
PARISH MEMBERSHIP


MARRIAGE: Engaged couples must contact the parish office at least six months in advance of scheduling a wedding.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

Continuing the theme of last week's "Pastor's Corner," in which I wrote about the Feast of St Nicholas, which coincided with the Second Sunday of Advent, so this weekend, we'll discover something about the **Feast of St Lucy**, December 13, which happens to be the Third Sunday of Advent this year. Both St Nicholas' Day and St Lucy's Day have lots of Advent themes, as well as popular devotions surrounding them.

In the Scandinavian countries, in the centuries when they were Catholic, there arose a lot of folk traditions associated with the Feast of St Lucy, which, interestingly enough, perdured even after the Scandinavian countries became officially Lutheran. The Feast of St Lucy is a *festival of light*, as well as a *festival of young women of marriageable age*. The association with light is, of course, from the Latin roots of St Lucy's name from *lux, lucis*, the Latin word for light. But also, December 13, in northern climes, is smack in the midst of the shortest days of the year – the longest nights of the year – and so light is a longed-for commodity. And because St Lucy was a young girl of about thirteen years old when she was martyred because she would not accept a human spouse, but remained faithful to her Divine Spouse, Christ – the Feast of St Lucy was a day for young women to wear a wreath of candles on their heads (don't try this at home!) and to dream of their husbands-to-be.

In Italy, especially on the island of Sicily where St Lucy lived (early 4th cent. AD), she is honored as the Patron Saint of eyes, and those with eye afflictions seek her intercession. In iconography, St Lucy is often shown holding her eyes on a plate, because her torturers gouged out her eyes before murdering her. There was a fire, a light that filled the young St Lucy, and her persecutors tried to extinguish that light by attacking her eyes. But the light of St Lucy was the Light of the World; it was Christ our Lord Himself, her divine Spouse, and nothing that men could do to her could extinguish that Light. As it says in the opening verses of the Prologue of St John's Gospel: *What came to be through Him was life, and this life was light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.* (Jn 1:4).

Access to Bishop Barron's Word on Fire—Our parish has a subscription to Bishop Barron's Word on Fire ENGAGE. All of Bishop Barron's Word on Fire content is available to you in short video segments through St. Denis's Flocknote page. Take a few minutes to check it out and see the wealth of resources at your fingertips!

If you are part of our Flocknote email list you have access to Word on Fire (WoF), but may not have known that. It is easy to access once you know how. You must first create a Flocknote login.

1. Go to flocknote.com/login
2. Enter your email address (the address that already received Flocknote emails)
3. Click "Reset or create a password" below the big blue "Sign In" button.
4. After that, click the yellow "Rest my password" button, and follow the prompts from there. Flocknote will send you a link to create a password.

Once you have your Flocknote login and password, log in to Flocknote. Once in Flocknote on the St. Denis dashboard you will see a large picture block of Bishop Barron that says, "You've got Word on Fire ENGAGE." Click on the orange button that says "Visit WoFDigital.org" and you have arrived!

Now that we are allowed to celebrate Mass in public, with precautions, we will continue to live stream all three weekend Mass, as well as our weekday Masses, for anyone who chooses to or who must remain at home at this time. Simply visit saintdenisparish.org and click on the box entitled "Live Streaming" to access St Denis Masses from home. Until we can figure out if it's possible to record the Masses through the digital camera installed in church, the recording of one Mass and uploading to YouTube will not continue. We will keep you posted.

The Church is open daily for private prayer from 8:00 am-4:00 pm. Please use the side entrance and practice social distancing from others who may be praying.

Some notes regarding Mass attendance

- **Attendance is limited to 80 people per Mass** to allow for appropriate distancing. **Please know we have not reached that limit for any one Mass yet.** Also, the basement is available for overflow seating should we need it.
- **The sound on the Smart TV in the basement is fixed and so overflow seating, or for those who would feel more comfortable for your or your children's sake, is available down in the Parish Hall.**
- The 5:00 PM Saturday Vigil Mass has had very small attendance these past weekends and would provide an assured opportunity for a seat.

Distribution of Holy Communion

At weekday Masses at St Denis, the distribution of Holy Communion begins as soon as Father Brian has gone into the sacristy to wash his hands and put on his protective gear, and Father will be in the sanctuary until 8:00 am.

For Sunday Masses, since the distribution of Holy Communion begins the same way and lasts about 10 minutes, the distribution of Holy Communion outside of that time frame usually will not be available.

Important things to note

- **One restroom is available for each Mass. Please be sure to use the restroom that has the time for the Mass you are attending on the door.** That way we can thoroughly disinfect afterwards and keep the other restroom clean for the next Mass.
- The obligation we have as Catholics to attend Sunday Mass still remains suspended in the Diocese of Manchester.
- If you choose to come to Mass, a face covering is required.
- Please enter through the front/main doors of the Church.
- Holy Communion will be distributed once Mass has ended. You are asked to exit via the side door after receiving Communion.

Personal Protective Equipment: The parish is gratefully accepting donations of disposable, non-surgical **masks**, disposable **gloves**, and **disinfectant wipes**, if parishioners know how and where to procure a supply of these items. You can even submit the receipts for such items to the parish office to receive credit as a donation to St Denis.
