# WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



Since our homily time this weekend was used for the Archbishop's Annual Appeal video, I am

giving you the following mini-homily for your spiritual edification.

Today's Gospel has been called the Purification of the Temple. That term might sound like an oxymoron. After all, shouldn't the temple be the place of purification, not a place needing to be cleansed? Unfortunately, that attitude is at best naive and at worst it reflects the culture called clericalism, in which those of the church either thought themselves as better than others, or, others thought that of them.

Similar dangers lurk for all of us. We are all susceptible to the prejudicial "isms" that divide our society by rank, race, class, education, gender, age, etc. While the "isms" cause significant suffering for their victims, they also dehumanize their practitioners. This carries over into our church as well,

with the idea that our priests, deacons and religious are expected to meet the high demands of the Gospel, while ordinary people can be excused for capitulating to the demands of a dog-eat-dog, consumerist world.

This is precisely what angered Jesus that day in the Temple. Picturing that scene, we tend to concentrate on the whip, the animals and the frightened, fleeing money changers. But Jesus delivered his real message when he said, "Destroy this temple and I will raise it up again in three days."

The heart of the scandal Jesus caused that day was not in driving away the money changers but his proclamation that he, a human being, was the new temple. This implied that an encounter with genuine humanity offers an experience of the real presence of God. It has always been easier to imagine God safely confined in a church and speaking only through authority than to believe that God's life courses through creation and speaks in the voice of our needy neighbors.

We join ranks with those who rejected Jesus' message to the extent that we allow a focus on Christ's presence in our temples and tabernacles to dwarf our awareness of his real and much more disturbing presence outside the church walls.

Do we reverence each person as much as we do our holy places? Do we allow our critiques of church leadership to let us off the hook for living the teachings of the Gospel? Do we care more for the decor of our spaces and the style of our liturgy than for God's dwelling place in and among the poor?

May our continued journey through this holy season of Lent strengthen us to go forth and seek ways of continuing the work of Jesus in all we say and do this week, knowing that it will be in so doing that we can assist in the building of THE Temple, the Father's Kingdom of true and lasting peace.

closer to the Easter season. With a few more weeks of Lent left, it is still not too late to use this spiritual season wisely. From the 'Word Among Us,' one of the Lent issues, here are a few more suggestions from columnist, Dan Almeter.

**Set the Alarm;** I attended a retreat where the speaker made the point that Jesus got up "long before dawn" (Mark 1; 35)

to spent time with His Father. "Notice" he said, "the Bible doesn't say that Jesus rolled over!"

That Lent, I resolved to fast from pushing the snooze button. Detaching from my usual pattern of over-sleeping, I got up earlier every day to pray. My wife soon joined me, and this became a lifelong habit. Some of our children say that our example is one of the reasons why they themselves have a daily personal prayer time.

**Give it away;** One good Lenten form of fasting is to rid

ourselves of possessions—not just the junk that every household accumulates, but some of the material things to which we are attached.

I love my books. Last year during Lent, I boxed up a large number of them and gave them away. Marie cleared out her wardrobe and donated to charity what seemed like half her closet. My twenty-year-old daughter put some of her toys in a yard sale and gave the money to a friend in need.

Timor-Leste, or East Timor is a  
small Asian country in Southeast  
Asian that occupies half the island  
of Timor. This nation on the other  
side of the world near Australia, is  
slightly larger than the state of  
Connecticut and is one of the  
world's newest countries, only 18  
years old.  
Many families in Timor-Leste live  
in rural areas and work as farmers,  
but challenges like changing  
weather patterns make it difficult  
to grow enough food. Rice is the  
main part of their diets, and as a  
result, hunger and malnutrition  
are huge problems. This especially  
affects children and their ability  
to develop to their full potential  
emotionally and physically.  
This week, we meet Eliza and her  
husband Paulino, who have six  
children. After participating in her  
community's nutrition group

sponsored by CRS, she and  
Paulino learned how to start a  
home garden and grow different  
crops based on the rainy and dry  
seasons. They also started raising  
chickens, which provide  
additional protein to their meals  
and income from selling the eggs.  
Eliza wishes to share a meatless,  
nutritional recipe, Batar Da'An  
Recipe or Squash, Bean and Corn
