## PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

Back in March, I was contacted by a Humanities teacher at Kimball Union Academy, down the road in Meriden, NH, about the possibility of speaking to her class at KUA that was studying world religions. She had taken the time and effort to bring in guest speakers from the various faiths her students were studying to join the class for a discussion via Zoom. So, I said I would be happy to take part, but only once I had gotten through Holy Week and Easter Week. It was the second full week of April when I zoomed into the class on world religions.

Joining me in the same class time was an Episcopalian rector of a church in western Massachusetts, Heather Blais. The students seemed genuinely interested in their "visitors" to their class that morning and their teacher had had them come up with possible questions for the two of us, based upon their own study of Christianity as a world religion. But there was also plenty of time for more questions and answers arising from the answers that Heather and I gave from our own experience as being ministers of the Gospel and our stories of our discernment of the call to ministry in the Church.

One of the students, during the more "free-wheeling" part of our time with the class, asked the question: "How can Jesus be God and the Son of God at the same time?" A very perceptive question arising from knowledge that Christians believe that God is One God in a Trinity of Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Heather spoke first in responding to the student's question, and she talked about her experience in seminary, when she and her fellow seminarians would "dread" having to preach on the Sunday after Pentecost Sunday, which we celebrate as Trinity Sunday. And she said that they dreaded having to preach on the Trinity, because of how difficult it is to put such a Mystery into words and in a way that doesn't become a theology/philosophy lecture but remains preaching. And then Heather "passed the ball" to me, and I began by saying that we would not know that God is a Trinity of Persons in One God unless Jesus had come into the world to reveal it. It is one of the truths of our Christian faith that we only know by reason of Divine Revelation. And then I said that what the Trinity reveals to us is that God is, in God-self, a Communion of Love, a Communion of Persons – that God, who is love, shares God's love perfectly within God-self. So, at the heart, the source, of everything, there is love. And you and I as persons made in the Image and Likeness of God (who is love) become the persons God intends us to be by entering into a Communion of Love, in imitation of the Communion of love who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but you and I must do it with other persons, not by ourselves.

All in all, I think it was a most enjoyable and worthwhile morning. A blessed Trinity Sunday to you all!

We will continue to live stream all three weekend Masses, as well as our weekday Masses, for anyone who chooses to or who must remain at home at this time. Simply visit [saintdenisparish.org](http://saintdenisparish.org) and click on the box entitled "Live Streaming" to access St Denis Masses from home.

We are now able to record the Masses, and post them on YouTube. When you have clicked on "Live Streaming", listed underneath is: "Watch Mass, or past Masses, on Youtube" Click on that and you will be routed to our YouTube link for the Masses available.

**The Church is open daily for private prayer from 8:00 am- 4:00 pm.** Please use the side entrance and practice social distancing from others who may be praying.

### Some notes regarding Mass attendance

The State of New Hampshire just revised its **COVID-19 guidance for Places of Worship** to remove the 50% capacity restriction that has been in place since last year. The Diocese of Manchester also will be removing its 50% capacity limit. (Here at St Denis, we have capped attendance at about 40% capacity since last year.) Please note, however, that in keeping with the guidance still in place from the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, attendees who are not part of the same immediate household must continue to be seated at least 6 feet apart. So while the overall capacity maximum has been eliminated, the practical reality with 6-foot distancing in place is that attendance capacity still will be far less than 100%. Of course, the other requirements, such as mask wearing, remain in place, and here at St Denis, every other pew will continue to be roped off for the time being.

### Distribution of Holy Communion

Beginning with Pentecost Sunday 2021 (the weekend of May 22/23), Holy Communion will be given to the people at the regular time within Mass. When you get up to receive Holy Communion, be mindful of social distancing from the person or group ahead of you. And after receiving Our Lord in Holy Communion, please return to your place in church by walking all the way around the pews on your side of the church rather than walking back up the main aisle. As we get used to this new procedure over the next few weekends, we might need to make some slight changes logistically to keep the Communion line flowing as smoothly as possible.

### Important things to note

- **One restroom is available for each Mass. Please be sure to use the restroom that has the time for the Mass you are attending on the door.** That way we can thoroughly disinfect afterwards and keep the other restroom clean for the next Mass.
- The obligation we have as Catholics to attend Sunday Mass still remains suspended in the Diocese of Manchester.
- If you choose to come to Mass, a face covering is required.
- Please enter through the front/main doors of the Church.
