The blessing takes place before the image of the Lord's Tomb. This tradition helps to really set the tone and underscore the focus of what we celebrate in these most sacred days of the year! Multi-colored brochures are available in baskets at the church doors. Consider taking one as your guide in embracing this tradition. We began offering this here in 2012 and many have been blest in this way of strengthening the domestic church and living the Liturgical seasons! The Blessing will be given on **Holy Saturday, April 3rd, at 4:00 PM.**

At the St. Joseph altar, the votives will burn with Birthday Blessings for Msgr. Edward Kelley.




The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

Today brings us into the final week of Lent before we cross the threshold into the holiest days of the year with the Liturgy of Passion (Palm) Sunday next weekend. Throughout the coming week, the focus of the scriptures zeroes in more intently on the Passion of our Lord, hence, traditionally, these final days were known as "Passiontide." We are surrounded by shrouded sacred images, and invited to look within rather than around, for reflections of holiness. We will gaze upon the Cross once again as it is unveiled and triumphantly carried up the aisle in the Liturgy of Good Friday for our veneration. As we celebrate the Risen One, the sacred images are unveiled as symbols of those who reflected His life and light, as we are called to, and as we are invited to symbolize, when we take lighted candles in our hands, kindled from the newly blest and ignited Paschal Candle on the night of nights, the greatest celebration of the Liturgical Year – the Solemn Easter Vigil. I urge you to plan now to set aside Holy Week to be united with our Lord and your community of faith as we enter these grace-full days!

If you have yet to join us I urge you to come tonight for the final part of Lenten Lamentations. In the sorrowful anthems and meditation offered tonight, we focus on the crucifixion, death and burial of our Lord. As a young boy, serving this devotion for my pastor, I was deeply moved. Its music, going back to 18th century Poland, is haunting and truly underscores the great gift of love we recall in the Passion of our Lord. It affected my prayer like nothing had up to that point. With a grateful heart, to my pastor Fr. K and that parish, I have brought this devotion to every place I have served. It's a treasure that touches many hearts, as the comments from so many of you assure me is the case here since we started it back in 2012. I am very grateful to Lisa and the cantors who present this meditation in song so powerfully for us each year. This year I am also most grateful to our own Deacon Joseph for accepting my invitation to preside at the devotion, offer the meditation, and impart Benediction. It has led me to be able to really drink it all in and, as I look at him kneeling on the altar steps, I can't help but remember my old pastor, my days as his server, and now, the "third generation" is offering this beautiful tradition for our Lenten enrichment. We are posting each section of the devotion on our YouTube channel as well, accessed through the parish website, so you can perhaps re-listen and use each part as you prepare, in these days of Passiontide, and live through Holy Week. I plan to!

Now, in the last week, we need to prepare our hearts, remove whatever hinders us from being receptive to the fullness of His grace in these coming days and in the following fifty days of Easter! The call that opened Lent "Come, let us set things right" and "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" underscores the importance of making Lent personal, bringing its message home and its embrace complete, as we make a sincere, honest Lenten Confession. If you've yet to do so, I use the words of St. Paul from the second reading of Ash Wednesday and make them my own: "I implore you in Christ's name, be reconciled to God!" This is the last week that confessions are scheduled before Holy Week. There are no confessions scheduled in the days immediately preceding Easter. Now is the time! We prepare to enter the holiest days of the year by this Lenten response to His call. You will note the schedule elsewhere in this bulletin – I will be available every day this week, actually twice each day – for you! Let nothing get in the way!


Friday at 8:30 AM and 7:00 PM, using different reflections each week to link His way with ours. Concludes each week with blessing with the relic of the True Cross.

As in the past few years, we will once again be praying the Divine Mercy Novena from Good Friday to the Saturday before the Feast of Divine Mercy (April 2—10). You could pray individually, uniting yourself with our community at prayer, as a family, or, if able, join us for the daily communal Novena prayers: Good Friday at 12noon, Holy Saturday at 9AM, Easter Sunday with Benediction at 7PM, then before a special 6:30 PM Mass Monday through Friday at 6:15 PM, and on Saturday after 8AM Mass. The Feast of Divine Mercy will be observed on April 11th with Solemn Mass at 10:30 AM and Devotions at 3:00 PM. Spread the word!

Reservations are now closed for all Triduum & Easter Liturgies

As announced last week in the bulletin and in a Flock-note email, in order to comply with Covid precautions we required that advanced reservations be made for the Liturgies of the Triduum and Easter Sunday. For those who are at risk or unable to attend Mass, or who were not able to make a reservation, we plan to livestream the Triduum Liturgies, and we will also provide an opportunity to receive Holy Communion on Easter Sunday. Watch next week's bulletin for more details!

Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation. Obviously, this is a difficult situation, and we are grateful we do not have to do this every weekend, as many other parishes do, but it is necessary for these days.

Restoration & Repurposing Update

It was great to see the scaffolding come down a couple of weeks ago as Phase One of masonry and flashing work on the east side was completed. Phase two will do some sealing work on the clerestory windows and then move to masonry work on the facade of the church over the summer. Finishing work on tower interior walls will also be occurring over the summer, and some repair/repainting of bricks at various areas of need throughout the exterior.

The landscaping work will be completed in late April/early May, and the lots will receive their second coat of asphalt and finishing work. Three "highlight" areas will be added to our grounds over the Summer—more on that to come! We are also finalizing plans to replace the exterior crosses on the church front and bell tower. The current ones are in disrepair and badly deteriorating after being in place since 1934! The one for the tower is being designed to be a bit larger and in better proportion to the tower height.

Finally, when heating season comes to an end, a new boiler will be installed to replace the current one, which has been long overdue in need of replacement. We recently sought proposals and have finalized plans to move forward.

Lastly, as you can see from the update elsewhere in the bulletin each week, new donations continue to be made to our Capital Campaign to fund these final steps. Just last week, a donor presented us with a check for \$20,000.00 to apply toward the new boiler. Others, who already pledged, are making payments on those pledges faithfully. Your generosity and your prayerful and personal support have all been over the top and have led us to be able to do all we have done with facilities to bring them into great shape and to be available to serve our community in its future needs! Indeed, we are embracing a future full of hope! Stay tuned for more updates as we move forward, with finalization of all aspects of this process targeted for completion by October.
