
PARISH MEMBERSHIP

Please note that a family must be registered at St. Denis in order for their children to be enrolled in our religious education program.

INFANT BAPTISM: Takes place normally following the 11:30 AM Mass on Sundays. Families have the option of scheduling a baptism during the 9:00 AM Mass on Sundays. First-time parents are required to attend a pre-baptismal session; please call the parish office to schedule.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St Denis,

July 25th, if it weren't a Sunday this year, is the Feast of the Apostle James, one of the two sons of Zebedee (along with his brother, the Apostle John), whose mother's name was Salome. He is venerated in a particular way in the famous basilica in Galicia in Spain that bears his name, Santiago de Compostela. He is also sometimes designated as St James the Great to distinguish him from the other Apostle James, the son of Alphaeus, who is sometime referred to as St James the Less (who shares a feast day with the Apostle Philip on May 3rd).

Santiago de Compostela was one of the most famous sights of pilgrimage in medieval Europe, beginning back in the 9th century. *El Camino de Santiago*, the Way of St James, is a whole series of pilgrimage trails, beginning in different towns on the Iberian Peninsula, or beginning even in France and crossing the Pyrenees Mountain range. The various routes the pilgrims travel eventually converge the closer one gets to Santiago de Compostela. The last quarter of the 20th century and the first two decades of the 21st century have seen an upsurge of interest in pilgrims walking El Camino, even among people who aren't particularly faith-filled, but who undertake the month-long hike as a test of the human spirit and an experience of camaraderie with their fellow pilgrims/hikers, somewhat akin (I suppose) to what through-hikers on the Appalachian Trail experience.

The actor Martin Sheen in a 2010 movie called *The Way*, directed by his son Emilio Estevez (who is also in the film alongside his father), plays a 70-year-old American doctor who travels to Spain to claim the body of his son, who had died on the pilgrimage. He decides to complete the walk his son had started and along the way meets other international pilgrims, all there for their own personal reasons.

Finally, **Fr. Jacob Bertrand Janczyk, O.P.**, whom many of you will recall from the year he was assigned here to Aquinas House, along with **Fr. Gregory Pine, O.P.**, has a 2-week pilgrimage along the Camino scheduled for **May 23rd - June 6th, 2022**. If you are part of our Flocknote email list you have access to Word on Fire (WoF), but may not have known that. It is easy to access once you know how. You must first create a Flocknote login.

1. Go to flocknote.com/login
2. Enter your email address (the address that already received Flocknote emails)
3. Click "Reset or create a password" below the big blue "Sign In" button.
4. After that, click the yellow "Rest my password" button, and follow the prompts from there. Flocknote will send you a link to create a password.

Once you have your Flocknote login and password, log in to Flocknote. Once in Flocknote on the St. Denis dashboard you will see a large picture block of Bishop Barron that says, "You've got Word on Fire ENGAGE." Click on the orange button that says "Visit WoFDigital.org" and you have arrived!

Some notes regarding Mass attendance

With a letter dated June 6th, Bishop Libasci of the Diocese of Manchester eased most restrictions and cautions regarding the celebration of public Masses in the parishes in New Hampshire. Social distancing is no longer required and the wearing of a face covering is optional. It is up to the individual to determine what he or she feels most comfortable with while participating at Mass.

In a second letter dated June 8, the Bishop informed the faithful of the Diocese of Manchester that the Bishops of New England would all be reinstating the Sunday obligation to attend Mass as of the weekend of June 19th/20th, 2021. Obviously, anyone who is sick is not bound by this obligation, as was the case even before the global pandemic. The Offertory Procession (the bringing up of the gifts of bread and wine), the exchange of the Sign of Peace among the people, and receiving the Precious Blood from a common chalice remain suspended.

The church is open daily for private prayer from 7:00 am - 4:00 pm. There are days when it is open later than 4:00 pm such as Wednesdays when Confessions are heard from 4:00 pm - 4:30 pm and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is celebrated at 4:50 pm.

OUTREACH

The title for the weekend offertory for the last 2 weekends in July is set aside for the **Parish-to-Parish Support Fund** of the Diocese of Manchester. This collection provides funds that allow parishes in New Hampshire experiencing financial difficulties to request grant assistance. This is one of four "assessed collections" in the Diocese of Manchester, in which the Diocese assesses each parish a certain amount of its annual income as a minimum contribution. Any amount collected in excess of the assessment will be sent in its entirety to the diocese.

The other three assessed special collections are the Diocesan Seminarian Fund (in January), the Peter's Pence Collection (in June), and the Catholic University of America and United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (in September). All other appeals have no stated minimum.



The Listen Community Dinner Program resumed on July 6th. We are looking for volunteers to help provide and serve meals to the needy. We are part of a larger program run by the Listen Community Center, and our job is to prepare and

serve food to approximately 90 people per meal at the Listen Center in White River Junction. For many years now, members of St Denis have provided meals on the **second Wednesday of every month**. Each volunteer/volunteer family is assigned to one of four meal-preparing teams. As a result, each team is responsible for three meals per year.
