The blessing takes place before the image of the Lord's Tomb. This tradition helps to really set the tone and underscore the focus of what we celebrate in these most sacred days of the year! We began offering this here in 2012 and many have been blest in this way of strengthening the domestic church and living the Liturgical seasons! Looking Back and Looking Ahead with Hope


Dear Family in the Lord,

This week marks one year since we began the repurposing of our grounds and restoration of our church. As you can glimpse from the pictures, the demo of the old school started things off. That began on March 17th, the same day we had the last public Mass in church before Masses were suspended due to the pandemic. Two days later, as I celebrated Mass for the Feast of St. Joseph with just a server, I entrusted our efforts in this building project to St. Joseph the worker. Shortly after, while many were being laid off, our workers, due to the nature of the work and the distancing that was possible, were able to continue without a pause. It was good for them and certainly a blessing for us, as the project could have been delayed. Shortly after this the electricians began rewiring in the church, building cat walks behind the walls to get access, for the first time ever, to the upper areas of the church—enabling us to have the effective lighting we now enjoy.

With great spirit, skill, and expertise, the work continued through the Spring and into Summer, finally enabling us to re-enter our restored church on the last Sunday of the Church year, the Solemnity of Christ the King, the weekend before Thanksgiving. It was finished ahead of schedule despite all the challenges of those days.

What lingers with me, and what I am convinced was the source of the powerhouse of blessings bestowed on us throughout this project, was the fact that, unlike many others, our church was not closed during the months when public Mass was suspended. Every day the Blessed Sacrament was exposed and folks flowed in and out to spend time before the Lord, in His holy dwelling, in adoration. When our native son, Deacon Joseph, was ordained a deacon, it was the first time most in the Cathedral had been to Mass since March 17th. The following weekend we resumed public Masses!

All of this, beyond our expectations, was possible through the generous support, both spiritually and materially, of so many in our parish! I pray that the Lord, never outdone in generosity, will bestow abundant blessings on all who have done, and continue to do so much for His Church and our Parish! So much time and talent was shared. So many were “behind the scenes” cleaning, prepping, and putting it all together for us to resume the use of our newly restored church. I have been, and continue to be, inspired and uplifted by so many of you!



So, this Wednesday, as we honor St. Patrick, we look back, and presently give thanks for a thriving new St. Patrick Academy, with waiting lists for each grade, and a new gym and activity center nearing completion for a June opening. As we celebrate St. Joseph this Friday, we will offer special thanks for his protection and intercession for all who labored for this project. We truly, even in dark days that had many overwhelming challenges for us all, stepped out to “embrace a future full of hope” in many ways! The results, and all that lies before us as we continue to welcome new life to our community, certainly underscores that it is more than a slogan—we truly have a future full of hope!

I am so grateful for all your care, love, concern, and personal support. These years have been challenging as we’ve visioned and planned and moved from Maintenance to Mission, and this last year was a busy and exhausting one in many ways, but, His be the glory for what He stirred up within us and among us!


Each Friday at 8:30 AM and 7:00 PM, using different reflections each week to link His way with ours. Concludes each week with blessing with the relic of the True Cross.

Solemnity of St. Joseph




This year the annual Solemnity of St Joseph takes on special significance as it occurs within this Year of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church.
