# The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

This Sunday's Gospel gives us Jesus' comment on His observation of the widow and what, in external terms, seems like a poor offering. This gives us pause to reflect on what is really at the heart of the call to Stewardship for all of us. Stewardship basically refers to our call to use well what has been given to us by God, whether that be our time, talent, or treasure. A good steward is the one who seeks to give the "first fruits," not simply what's left over, to God, who is the source of all that we have and are. It calls us to balance in our lives, to cultivate a generous heart, and, at times, to refrain from trying to satisfy every one of our wants so we may have what is needed to help supply the basic needs of others that may often go unmet.

As a community, we are blessed with many who generously share their time—in ministry, service, outreach to those in need among us, and in the daily operation of our parish community and the care and upkeep of its facilities. There are many who have been given a whole variety of talents and they generously share them, in ways great and small, and we all are enriched. Offered in service to Christ and His Church, they blend together and, in the words of a Preface in the Liturgy, we can truly say, "How wonderful are the works of the Spirit, revealed in so many gifts, yet, how marvelous is the unity the Spirit creates from their diversity, dwelling in the hearts of the faithful, and guiding the Church in His wisdom." Whether it's obvious, or in ways hidden, we are enriched by gifts of time and talent that help to form our community into the place of witness, care, and reverence that it is!

It is also obvious that many do not simply "drop something mindlessly" into the collection basket week after week, or whenever they happen to be here. We would not be sustained by that, we would not be able to continue our ministries or, beyond ourselves, our outreach through SHARE, our adopted community in Ecuador, our support of vocations, or in the various special needs that come up through the seasons of the year. We are blessed by many who prayerfully consider, and periodically review and renew, what they can invest in the life and ministry of this parish in sharing their treasure. We were able to undertake the restoration efforts, and continue them to nearing completion, and at the same time, continue to support daily ministry, physical needs, and the effective operation of our parish and care of its facilities, thanks to a balance between fidelity to weekly stewardship and the extra effort that has marked these past two years.

Today, we are all reminded that what we offer—time, talent, treasure—does not take its value from how much better it is than another, or whether it's "grand" or stands out. May Jesus observe us, as he observed the widow, offering the best we can, from our heart and not our leftovers. St. Leo the Great put it well as he spoke of stewardship—whether it be the sharing of our time, talent, or treasure: "We who are unequal in what we can give can be equal in the love with which we give what we give."

Today's a day to be grateful for all those in our lives, maybe insignificant to many, who in little ways contributed to helping us be the people of faith we are. It's a day to give thanks for the diversity of gifts, generosity of hearts, and witness to true charity that we can see in this parish family!

Beautiful new copper crosses have been completed and gold leafed, and will soon be blest and raised to “crown” our restoration efforts on the roof of the facade and the top of the bell tower! They will be of a different style and a bit larger, more proportionate to the building and tower.



Within the coming days, Fr. Joseph Moynahan, a native son of our parish, recently ordained to the Priesthood this past June, will solemnly bless each before they are lifted in place by a crane. We will announce timing and details as soon as it's finalized.



## Way of the Cross Walkway


Last Fall, our parishioner Gregory Riddle inaugurated fund raising efforts in the hope of creating a meditation and prayer area on the grounds of our Parish Center and Offices on Woodbury Avenue, near the pond and within the tree-lined area, as an Eagle Scout project. We were thrilled he proposed this way of offering an “oasis” of prayer, and a way to preserve a bit of our Portsmouth Catholic history, by repurposing the Italian wood carved Stations of the Cross, that once hung in the former St. James Church. Your response was most enthusiastic!

Despite delays caused by shortages of supplies in these post-Covid days, Gregory kept moving forward. The individual receptacles for each Station, in the style of roadside shrines, were handmade, and the Stations installed within. The land was cleared and a path made. The posts were installed, and recently, the shrines were added to each. Some finishing work remains in the area and on each shrine, but by and large, it is complete!



We invite you to drop over, take a walk down by the pond, and see! Once Spring comes, this will be a wonderful area for personal prayer as well. We are so grateful to Gregory for his faith in action, his willingness to serve his parish in many ways over these years, and, now with this outstanding effort.
