

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



In addition to celebrating the 2nd Sunday of Advent, today is the feast of St. Nicholas.

An old St. Nicholas Day tradition in Germany and Poland had children dress up like bishops and go out begging for alms for the poor. What a marvelous practice!

First, it teaches children that Christianity makes us all responsible for one another and that begging for alms serves the double purpose of promoting the generosity of the wealthy and helping to meet the needs of the poor. Secondly, it plants a terrific image in children's imaginations, depicting religious leaders as people who put the prestige of their office at the service of the poor.

This tradition ties in well with

the message of this 2nd Sunday of Advent. The 1st reading from the Old Testament prophet Isaiah is an invitation to hope for a future so new that we may not recognize its dawning. The valleys and mountains that mark boundaries between peoples can be filled in and made low.

Isaiah had offered this encouragement to a people very much confused. As exiles, they had lost the security being in their own land as God's chosen people. Yet still, many of them were better off materially than those who still lived in the Promised Land. The relative comfort of exile, compared to the poverty of Israel, tempted many to cling to Babylon's pagan idols rather than risk seeking what God offered them. So, Isaiah called his people to set out on a journey of hope, and to risk everything for the

unseen future God offered to create with them.

In our Gospel we find John the Baptist urging people to travel a different road, because their situation was urgent, and hope was worth the risk of change. His baptism signaled a willingness to leave old ways behind so as to be ready for the Savior's arrival.

As we begin this 2nd week of Advent, let us ask the intercession of St. Nicholas to transform us into people of hope, willing to risk leaving behind all that keeps us from welcoming the Messiah, and keeping our eyes and hearts focused on the coming of his Kingdom of true and lasting peace.

Dear friends,

The Advent season always moves along quickly, and, as you know, there

seems to be less and less time in which to do everything. Yet the Advent season urges us to try and slow down and appreciate the meaning of Jesus' birth.

The holy day season can be a time of great joy but also of great stress for families especially if there is some alienation due to broken relationships or marriages. Also, many have a broken relationship with God or the Church for a variety of reasons. Yet, I am convinced that most people want to feel good about their church and their faith. To be distant is not their first choice.

So, what to do? How to overcome alienation? I share with you a true story of how one woman found an answer. May this account help you or a loved one especially during this Christmas season.

Thirty-seven years ago, when I gave birth to my mentally and physically handicapped child, Doug, I was devastated, full of fear, and hopeless. I kept asking, "Why my child?" I felt God was punishing me as well as my baby.

The first three years of Doug's life were hell. People tried to tell me of a loving and merciful God, but I didn't see or feel his presence. One day, a couple invited my husband and me to their house for a party. They said they wanted to talk to me about God. They promised, "20 minutes, max," and that if I

wasn't interested they would change the subject. That evening they asked a question that broke down my barriers: "Do you believe Jesus died for you?"

"He doesn't even know I am alive," I answered, shocking myself. Years of anger and resentment began to spill out, and I couldn't contain my tears.

The other couples had closed their eyes and were praying. The power of the Holy Spirit filled the room and I felt the touch of Jesus for the first time in my life. I was beginning to feel whole again.

That night I couldn't sleep. Doubts and then fear had begun to infiltrate my spirit again. Then I heard a voice: "Come to Me."

Skeptical, I got dressed and whispered to my husband that I was going to Mass. He told me later that he had been praying every day for that moment. At church, I approached the priest to hear my confession and then received the Lord for the first time in many years.

I have faced many challenges over the years—from placing Doug in a group home to fighting cancer. It is not easy dealing with crisis, but it is easier now that I know I have a personal relationship with Jesus. On days when fear and doubt try to enter my spirit, I remember the Lord's gentile whisper, "Come to Me."

"Lord, I need your eyes; give me a living faith. I need your heart, a love to withstand any test. I need the breath of God; give your hope to me and to all your Church that the

Church today bear witness to the world, that the world may know by their look of joy and serenity, a warm and generous heart, and the unending optimism that arises from that secret everlasting spring of joyful hope." (Cardinal Suenens)

CHARITY VS. JUSTICE

Scripture explains the Church's social mission and teaches the need to work for and seek justice in our lives and world. Catholic social teaching is founded on the life and words of Jesus Christ and the Hebrew prophets through Scripture. There are many Scriptural references to the importance of social ministry and justice. It was the Hebrew prophets who proclaimed God's love for the poor and called upon all of God's people to strive for love and justice in the world. In the Old Testament, God made a covenant at Sinai with the people of Israel promising to take care of them and love them. In return, the Israelites promised to love and worship God, be faithful to Him, and take care of the poor, widows, strangers, and orphans. This covenant explains and demonstrates charity and the need to work for justice in the world to reach God's Kingdom, the ultimate reward of eternal life. The book of Exodus is an epic tale about the struggle for freedom and how

injustices are overcome. Today, like the Israelites in the book of Exodus, many people are enslaved, by injustices such as homelessness, hunger, human trafficking and low paying jobs with no chance of advancement. The book of Exodus reminds every human being that life and the world are not always as one would want them to be. The characters in Exodus who fought against oppression are an inspiration to all.

The biblical reference to charity or social service is the story of the Good Samaritan. The Samaritan provides immediate and temporary relief to a man attacked by robbers, who is a victim of highway banditry. The Exodus story is the biblical reference for justice or social change. Moses' message is "Let my people go," and he challenges the institution that oppresses his Chosen People, by working for freedom and justice for the Jewish Slave-Labor force.
