
PARISH MEMBERSHIP

Welcome to Saint Denis Parish! We are grateful for your worshipping with us. If you regularly attend Mass here at St. Denis, you are encouraged to register in the parish at the office during the week. Summer Parish Office hours are Tuesday-Thursday 8:00 AM - 3:00 PM. Office is closed on Mondays and Fridays. Please note that a family must be registered at St. Denis in order for their children to be enrolled in our religious education program.

INFANT BAPTISM: Takes place normally following the 11:30 AM Mass on Sundays. Families have the option of scheduling a baptism during the 9:00 AM Mass on Sundays. First-time parents are required to attend a pre-baptismal session; please call the parish office to schedule.

MARRIAGE: Engaged couples must contact the parish office at least six months in advance of scheduling a wedding.

VISITING THE SICK: Please call the parish office to arrange for Communion or for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Denis,

Did you know that when President George Washington issued his "Thanksgiving Proclamation" in 1789, establishing a national day of thanksgiving to God, the date of that Thanksgiving was Thursday, November 26th, 1789? The holiday has been observed on and off since then, and the fourth Thursday of November was made the permanent observation date when signed into law by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt in the early 1940s.

Here is an excerpt from President Washington's 1789 proclamation:

Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor--and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness.

Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be-- That we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks--for His kind care and protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation--for the signal and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of His Providence which we experienced in the course and conclusion of the late war--for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed--for the peaceable and rational manner, in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national One now lately instituted --for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed; and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and in general for all the great and various favors which He hath been pleased to confer upon us.

Did you notice in Washington's Proclamation, there is no mention of Plymouth Rock, or pilgrims, or all the things we were taught in school as children about Thanksgiving? Rather, it was a national day for "acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness."

As Catholics, we have no better way to render thanks to God then coming together for the celebration of Mass. Mass here at St Denis on Thanksgiving Day will be at 9:00 am. To all our parishioners who will be traveling in the week ahead, especially to see family that you were not able to be with last year, "Happy Thanksgiving and safe travels!"

Access to Bishop Barron's Word on Fire—Our parish has a subscription to Bishop Barron's Word on Fire ENGAGE. All of Bishop Barron's Word on Fire content is available to you in short video segments through St. Denis's Flocknote page. Take a few minutes to check it out and see the wealth of resources at your fingertips!

If you are part of our Flocknote email list you have access to Word on Fire (WoF), but may not have known that. It is easy to access once you know how. You must first create a Flocknote login.

1. Go to flocknote.com/login
2. Enter your email address (the address that already received Flocknote emails)
3. Click "Reset or create a password" below the big blue "Sign In" button.
4. After that, click the yellow "Reset my password" button, and follow the prompts from there. Flocknote will send you a link to create a password.

Once you have your Flocknote login and password, log in to Flocknote. Once in Flocknote on the St. Denis dashboard you will see a large picture block of Bishop Barron that says, "You've got Word on Fire ENGAGE." Click on the orange button that says "Visit WoFDigital.org" and you have arrived!



As the holidays approach, the **Upper Valley Haven** is preparing to receive the most donations and give out the most food they do all year. They are looking for volunteers for:

- **Food Shelf-** Curbside service is provided to customers & volunteers fill orders, create food boxes, stock shelves and unload deliveries, and bring order out to shopper on cart.
- **Food Shelf Check-In:** The Haven offers “curbside” food pick up, with a Food Shelf check-in station outside the front door, under a tent. Check-In volunteers greet customers, explain the process, and record customer visits in the Haven’s online system (Link2Feed). Two- hour shifts are available Mon-Fri.
- **The Food Shelf Closing Shift** is Mon-Thu from 3:00-5:00 PM, volunteers work inside the food shelf fulfilling food shelf orders, stocking and getting the food shelf ready to close.
- **Café Volunteer:** Assemble take out lunches in the Café kitchen for 60-80 Grab and Go meals. Join two other volunteers from 9:30-11:30 am, Mon-Thu.
- **Cook at home:** Drop off items such as macaroni salad/potato salad, baked goods, or dinner for eight guests living at Hixon House, our adult shelter.

To sign up, visit our volunteer portal at <https://uppervalleyhaven.volunteerhub.com/>. Volunteers who volunteer onsite must be fully vaccinated. For offsite cooking and dropping off meals or side items, vaccinations are not required.

Helping Hands is preparing for another season of bringing love and good cheer to our neighbors. For many years, each Christmas and Easter season, Helping Hands has delivered gift bags with a holiday plant, a beautiful handmade card from our children in religious education, and a small gift card to a local market. Of course, the operation would not exist without the wonderful and generous support received from you, our fellow Saint Denis parishioners! The recipients of these gift bags are always so appreciative, and include seniors, shut-ins, and families struggling to make ends meet. Thank you again for your donations, and we look forward to another successful season of bringing a little love to our neighbor. Through Helping Hands, St Denis also makes monetary gifts to about a dozen local non-profits here in the Upper Valley every year between Thanksgiving and Christmas.



Listen Holiday Baskets: The program began many years ago as an effort to make sure that our neighbors in the Upper Valley did not face the holidays without gifts for their children and enough grocery money to make a festive meal. Last year Listen helped

486 people celebrate the holidays.
