Covid Protocols

- A reminder that if you are feeling ill in any way, or have been in contact with someone who is, you should not be coming to Mass and putting others at risk.
- Enter/exit through the main front doors only.
- Seating will be in every other pew. Those not related to each other should maintain distance between themselves and others, which will involve spacing as you share pews. Greeters will be at the door to assist with seating and to answer any questions.
- **Masks are to be worn, covering both nose and mouth, according to State of NH Mandate, Portsmouth City ordinance, Diocesan guidelines, and safe practices recommended by the CDC, lowered only when you stand before the priest/minister to receive communion, and then replaced.**
- A basket for your offertory envelope will be at the main entrance to receive your offerings as you enter or leave.
- **Form two spaced lines down the center aisle for Communion, returning to your pew by the side aisles.**
- When Mass ends, maintain social distance as you proceed out the doors. Do not congregate on the front plaza, and keep masks in place until you reach your vehicle.

The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

The story of the calling of Samuel in this Sunday's liturgy (1 Samuel 3:3-10,19) is simple but stirring. After hearing a voice, running to Eli, and being told "Go back to sleep," he is instructed not to run to a man, but, if called again, to simply respond "Here I am." In no way would the young, and seemingly insignificant Samuel, suspect that the Lord would be calling him. After receiving Eli's direction, he springs to his feet at the third call and, in total willingness, says: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."


This story is ours too. Samuel stands for all of us—people of no great significance in estimation of the world, perhaps—the "small print" of life. We are always in the mind and heart of God. He came among us for all of us, as we were just reminded in the mixed group that assembled at the manger. God is constantly calling us into relationship with Him in the varied circumstances of life. He's not far off and waiting at a finish line for us. In the noisy world we live in, it can be easy for God's voice to be drowned out and not heard; His truth can be seen as one opinion among many. This is why it is important to carve out space in our lives daily to capture some quiet, to pray—and that our prayer involve more than giving God a "to do" list! We can all at times tend to talk too much and listen too little. This can carry over to how we pray.

When we ponder His word, when we revisit the message we receive in the Sunday Liturgy, or perhaps make time to read the daily readings or make it to Mass sometimes during the week, we allow God to direct, console, challenge and guide us. While we can certainly lift up our needs, our hopes, and our gratitude in prayer, we should be sure that an ever-present element in our prayer is the ability to say "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening," and then, to do it! Our open church (7AM to 7PM daily) provides a wonderful way to come apart and be quiet. It is a graced place beyond all others since, at its heart and center, is the Lord Jesus Himself, present in the Tabernacle. I would encourage you, individually, and as families, to come before Him in the spirit of Samuel's "Speak Lord." There are many people and obligations that call us. We don't live in isolation. It can get busy. That's why St. Francis de Sales put it succinctly and clearly when, in his book, *Introduction to the Devout Life*, (which I highly recommend to you), he would advise his readers: "Everyone should pray a half hour a day, unless you are very busy; then, if you are, it should be an hour."

We make time for what we value, for what sustains and strengthens us, whether that be in terms of our bodies or our minds. We need also to be sure there is a fidelity to the care of the soul. All things will pass, but the soul is eternal. We can so easily lose sight of that and, as Henri Nouwen observed, the "urgent" can keep us from the essential. So, where do we start? Start small and let it grow. Be realistic, but hopeful. And, as St. Francis de Sales would put it, "Pray as you can, not as you can't!" Look for routine things in your day when you could be carrying out a simple task with your mind and heart lifted to God. Choose a day or two to drop in to the church for some one-on-one time with Him—maybe Wednesdays, our day of Eucharistic Adoration from 8:30 AM to 6:00 PM—spending a few minutes there as a mid-week recharge. Or, each morning you have an opportunity between 7:00 and 8:00 AM, when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, for some time with Him as the "first fruits" of your day.

May the first reading remind us all that He calls out to all of us—sometimes it's drowned out, other times we just don't expect it! But, if we are going to be able to respond to His call "Come and follow me," as we heard in the Gospel today (John 1:35-42), we have to first have the comfort level that comes from daily contact, knowing without a doubt, that He who calls us is always with us!

NEW! Called Home to the Lord






