
PARISH MEMBERSHIP

If you regularly attend Mass here at St. Denis, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week. Summer Parish Office hours are Tuesday-Wednesday 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM & Thursday 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM. Please note that a family must be registered at St. Denis in order for their children to be enrolled in our religious education program.

INFANT BAPTISM: Takes place normally following the 11:30 AM Mass on Sundays. Families have the option of scheduling a baptism during the 9:00 AM Mass on Sundays. First-time parents are required to attend a pre-baptismal session; please call the parish office to schedule.

MARRIAGE: Engaged couples must contact the parish office at least six months in advance of scheduling a wedding.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

In this 'Pastor's Corner,' on the last weekend of June, I want to touch base with all of you about the lifting of most restrictions in our celebration of Mass in the parish. This will be our third weekend since the pew ropes came down and mask-wearing at Mass became optional. It will be our second weekend since our obligation as Catholics to attend Mass in person on Sundays was restored here in the Diocese of Manchester (as well as throughout VT, MA, and ME.)

I know that some of you are more-than-ready for life to return to some semblance of normalcy, including our celebration of Mass together. However, some of you have to move forward with great caution and at your own pace, especially parishioners who might have other underlying health conditions or who have compromised immune systems for one reason or another. Just as things were before COVID, for such people the Sunday obligation is not binding – in other words, if being in crowds of people with uncovered faces is something you should not be doing on the advice of medical experts, then you are excused from having to attend Mass on Sundays in person. And, as I mentioned, an individual can decide to wear a mask for as long as he or she wants to. The ophthalmologist I see for regular eye exams told me that, this coming winter, even if COVID is not a threat, probably all his staff will be wearing masks, because this past winter, nobody on his staff got a cold or the flu! Personally, I don't see any reason why I would ever stop the practice of doing a thorough washing of my hands with soap and water right before the start of Mass. Over the past 15 months, my personal custom has become to pray, first, the prayer a priest says as he washes his hands before vesting: "*Da, Domine, virtutem manibus meis...*") and then to pray the Our Father (in Latin) and the Hail Mary (in Latin) as I wash and rinse my hands!

Early in the pandemic, churches got a "bad rap" as dangerous places to be because there were reports of outbreaks in small congregations where precautions were not being taken, and people were carrying on as they did before COVID. Obviously, that was not the case at St. Denis. As far as I know, there have been no outbreaks in the State of New Hampshire arising in any of our Catholic parishes. And of course, one can attend a weekday Mass at St. Denis and not a word of it is sung – everything is spoken or recited – and there is plenty of room to spread out in church. That will not be the case at our Sunday Masses from now on, until we are told otherwise. None of us knows if we will stay on the same positive trajectory come this Fall or Winter. The difference between last Fall and Winter is that this year, more of us will be vaccinated.

So, please be patient with one another – whether it's your neighbor who is reveling in the feeling of liberation from restrictions, or your neighbor who, for his or her own reasons, still must proceed with great caution.

Our parish has a subscription to Bishop Barron's Word on Fire ENGAGE. All of Bishop Barron's Word on Fire content is available to you in short video segments through St. Denis's Flocknote page. Take a few minutes to check it out and see the wealth of resources at your fingertips!*

If you are part of our Flocknote email list you have access to Word on Fire (WoF), but may not have known that. It is easy to access once you know how. You must first create a Flocknote login.

1. Go to flocknote.com/login
2. Enter your email address (the address that already received Flocknote emails)
3. Click "Reset or create a password" below the big blue "Sign In" button.
4. After that, click the yellow "Reset my password" button, and follow the prompts from there. Flocknote will send you a link to create a password.

Once you have your Flocknote login and password, log in to Flocknote. Once in Flocknote on the St. Denis dashboard you will see a large picture block of Bishop Barron that says, "You've got Word on Fire ENGAGE." Click on the orange button that says "Visit WoFDigital.org" and you have arrived!

Some notes regarding Mass attendance

With a letter dated June 6th, Bishop Libasci of the Diocese of Manchester eased most restrictions and cautions regarding the celebration of public Masses in the parishes in New Hampshire. Social distancing is no longer required and the wearing of a face covering is optional. It is up to the individual to determine what he or she feels most comfortable with while participating at Mass.

In a second letter dated June 8, the Bishop informed the faithful of the Diocese of Manchester that the Bishops of New England would all be reinstating the Sunday obligation to attend Mass as of the weekend of June 19th/20th, 2021. Obviously, anyone who is sick is not bound by this obligation, as was the case even before the global pandemic. The Offertory Procession (the bringing up of the gifts of bread and wine), the exchange of the Sign of Peace among the people, and receiving the Precious Blood from a common chalice remain suspended.

The church is open daily for private prayer from 7:00 am - 4:00 pm. There are days when it is open later than 4:00 pm such as Wednesdays when Confessions are heard from 4:00 pm - 4:30 pm and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is celebrated at 4:50 pm.


