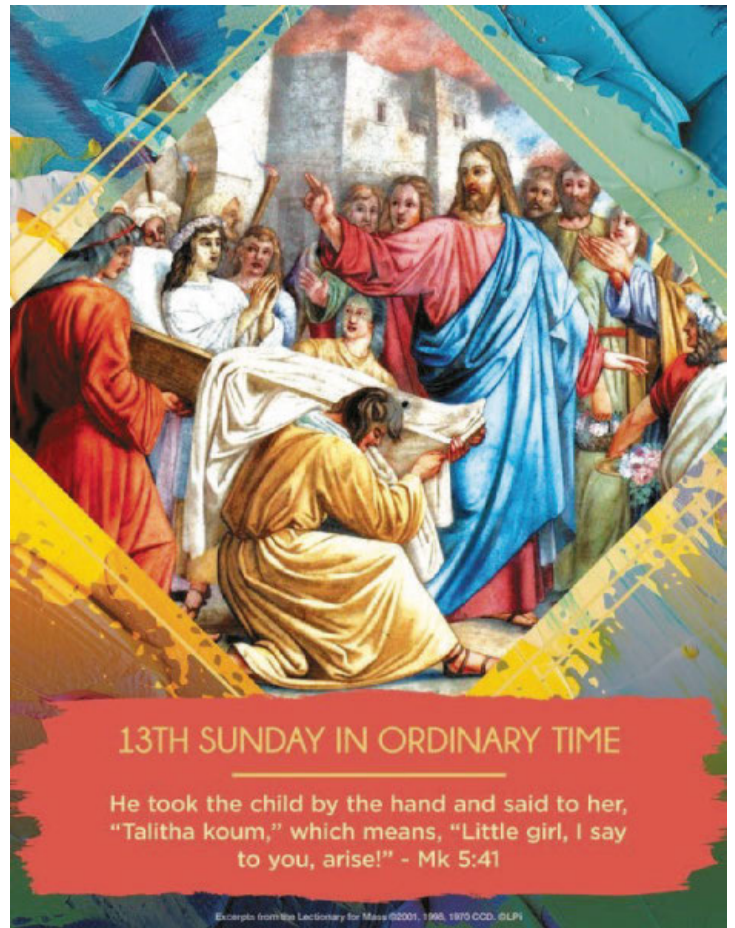

Religious Education



- **Overview:** Religious Education for children and youth is required for grades 1 through 8, and for the Sacrament of Confirmation. **Children must participate in religious education, from grades 1 through the sacrament of Confirmation, within the context of Catholic school education or parish-based programs, in order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.** Those who do not adhere to this guideline must necessarily receive other programs and methods of preparation, in the parish in advance of the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation. Reception of the sacrament may, therefore, be delayed significantly.
- **Code of Canon Law: Title III: Catholic Education Can.798** "Parents are to entrust their children to those schools which provide a Catholic education. If they are unable to do this, **they are obliged to take care that suitable Catholic education is provided for their children outside the schools.**" other forms of instruction in the faith. Notice to CCD Program Parents and Families

Beginning with the 2024-2025 Catechetical Year (this Fall), all CCD families will be given a "**Mass Attendance Sheet**" for all children participating in Religious Education and/or sacramental preparation.

To fulfill the Third Commandment ("Keep Holy the Sabbath Day") and to encourage all children and families to worship God on all Sundays and Holy Days and therefore to be fully practicing Catholics, the sheets will be collected by Fr. John every three months or so and new forms distributed.

The worship of God as a family, in the Mass, is the best and most fundamental form of Christian formation. The Religious Education program is meant to assist families in this pursuit of faith. The main cell of faith is the home.

The priest will initial or sign each form after each Mass.

The Archdiocese of Newark takes all complaints of sexual misconduct by members of the clergy, Religious, and lay staff of the Archdiocese very seriously.

We encourage anyone with any knowledge of an act of sexual misconduct to inform the Archdiocese immediately so that we can take the appropriate action and provide support to the victim.

Although the Archdiocese immediately reports all abuse allegations to the appropriate County Prosecutor, it also encourages victims to independently report such matters to the Prosecutor.

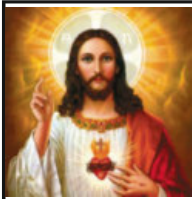

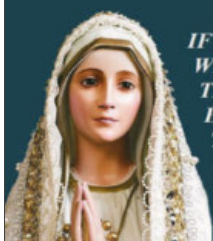
Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

1. Receiving Communion frequently.
2. First Fridays: going to Confession and receiving the Eucharist on the first Friday of each month for nine consecutive months.

Many parishes will offer public First Friday devotions; if they do, you must perform First Fridays publicly.

If it isn't so offered in your parish, you can do this privately, going to Confessions, receiving the Eucharist, and offering your prayers for the intention of the Holy Father.

3. Holy Hour: Eucharistic Adoration for one hour on Thursdays. ("Could you not watch one hour with me?") Holy Hour can be made alone or as part of a group with formal prayers.
4. Celebrating of the Feast of the Sacred Heart.

First Saturday Devotions

One of the most important aspects of the Fatima message was Our Lady's request for the First Saturday devotion.

In the July 13, 1917 apparition at Fatima. Our Lady said to the children, "You have seen hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart...I shall come to ask for the Communion of Reparation on the first Saturdays."

She came expressly with the request for this devotion when she appeared to Sister Lucia on December 10, 1925, in Pontevedra, Spain, where she was preparing for religious life.

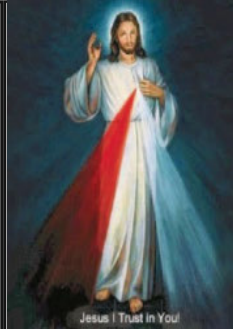
Once you have completed five consecutive First Saturdays, continue to practice the devotion monthly for the sake of obtaining graces for the salvation of other souls.

In Reparation for The Five Blasphemies

- Against the Immaculate Conception
- Against her Perpetual Virginity
- Against her Divine Maternity, while refusing to receive her as the Mother of Mankind
- For those who try to implant in the hearts of children indifference, disrespect and hate against the Immaculate Mother
- By those who insult her directly in her Sacred Images

First Saturday Requirements

- Go to Confession (May be 8 days before or after First Saturday)
- Receive Holy Communion
- Pray 5 decades of the Rosary
- Keep Our Lady Company
- Keep Mary company for 15 minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the rosary.



Devotion to the Divine Mercy The Five Elements

1. The **Image of the Divine Mercy**: Venerate the Image
2. The **Feast of the Divine Mercy**: **Divine Mercy Sunday**: On the second Sunday of Easter: make a good confession beforehand, receive the Eucharist in a state of grace. The plenary indulgence for oneself or for a soul in purgatory is available under the usual conditions: sacramental confession within several days. Eucharistic communion and prayers for the Pope (One Our Father and one Hail Mary will do). Additionally, one should be detached from any sin, including venial sin, and either take part in prayers and devotions to the Divine Mercy or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (reserved or exposed) recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus.
3. **Daily 3:00 PM meditation**, even briefly, on the Lord's Passion (Diary 1320, 1572)
4. **Chaplet of the Divine Mercy**; may be recited anytime.
5. **The Divine Mercy Novena**: While the chaplet may be said anytime, the Lord specifically asked that it be recited as a novena. (Diary, 1209)

THE HOLY FACE DEVOTION

A Heaven-revealed Remedy to the Ills of our Times

"This salutary reparation to the Holy Face of Jesus is a divine work, destined to save modern society." (Pius IX)



History of the Devotion

Devotion to the Holy Face was revealed by Jesus to Sr. Marie of St. Peter (1816-1848), a Carmelite nun of Tours in France.

The primary purpose of the devotion is to make reparation for the sins against the first three commandments: Denial of God (Atheism/communism); Blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days.

Holy Face Image Derived from Veronica's Veil

The devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus, based on the life and writings of St. Marie of St. Peter, was eventually approved by Pope Leo XIII in 1885, who established the devotion as an Archconfraternity for the whole world.

In January 1849, Pope Pius IX had the relic of Veronica's veil placed for public veneration in Rome. On the third day of the exposition the image on the veil, formerly so faint as to be barely visible, became transformed.

The Divine Face appeared distinctly, as if living, and was illuminated by a soft light. Reproductions of the veil such as the one above were later printed, touched to the original and sent abroad for veneration.
