Even with pandemic challenges, so many of our families blossomed, and even surprised themselves at what they rediscovered and don't intend to lose! Of course, the fruitfulness continues as our two brothers—now newly ordained priests—minister in their parishes each day! And, in a special way, we will see the visible “fruitfulness” of marriage—the Sacrament called to be free, fruitful, and faithful—as our Young Adult Minister Dave and his wife of about three months, Hannah, rejoice and await the birth of Baby Perrella when Winter settles in! Our congrats and prayerful support is extended to them and to all couples expecting the birth of a child in these days! It's wonderful to be welcoming more and more young families among us!


And, as a parish that so faithfully fostered and encouraged vocations, over these past 10 years, prayerfully and personally supported them, and knows how important it is to pray for courage of response in those the Lord is nudging toward Priesthood or Consecrated Religious Life, we can really rejoice in these days! Embracing a Future Full of Hope was not just a Capital Campaign slogan! It defines who we are and where we are heading as a community of faith. The campaign helped us to fund the physical improvements to be used in our expanding life as a parish moving forward.

In these Summer days, on the heels of two Ordinations, it is my great joy to tell you that more vocations are stirring here! You will see an announcement elsewhere in this bulletin about Haley and her entry into the Marian Sisters of Santa Rosa! There are also two other woman discerning religious life who are in contact with religious communities for deeper discernment. In addition, we have a young man of our parish, recently graduated from college, who will share his journey and discernment with you in coming weeks in the bulletin. He was a very visible and plugged-in member of our parish family for many years! And I have begun doing some discernment in Spiritual Direction with a couple of young men who are considering Priesthood. So, let's rejoice and keep the prayers coming!

Finally, in this month we celebrate three beautiful Feasts of our Lady—the Assumption (August 15), The Coronation (August 22), which is beautifully depicted in one of our stained glass windows, and the Solemnity of the Black Madonna, Our Lady of Czestochowa (August 26th). The latter is one of the oldest images of Mary known to Christians! The icon is venerated in our church in our Marian candle shrine. You will note details about a Novena we will offer in the days of these feasts. Please, whether joining us communally in praying these nine days, or at home, plan to be united with us! Brochures with the beautiful prayers will be available starting next weekend.

So, enjoy these remaining days of Summer! Continue to drop in, as so many of you do, and enjoy the wide open doors of our church that symbolize His invitation “Come away by yourself, apart with me, and rest a while!” Know that you inspire me, and it is a great grace for me to serve as your pastor. Recently, later on a Saturday night, I got a text from Fr. Joseph after his full day of doing what priests do, that simply said “Being a priest is the best!!” My response was “Yeah, that's been my take!” Always grateful for this vocation, so happy to have witnessed many embrace it, and always ready to encourage those He nudges to at least explore the possibility!

Join us as we honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary with this monthly observance of these days of reparation and intercession. Holy Mass is at 8:00 AM both days, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament prior to Mass starting at 7:00 AM for your personal prayer and adoration. Litany of the Sacred Heart follows Mass on Friday, and Communal Rosary after Mass on Saturday. Confessions are heard both days after Mass as well. This month, the Friday also happens to be the beautiful Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord.

We are most appreciative of those who joined us recently to help clean out various areas of the parish properties and set us up for a dump run. Special thanks to Joe Mitchell for the transport! NEW! *Accessing the Lower Parking Lot*

Please note, as was announced, access to the church from the new lower parking lot should be via the gradual inclined sidewalk that was installed and not via the courtyard behind the rectory. The courtyard, accessed with 10 steps from the lot and another 10 to church, is not considered a public walkway. Already we have had to repair gates due to them being jammed and improperly opened. When the courtyard is used for parish events, as it has been already, the gates are opened for access. Thanks!


Sanctuary Lamp & Votives

**RCIA INFO NIGHT!**

Would you, or someone you know, like to find out more about how adults can explore the Catholic Faith? If so, we invite you, or them, or you to bring them, to an INFO NIGHT happening at 6:30 PM on **TUESDAY, AUGUST 10th**, in the Vianney Courtyard behind the rectory next to the church. Fr. Gary and our RCIA team will explain a bit about the RCIA process and answer any questions to help those considering it to have a bit more understanding of what's involved. Join us for some refreshments, fellowship and a relaxed evening.

In early Fall, we begin a series of Inquiry sessions for those who were: never baptized, baptized in another Christian denomination, or baptized Catholic but never brought up in the faith. These are relaxed informal gatherings that give insights and offer enrichment in understanding how Catholic Christians live out the Gospel and deepen their walk with the Lord. It's an opportunity to ask questions and question answers. A time to explore without any obligation.

After initial inquiry sessions, those who feel the Lord calling them to go deeper continue in the process known as the “RCIA”: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. For those who so choose, the RCIA leads to reception of the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist—at the Easter Vigil. (If already baptized then the person is “received into the Church” as they renew their baptismal vows, and receives the other two Sacraments to be fully initiated members of the Catholic community.)

Novena to Our Lady

Between the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary (August 15th) and the Solemnity of Our Lady of Czestochowa, the Black Madonna, (August 26th), we invite you to unite in prayer with our parish community



as we seek the intercession of our Blessed Mother in these trying times in our lives as a nation and in the Church. The Novena prayers will be offered at all Masses. You can join us as you are able and also unite in prayer as you offer some of the nine days of the novena in your home. Copies of the Novena, with brief explanation of the “Black Madonna,” will be at the church entrances starting next week-

end. The Novena is from August 17th to the 25th. There will be a **Solemn Mass at 7:00 PM on August 26th**, the Solemnity of the Black Madonna, as has been our custom over these past years. Plan to join us!

Day of Prayer for Priests

This Wednesday is the Feast day of St. John Vianney, patron saint of priests. Since this is our weekly Day of Adoration, we invite you to consider offering it as a special day of intercession for all priests, including our newly ordained, our pastor, as well as all in formation or discerning priestly vocations. We will observe this Feast with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 7:00 to 7:55 AM, Holy Mass at 8:00 AM with prayers at St. John Vianney’s shrine in our church following Mass, then Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place and continue until 12:00 Noon for Adoration opportunity. Confessions will be heard, as usual, after the Exposition following Mass has occurred. We hope you can join us for some aspect of this day of prayer. Prayer cards are available at the statue of St John Vianney in the back of the church for your use throughout the year as well.
