

What Is the New Evangelization?

Dear Family in the Lord,

Popes Paul VI, John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Francis have used the term "new evangelization" to refer to the unique situation that the Catholic Church is in today. For the majority of the Church's history, its population resided mostly in European countries where the Church was thriving. In the last few centuries, however, the population of the Catholic Church has grown so much in the Americas, and more recently in Africa, that only 26% of Catholics are European.

But even in the United States, only 23% of Catholics attend Mass once a week or more. Many Catholics just feel too busy to attend Mass regularly and don't feel particularly connected to the Church. Many have begun to call themselves "spiritual," but not "religious." We know them. They are among our families and friends.

These are new problems in the history of the Church. For centuries, the Church's evangelical mission sought to preach the Gospel to the nations of non-Christians that did not know Christ. Now, the Church is called to a new evangelization, an evangelization within itself, a "re-evangelization."

Many people immediately assume that the "new" of new evangelization means we should use "new" media. New media such as blogs, Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, etc. are certainly essential to

evangelization today, but John Paul II called for a new evangelization over a decade before online social networking was even possible.

What John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI, and now Pope Francis, call for is an evangelization to those who have already been baptized. The call to the new evangelization is a call for the baptized members of the Church to deepen their faith and reach out to other Christians in deep need of a new encounter with Christ. In modern times, this means re-proposing the Gospel to people in countries and cultures heavily influenced by secularization.

The audience for the new evangelization include those who have already heard Christ proclaimed. Those whose lives have become so "busy" that they spend little to no time forming their children in faith or underscoring the importance of the Eucharist, confession, and living our values despite the culture around us. Those who have fallen away, or felt turned away or scandalized, and those who were poorly taught the faith, are among those who need to hear the Gospel anew!



It's also directed to those who have a surface concept of faith, but could be deeply enriched and enrich others if invited to go deeper! No one of us can ever consider ourselves excluded from the call to ever deeper conversion to Christ.

We will be setting out in this effort in renewed ways in our parish as we move forward. A Pastoral Leadership Team for Evangelization will be formed, made up of those who have already taken up the call to evangelize in varied ways in the past few years and who can now help us broaden the scope and invite others to intensify their efforts. Elsewhere in this week's bulletin we have an initial introduction of three people who will be joining our staff to work with me and the Team for this initiative and help carry it to all aspects of parish life. Take a look! More will be coming and you'll have the chance to get to know them better.

Please pray daily and fervently for this effort and be on the watch for more as we unfold all that this implies. As I mentioned last week in my letter, this call has been best summed up by Pope St. John Paul II in three objectives that we take up: (1) To proclaim the Gospel to all, (2) To help bring about reconversion of those who've received the Gospel but live it out only nominally, and (3) To deepen the Gospel in the lives of all believers. And so, let the restoration move forward!



This has become a very popular annual Lenten event in our parish since it was introduced in 2011.



Plan to join us at **6:00 PM TONIGHT**, and again on March 27 and April 3 for this reflective half hour that concludes with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Blessed Sacrament is exposed at 5:30 PM for those who may wish some quiet time before, and remains exposed after until 7:00 PM for those who wish to linger after.

Confessions are also heard before and after. Plan ahead to be with us for this devotion on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent.

In addition, there is the reality of the attacks of the Evil One—who is VERY real and active—when he sees us drawing closer to God. Meet Lisa Bald — Office of Families of Faith

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is with a joyful and grateful heart that I accepted the position as the director of the office of families of faith. God cannot be outdone in generosity! Fifteen years ago, our family became parishioners of Corpus Christi Parish. Many of you have watched our three sons grow into strong men of faith, who are devoted to serving the Lord. Now that I am an empty nester, I am able to serve, nurture, and joyfully watch as the young families of our parish grow in faith and encounter Jesus. The goal of this letter is to introduce myself and my background. Here goes!

I am a cradle Catholic who grew up in Sanford, Maine and attended the Catholic grammar school, St. Thomas. I graduated from the University of Southern Maine with a major in Elementary Education



and a minor in Music. I met my wonderful husband through my mother. She was his secretary, and he was a recent college graduate. According to my mother, she said several novenas asking the Lord to help us find each other. Two years later, Ray and I were married at Holy Family Parish, and soon started our family. My first teaching position was at St. Thomas School, which provided me a unique opportunity to work alongside the teachers I had when I attended the school. I left there with my mission firmly planted, "In partnership with the family." I have carried this mission with me throughout my life and now to Corpus Christi Parish. While earning my masters in reading and literacy, I taught second grade and kindergarten in the York Public School system. After having our third child, I began working from home as a professor at the University of New England and then with Walden University, where I earned my doctorate in Education with a focus in curriculum, instruction, and assessment. During my time at home, I began attending a mother's catechesis program to learn more about my faith. I grew tired of answering our oldest son's faith questions with "I'm not sure." Before we knew it, we were Catholic homeschooling through Seton Home Study School. Five years ago, I was approached to help form the Women's Ministry here at CCP. I was able to use my skill sets and gifts from the Holy Spirit to nurture the faith of women. It was a joy watching fellow parishioners encounter Christ through the bible study program Walking with Purpose. I also began volunteering at the Yeshua Catholic International Leadership Institute, under the director Dr. Owen Phelps. I help create programming and produce online webinars. This Lent I authored and will be the guest speaker of "Ordinary People: Everyday Saints" where we explore modern-day lay saints. Through these experiences, I have grown in servant leadership and recognize that as Catholics we need to foster the gifts of the Holy Spirit to grow the Church. We are all called to holiness and to become servant leaders like Christ.

After seventeen years of living out my vocation as a homeschooling parent, I took a desert year to be still, to be in solitude, and to be silent with the Lord. I have spent this first year of empty nesting with the Lord surrendering to what His call for me would be as I transitioned out from full-time mother and educator. In this last year, we have moved, celebrated Zach and Heidi's marriage, sent Nathaniel off to Madagascar—praying for his vocation, and sent Ethan off to Ave Maria University. In April, Ray and I will be celebrating our 30th wedding anniversary. While it has been busy for the Balds, the Lord's whisper was clear and directive in this new phase of my life; home to Corpus Christi Parish to pour love into the hearts of our families of faith. As we enter into this season of Evangelization, I reflect on St. Paul's letter to the Hebrews that we are grounded in hope, for Jesus Christ is the anchor of our faith. Know that you are all in my daily prayers and I ask the same of you. May Christ reign in our hearts, be glorified through our works, and be shared with those we meet.

My name is
Dominic Paradis and I
am 27 years old. I grew
up in Rochester, New
Hampshire in a devout
Catholic home. I am the


Easter Food Baskets




Pilgrimage to Italy Don't Delay!
