FROM FATHER JACK, PASTOR

My father used to have a saying: Don't lead with your chin. Well last week I wrote about a topic that combined both politics and religion. That by definition, is leading with my chin. I did get some response and I am happy I did. I always appreciate hearing from people and being challenged by them. That allows me to examine my own beliefs and try to explain them more clearly to others. I figured since I led with my chin once, why not do so again? Last week I wrote about who should and who should not receive communion; this week I thought I would write a little bit about being privileged.

In today's overly politicized atmosphere the word privileged is often used in the discussion of what is referred to as institutional or systemic racism. I am not foolish enough to tackle that topic, my chin isn't that big. I do want to write a little about the great privilege I have been blessed with. My privilege is that I was raised in a wonderful family with a mother and a father. It was within that family I witnessed the selfless love my mother had for my father and my father had for my mother; and the love they both had for my siblings and me. It was in my family I was taught that it wasn't all about me and I learned I had obligations to something much larger than me, my family. It was in my family I was taught the two great commandments. I was taught to love my God and to love others.

Many of you know I was raised in Quincy. I grew up in the Germantown section of the city of Presidents. If you know Quincy then you know Germantown is the poorest section of the city. Germantown is where most of the City's public housing is located. I didn't grow up in the projects, but many of my friends did. Like most projects, Germantown had a disproportionate number of single parent families. Many of my friends were raised by their mothers. My house, with its large backyard, was the gathering place for all of us. Over the years, my friends developed a unique relationship with my parents. In many ways, my Dad became a strong male figure in the lives of my friends. For some, he was the closest thing they had to a father figure. As we got older, it wasn't uncommon for some of my childhood friends to stop by our house to visit my parents. One of my friends still, on his own, will visit my Dad's grave on Memorial Day.

This weekend we celebrate Fathers Day. This is an opportunity to thank those men who took the time to teach us some of life's important lessons. Maybe for you, like me, that man was your biological father. Maybe it was a man who came into your life at the right time and shared himself with you. My Dad did that for a number of young men. Let us pray for those good men today, and let us thank God for putting them into our lives. Also, on this Fathers Day, I ask all men to look around and see if they can be a strong male figure in the lives of any young men who seem to be in need of it. I know I am proud of my Dad for the man he was. I hope in some small way I can imitate him.
