The Pastor's Letter

Dear Family in the Lord,

As the Christmas Season continues, this Solemnity of Epiphany reminds us of our journey into another year following the individual path which we alone are to tread, the way He invites us to walk, the call He gives us. Life must certainly be seen as a pilgrimage, a long journey, but we need not necessarily travel alone, fumbling in darkness in search of our destination.

The familiar Epiphany story concerns the wider world and the many varying challenges and circumstances of joy and sorrow in which we encounter Christ. It calls us to look around and search for the Lord who is in our midst, in situations where previously we were unaware of His presence. He comes in people and places we least expect, and at times we are most unprepared for His company. God reveals Himself; He calls us to encounter and relationship. He invites us into His presence in the Word that lights the way, in the sacramental signs that make present what they signify. Nothing is ever the same for those who discover His light, walk the path it illuminates, enter into the encounter, and move forward changed, graced, made new.



The responsibility we all share is to let the light that has illuminated our way shine for others. As we enter this new year, let's renew our resolution to rise, move forward, cling less to what seems "safe" and "familiar," and be led to encounter Him as we never have before – in His Word, in His Sacraments, in our community, in our homes, and in His stirring within our souls.

As He was manifested as Lord and Savior of all, may we manifest that universal embrace He came to bring to all we meet along our journey.



House Blessing for Epiphany

This year, we continue the beautiful tradition of the blessing of chalk on this Epiphany day to be used in blessing the homes of our parish. **TODAY**, we invite you to take a piece from the table before the altar. Gather your family in your home at the most oftenused door. Using the chalk, inscribe the following on the top of the door, on the wall above, or on the trim, wherever it will stand out:

20 + CMB + 22

The initials represent the legendary names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The numbers ask the Lord's blessing on the year ahead, with the crosses asking for blessings on those "coming" and "going" through the portal. After inscription, someone reads the prayer of blessing below, and then all join in praying the Our Father.

Heavenly Father, bless this home, all who dwell here, and all who visit here. As the Magi found Christ on their arrival, may all our guests see Christ in us and in the life we share.

Be our protector as we leave this house and our comfort and joy as we return. We ask this through Christ our Lord, the Word made flesh, who lives forever and ever.


