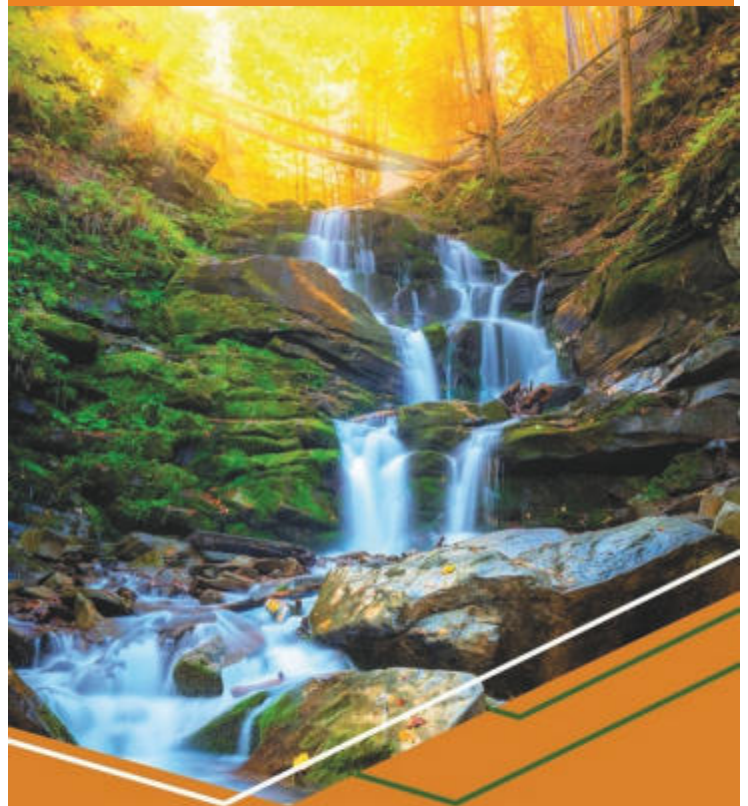

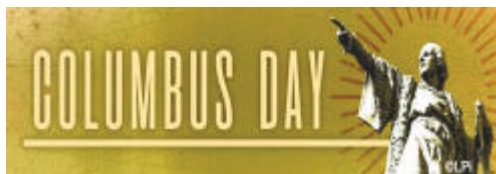

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we truly have something to celebrate as this is the 70th Anniversary of the Founding of St. James Parish. I am left with several feelings going into this weekend. Feelings like wonder, delight, and hope. In all, I think that I share similar sentiments of many of you. Seventy years is a long time and ours is a rich history of the many sacrifices gladly made for the good of our parish not only by our founders but by many parishioners over the years, including now.

I have been looking forward to this weekend for a variety of reasons. First, having the opportunity to be with each other during the Masses throughout the weekend along with sharing stories after each Mass and at our luncheon about the special place that our parish has in our lives.



It is such an honor to have some of our former priests and deacons with us. We are grateful for the presence of Bishop Richard Henning, the celebrant at our concelebrated 70th Anniversary Mass. We welcome Fr. Dan (Msgr. Picciano), Fr. Hewes, who were two of our previous pastors along with Fr. John Ryan, a former associate, and Fr. John McCarthy, who was a parishioner of St. James Parish before being ordained to the Priesthood. We welcome Dcn. John Lynch and Dcn. Frank McGuinness, our former business manager.

I am also delighted that the statue of St. James, our patron saint, has arrived and will be blessed at the conclusion of the Noon Mass. This statue, which is my gift to our parish, is a simple gesture of my appreciation and gratitude for the opportunity to serve here as your pastor.

Three ideas went into this statue, which I helped to design. First, St. James is holding a Book of the Gospel whose herald he was. The sword represents the martyrdom he endured at the hands of King Herod Agrippa I. St. James is the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament (**Acts 12:2**). Finally, the tilt of St. James' head looking to the heavens represents his constant contemplation of his relationship with Jesus in prayer. St. Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower's definition of prayer, comes to mind, *"For me, prayer is a surge of the heart, it is a simple look turned towards heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."*

What does the future hold for St. James Parish? Hopefully, we will continue to be a community of faith and friendship where we will celebrate the presence of the Risen Lord in our midst while reaching out in loving service to those who come to us in special need. I pray that we will continue to support marriage and family life and the forming of our parish children into present day disciples of Jesus, whom we serve. It is also my hope that we will all grow in an appreciation that we too, like St. James, are present day disciples of Jesus who are committed to making him known and loved.

What does St. James Parish mean to you? What special memories do you hold? What are the stories that you have shared with your relatives and friends about our wonderful parish? Let us share our stories for it is a time to remember and celebrate and dream for the future.

Do you feel alone? Are you frustrated or angry with each other? Do you argue or have you just stopped talking to each other?

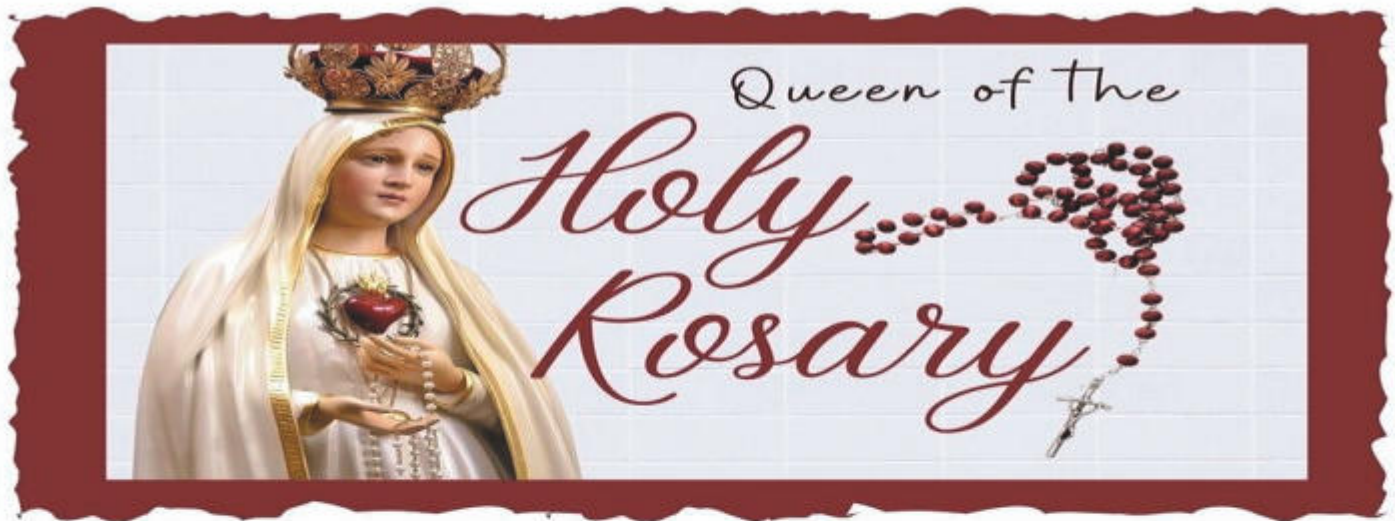

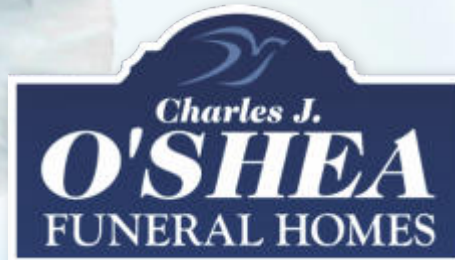
