

The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

We live in a celebrity obsessed society—one that places great emphasis on beauty, wealth, fame, and popularity. In sports, business, politics, and even religion, we measure success or failure according to these standards. For example, a business is successful if it generates big profits; a church is successful if it attracts a lot of worshippers; a government is successful if it performs well in the polls.


The Word of God this Sunday challenges these basic assumptions. It defines the meaning of life not in terms of personal gain, self-interest, and shallow success, but rather in terms of one's sense of duty, commitment, and fidelity. Ultimately, it is our ability to live life's bitter disappointments that determines our Christian discipleship.

In the first reading, Isaiah prophesizes about the future Messiah who would vindicate the faithful exiles of Israel and bring them back to their homeland. Isaiah, however, describes this hero figure not in imperial language of power and dominance. He speaks of a humble suffering servant instead.

The Messiah is the one who "would make no resistance, who would not cover his face

against insult and spittle." Like Zechariah, who foretells the king "riding on a donkey," Isaiah goes against the grain of popular hopes and expectations. The Messiah would not follow the script of the empire. He would come as a poor and humble servant in order to minister at the thresholds of human vulnerability. For the Jewish exiles hoping for liberation, this prophecy was a shocking revelation.

There is a similar sense of disbelief in the Gospel story. After surveying the opinion polls about him, Jesus asks the same question of His disciples: "Who do you say that I am?" It is to this question that Peter gives the answer: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."



What follows is an unexpected lesson for Peter and the other disciples.

Peter is praised for recognizing the Messiah. He is called the rock. However, the rock can be either the cornerstone or the stumbling block. So, as long as Peter lives out the call to emulate the Suffering Servant, he is the rock of strength. But if he refuses to be part of Christ's suffering, he becomes the rock of offense. Indeed, Peter is soon rebuked and called a stumbling block precisely because he wants to remove the cross from the mission of the Christ and Christian discipleship.

Peter has a steep learning curve on his way to be the foundation stone for the Christian community. Like Paul falling from his high horse, Peter also has his pride and ambition checked. He learns to carry the cross as a discipleship of trust, powerlessness, vulnerability, and self-sacrifice. He learns to be led to places he'd rather not go. This is not simply geography, but above all a metaphor for vulnerable trust which is an essential quality for Christian living and witness.

May we accept the invitation to take up our cross daily, trusting in the One who carries it with us and comes to dwell within us as we approach the nourishment of the Eucharist!

Mission Co-op Appeal next Sunday

Next weekend, please warmly welcome Fr. Dan Noll, who will speak at all the Masses as part of our annual Mission Co-op Appeal.



Established in 1988, the mission Diocese of Lexington serves 50 counties in central and eastern Kentucky. Only 10 counties lay within the central bluegrass region of the state where economic conditions are favorable. The remaining counties are located in Appalachia, which is noted for an extreme level of poverty.

The population throughout the Appalachian region is less than 1% Catholic and 60% are un-churched. Frequently, Catholicism is misunderstood or even met with hostility by the local population. In spite of this, our outreach services and parish evangelization efforts are beginning to close the gap.

Our ministers and volunteers who work directly with people of Appalachia have found a growing desire for liberation from generational poverty. Through ministries, the Church has brought the presence of Christ to an obscured rural population. Often residents are isolated from basic services of healthcare and education. Catholic efforts help to provide essential food, clothing, and shelter to many who have inadequate means of support.

The parishes and outreach centers in the region are dependent on financial assistance in order to remain in operation. Priests in the area serve multiple locations and often travel 35-40 miles between parishes over mountainous terrain to offer the Sunday liturgy. Deacons and religious provide a vital element in daily parish administration and service to the poor. Ultimately, the Catholic presence in Appalachia would diminish without the generous response from outside resources who share the common mission of Christ.

For these reasons, Bishop Libasci has sent Father Dan Noll, a priest of the Diocese of Lexington, to our parish to give the homily at all of our Masses on **the weekend of September 18-19**. At those Masses, baskets will be at the doors as you leave to support the work of the parishes in the Mission Diocese of Lexington. Please come prepared to be generous. 

RCIA Starts September 21st!

Soon we will begin a series of Inquiry sessions for those who were: never baptized, baptized in another Christian denomination, or baptized Catholic but never brought up in the faith. These are relaxed informal gatherings that give insights and offer enrichment in understanding how Catholic Christians live out the Gospel and deepen their walk with the Lord. It's an opportunity to ask questions and question answers. A time to explore without any obligation.

After initial inquiry sessions, those who feel the Lord calling them to go deeper continue in the process known as the "RCIA": Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. For those who so choose, the RCIA leads to reception of the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist—at the Easter Vigil. (If already baptized then the person is "received into the Church" as they renew their baptismal vows, and receives the other two Sacraments to be fully initiated members of the Catholic community.)

We will kick off the weekly inquiry sessions on **Tuesday, September 21st**, at 6:30 PM in the lower level of our Parish Gathering Hall at 845 Woodbury Ave. Maybe invite someone? Dear Family in the Lord,

The "culture of vocations" that is tangibly experienced in our parish has provided many graces and an atmosphere that encourages those who might be nudged to consider the priesthood or the consecrated religious life to actively discern. So many of you, in so many varied ways, individually and as part of community, are making prayer for all in formation, all discerning, and all who are being nudged and may be hesitant, a part of your daily prayerful intercession.

In recent years, the support of the VSA was instrumental in our parish being able to assist two men in formation for the Priesthood. Fr. Joseph and Fr. Bobby are so grateful, and continue to lift up in their prayers all who assisted. In addition, we were able to provide funding for various efforts to support and encourage others in discernment. These opportunities would not have been possible otherwise.

This Fall, we look to continue our prayerful and personal support for Haley Thompson, who entered the Marian Sisters of Santa Rosa as an aspirant on August 6th. In addition, we wish to support Nathaniel Bald and Dominic Paradis, two young men who recently consecrated their upcoming year of discernment of Priesthood in the consecrated Religious Life to Jesus through Mary here on the Feast of Our Lady of Czestochowa. Dominic will be a full-time employee of the parish this year, overseeing maintenance and upkeep of buildings and grounds. Nate will assist in this area and assist us in Liturgy over the coming months before he leaves for a missionary period teaching English in Madagascar. Your financial support in the VSA will help provide a living stipend for Nate and reduction of college loans for Dominic, needed before admission to any Religious community is possible. We have reason to rejoice in hope in these two faithful and joyful young men!

Now is the time to recommit for another year in the VSA if you're currently a member, or, to sign up and be part of this parish outreach if you've yet to share in it. Prayerfully consider it!
