A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Amos

(Am 7:12-15)

Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos, "Off with you, visionary, flee to the land of Judah! There earn your bread by prophesying, but never again prophesy in Bethel; for it is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple." Amos answered Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor have I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. The LORD took me from following the flock, and said to me, Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

A Reading from the Second Letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians (Eph 1:3-14)

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - July 11, 2021 – Mark 6:7-13

Today's readings remind us of our call to preach the Good News of Jesus by bearing witness to God's love, mercy and salvation as revealed through Jesus. In today's Gospel, the evangelist tells the story of Jesus' commissioning of the twelve apostles for their first missionary journey. They are to preach the "Good News" of repentance, forgiveness of sins, liberation and salvation through Jesus. Just as God sent the prophet Amos to preach repentance to ancient Israel and St. Paul to preach the Good News of salvation to the Gentiles, so Jesus sends forth us believers to proclaim the Good News of God's Kingdom and to bring healing to those who need it most. By Jesus' instructions, it is clear that his disciples should take no supplies for the road but simply trust in God for their requirements. They should be walking examples of God's love and providence. By making their mission trip this way, they would also have the maximum of freedom and the minimum of burdens in their preaching and healing ministry. Jesus wanted his apostles to be rich in all the things which really mattered, so that they might enrich those who came into contact with them.

Jesus' disciples were to preach the Good News that God is not a punishing judge, but rather a loving Father. The disciples were to preach the message of repentance. To "repent" means to change one's mind and then fit one's actions to this change. Repentance literally means change your mind. It can also mean taking a new direction. Thus, repentance means a change of heart and a change of action - a change from a self-centered life to a God-centered life. Each Christian is called not only to be a disciple but also to be an apostle. As disciples, we are to follow and imitate Jesus. As apostles, we are to evangelize the world. We are called to share with others not just words, or ideas, or doctrines but an experience, - our experience of God and His Son, Jesus. Like the apostles, like St. Francis of Assisi, like Mother Teresa, we are all chosen and sent to proclaim the Gospel through our living. It is through our transparent Christian lives that we must show the love, mercy and concern of Jesus for the people around us.

We have a mission to live as children of God. Realization of our dignity as children of God should change our outlook on life. We are to be children filled with love, rather than selfishness and disobedience. We are to respect our brothers and sisters. As God's children, we should live lives of absolute trust in the goodness of our Heavenly Father, who knows what is best for us. The realization that we are the children of God should bring us great comfort, peace and joy - even in our worst moments. Sometimes we forget that as we go through life we are just tourists visiting this planet. We are on a long trip but we are not staying here forever. As St. Paul tells us our destination is heaven, our real home. We are not going to take anything with us except our good deeds. Life is a journey that each one embraces in a different manner. This is not the attitude of the world where people like to fill their lives with materialistic things. Thus, they keep chasing one thing after the other, thinking that it will make them happy. However, the real happiness lies in a simple way of living. A simple life doesn't mean you have to deprive yourself of all the basic things in life. It simply means that you have to focus on living a life that is not dependent on materialistic things, greed, selfishness etc.

Your happiness is not something that is dependent on the things outside you, it actually comes from within. A simple life takes you away from chasing things in life and you end up living in a happier state of mind. A simple life means focusing on the real happiness instead of just looking for it everywhere. Someone who lives a simple life takes time to develop meaningful relationships, instead of making bonds for selfish reasons. The simple life means you can actually take the time to invest in the things that mean something to you. That means you have time and energy to get involved in your own happiness. Negative feelings like jealousy, selfishness, greed etc. come from the rat race to gain more and more in life. However, when you are living the life in a simple manner you are more relaxed and at ease with yourself. Once you are out of the rat race, you will see that simple life means a more creative life. You have less work pressure and you have the ways to let your creativity flow.

Talking about simple life, what came to my mind was a poem entitled TRUE JOY by Jolynn Rawson:

I'll be happy once I've done this certain thing.
We all say this often, not realizing what it brings.
We look only to the future for our happiness,
Letting life slip through our fingers in its fullness.
Will we really feel complete when the task is done
Or look back and see how we missed so much fun?
Self consumed so we can't see anything else,
Hurting those we love as well as ourselves.
So many things around us to be grateful for.
When seeking for an answer, willingly open the door.
So often, others see what's in front of our face,
but we're too blind to look as we're snared in the race.
What is this life supposed to be about?
Is it money, fortune, fame, or a big house?
When speaking to a man on his dying bed,
none of these answers are what he said.
Family, love, laughter are what we should seek.
These are the precious things that keep life from being bleak.

Simple life flows from our trust in divine providence. It is founded on our faith in God. Thus, by the time we come to the end of our earthly sojourn, if we can say with St. Paul, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day - and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing" (2 Tim. 4:7-8).


