Covid Protocols

- A reminder that if you are feeling ill in any way, or have been in contact with someone who is, you should not be coming to Mass and putting others at risk.
- Enter/exit through the main front doors only.
- Seating will be in every other pew. Those not related to each other should maintain distance between themselves and others, which will involve spacing as you share pews. Greeters will be at the door to assist with seating and to answer any questions.
- **Masks are to be worn, covering both nose and mouth, according to State of NH Mandate, Portsmouth City ordinance, Diocesan guidelines, and safe practices recommended by the CDC, lowered only when you stand before the priest/minister to receive communion, and then replaced.**
- A basket for your offertory envelope will be at the main entrance to receive your offerings as you enter or leave.
- **Form two spaced lines down the center aisle for Communion, returning to your pew by the side aisles.**
- When Mass ends, maintain social distance as you proceed out the doors. Do not congregate on the front plaza, and keep masks in place until you reach your vehicle.

The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

As we bring the Christmas season to a close with this Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, at the beginning of his public ministry, I want to share the following from an ancient sermon by St. Gregory Nazianzen. It gives much for reflection on these past days and the great significance of the gift, and helps us all go deeper.

Christ is bathed in light; let us also be bathed in light. Christ is baptised; let us also go down with him, and rise with him.

John is baptising when Jesus draws near. Perhaps he comes to sanctify his baptiser; certainly he comes to bury sinful humanity in the waters. He comes to sanctify the Jordan for our sake and in readiness for us; he who is spirit and flesh comes to begin a new creation through the Spirit and water.

The Baptist protests; Jesus insists. Then John says: I ought to be baptised by you. He is the lamp in the presence of the sun, the voice in the presence of the Word, the friend in the presence of the Bridegroom, the greatest of all born of woman in the presence of the firstborn of all creation, the one who leapt in his mother's womb in the presence of him who was adored in the womb, the forerunner and future forerunner in the presence of him who has already come and is to come again. I ought to be baptised by you: we should also add, "and for you," for John is to be baptised in blood, washed clean like Peter, not only by the washing of his feet.



Jesus rises from the waters; the world rises with him. The heavens like Paradise with its flaming sword, closed by Adam for himself and his descendants, are rent open. The Spirit comes to him as to an equal, bearing witness to his Godhead. A voice bears witness to him from heaven, his place of origin. The Spirit descends in bodily form like the dove that so long ago announced the ending of the flood and so gives honour to the body that is one with God.

Today let us do honour to Christ's baptism and celebrate this feast in holiness. Be cleansed entirely and continue to be cleansed. Nothing gives such pleasure to God as the conversion and salvation of men, for whom his every word and every revelation exist. He wants you to become a living force for all mankind, lights shining in the world. You are to be radiant lights as you stand beside Christ, the great light, bathed in the glory of him who is the light of heaven. You are to enjoy more and more the pure and dazzling light of the Trinity, as now you have received – though not in its fullness – a ray of its splendour, proceeding from the one God, in Christ Jesus our Lord, to whom be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen.

Restoration & Repurposing Update

Work has been completed on masonry and flashing on the bell tower and area of connection with the side of church roof, brick, and flashing. Finishing of the pavement area at the base of the side entry granite steps will take place in the Spring when all the landscaping is completed.

Work is progressing on the east elevation of the church on masonry and flashing, with scaffolding still in place for the next couple of weeks. Similar work on the facade of the church will take place in Spring to complete this project, the final part of the restoration efforts.

Greetings!

I want to wish you all a very blessed Christmastide. It was such a blessing to be able to serve as Deacon at all the Holy Masses of Christmas at our beautifully restored Immaculate Conception Church. I say that not merely because of the beauty and majesty of the building, but because I was graced with spending it with you—as this will have been my last Christmas with Corpus Christi.

I want to thank Fr. Marc Montminy of Saints Mary and Joseph in Salem, NH, who permitted me to stay here at Corpus Christi for Christmas. I also want to thank Fr. Gary for being such a great priestly mentor as well as an example of generosity and hospitality.

Then, there's all of you that I want to thank! Because your charity and kindness towards me are so great, I couldn't possibly send individual "Thank-You" cards for all that I have been given. Thank you so much for the cards, prayers, gifts, and words of support. You all are so special to me, not because of what you have given, but because you have been instruments of grace, which has helped me to see how a priest can have the heart of a shepherd for his people. Know of my prayers for you and your families.

So, eleven semesters down, one to go. Then, Deus Vult, I will be ordained a priest of Our Lord Jesus Christ. It's been an incredible time for sure. I return for my final semester at St. John Seminary in Brighton, MA, on January 10th. Barring any snow days, the semester will then be complete on May 12th.

In April, I hope to sit for the comprehensive exam known as the S.T.B. Saint John Seminary is affiliated with the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas (the Angelicum) in Rome. By means of this affiliation, the Angelicum can award the degree of Sacrae Theologiae Baccalaureatus (S.T.B.) to eligible students of St. John's. Concurrently with the Master of Divinity (M.Div.)—which is a civil graduate degree, eligible students can earn the S.T.B.—which is an ecclesiastical (or canonical) graduate degree. Seminarians earning the S.T.B. will have the honor of possessing a degree which is awarded in the name of the Supreme Pontiff, and carries with it canonical rights—notably, eligibility for admission to advanced degrees within the ecclesiastical degree cycle; e.g., the S.T.L. or J.C.L. and finally, the S.T.D. If I could have your prayers as I prepare for this comprehensive exam, I would be very grateful.

Aside from all that I hope you grow closer to the Lord and make haste to encounter him. Always remember that God's Providence governs everything in our lives. And all things work for the good for those who love God.
