

**The Church is open daily for private prayer from 8:00 am-4:00 pm.** Please use the side entrance and practice social distancing from others who may be praying.

### Some notes regarding Mass attendance

- **Attendance is limited to 80 people per Mass** to allow for appropriate distancing. **Please know we have not reached that limit for any one Mass yet.** Also, the basement is available for overflow seating should we need it.
- **The sound on the Smart TV in the basement is fixed and so overflow seating, or for those who would feel more comfortable for your or your children's sake, is available down in the Parish Hall.**
- The 5:00 PM Saturday Vigil Mass has had very small attendance these past weekends and would provide an assured opportunity for a seat.

### Distribution of Holy Communion

At weekday Masses at St Denis, the distribution of Holy Communion begins as soon as Father Brian has gone into the sacristy to wash his hands and put on his protective gear, and Father will be in the sanctuary until 8:00 am.

For Sunday Masses, since the distribution of Holy Communion begins the same way and lasts about 10 minutes, the distribution of Holy Communion outside of that time frame usually will not be available.

### Important things to note

- **One restroom is available for each Mass. Please be sure to use the restroom that has the time for the Mass you are attending on the door.** That way we can thoroughly disinfect afterwards and keep the other restroom clean for the next Mass.
- The obligation we have as Catholics to attend Sunday Mass still remains suspended in the Diocese of Manchester.
- If you choose to come to Mass, a face covering is required.
- Please enter through the front/main doors of the Church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed once Mass has ended. You are asked to exit via the side door after receiving Communion.

**Personal Protective Equipment:** The parish is gratefully accepting donations of disposable, non-surgical **masks**, disposable **gloves**, and **disinfectant wipes**, if parishioners know how and where to procure a supply of these items. You can even submit the receipts for such items to the parish office to receive credit as a donation to St Denis.
