Covid Protocols

- A reminder that if you are feeling ill in any way, or have been in contact with someone who is, you should not be coming to Mass and putting others at risk.
- Enter/exit through the main front doors only.
- Seating will be in every other pew. Those not related to each other should maintain distance between themselves and others, which will involve spacing as you share pews. Greeters will be at the door to assist with seating and to answer any questions.
- **Masks are to be worn, covering both nose and mouth, according to State of NH Mandate, Portsmouth City ordinance, Diocesan guidelines, and safe practices recommended by the CDC, lowered only when you stand before the priest/minister to receive communion, and then replaced.**
- A basket for your offertory envelope will be at the main entrance to receive your offerings as you enter or leave.
- **Form two spaced lines down the center aisle for Communion, returning to your pew by the side aisles.**
- When Mass ends, maintain social distance as you proceed out the doors. Do not congregate on the front plaza, and keep masks in place until you reach your vehicle.

The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

After giving short accounts of Jesus' baptism and temptation in the desert, St. Mark describes the beginning of His public ministry. The main content of His preaching is summarized in the following words: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Today we have the account of the call of the first disciples (Mark 1:14-20). They were the brothers Simon and Andrew, James and John. They were all fishermen. When the invitation came, they were working in their boats, mending their nets. At once they left their boats and followed Jesus. They remained fishermen, but what a great difference! Jesus said: "I will make you fishers of men."

Jesus calls us to follow him. We receive His call right where we live and work. He calls us in the ordinary and daily events of our life. When we answer His call to follow Him, a radical change takes place in our lives. The apostles were simple fishermen only. But when they followed Jesus, they became fishers of men for Christ. The same thing happens to us. An ordinary couple, when they follow Christ, is transformed into a couple for Christ. A schoolteacher becomes a teacher for Christ. A bus driver becomes a driver for Christ. A businessman becomes a businessman for Christ. There is a great difference when a person follows Christ, and is aware that he belongs to Christ. Everything in his life changes: his outlook, his thinking, his actions, and his behavior.


There is the story about a tourist who went to London. It was the time when the famous cathedral was still under construction. The tourist asked a mason, "What are you doing?" The man answered despondently, "Well, as you can see, I am piling up stones to build a wall." The tourist asked the same question to another worker, and he answered in a jovial mood: "Oh, I am helping build this magnificent building." Then he asked a third laborer, "What are you doing?" The man stood up with dignity, raised his hands towards the building, and with a big smile said in a loud voice: "I am building a cathedral, the house of God!"

There is a great difference when we are aware that what we are doing is for Christ. That is the beauty of being a follower of Christ. We become God's children. And, we become inheritors of the Kingdom of God! What a joy to be a Christian!


Every day Jesus calls us to follow Him. May our answer be always a resounding and unconditional "Yes" to Him! That will make our life more meaningful, not only to us, but also to every person we meet. Then we are not just followers of Christ. We become also His instruments for the salvation of the whole world.

- ◆ **Restoration work continues** with the masonry repair/sealing and flashing work nearing completion on the east side of the church. The work by the upper clerestory windows, between the upper and lower roofs, is done. Work is now focused on the area of the side entry, Good Shepherd window alcove, and the side entrance. Later in the summer we will finish with some cleaning and repairs/resurfacing on the facade of the church.
- ◆ **Our Christmas Extra Effort Appeal** now stands at **\$44,264.00!** Thank you so much to all who gave offerings at Christmas and to all who have done so by dropping Christmas envelopes in the collection at the doors at Mass, or have mailed them in. 
Summer Camp


