

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



We are in the midst of the holy season of Lent. This is the time we reflect on all Jesus suffered,

all Jesus went through, for you and me. Every time we come into church we see the almost life-sized Cross in our sanctuary. We see the banners with the Crown of Thorns, and the Nails that held Jesus to the Cross. And every time we look at those we cannot help but think of what Jesus endured for each and every one of us.

But why did Jesus have to go through all of that? Some will say to forgive us of our sins. Some will say to open the gates of heaven for us again. Some will say to make us one with God again.

But none of those is the right answer.

If those were correct, then our God is a God of reward and punishment; a God who rewards those who are good and punishes those who are bad.

If those were correct, then our God is a God who has closed the gates of heaven because we do not deserve to be there.

If those were correct, then our God has cut off our relationship because we did not keep our end of the Covenant.

And none of those could be further from the truth.

Our God is a God of love -

unconditional, never-ending love! And so the right answer is so that we can see and know beyond a doubt, just how much God loves us, and just how much He wants us to be with Him in heaven forever.

When we see the Cross, when we see the Crown of Thorns, when we see the nails that held Jesus to the Cross, we cannot help but to think, 'Wow! That's how much God loves me!' And when we think that, we cannot help but also think, 'I now need to love Him just as much in return!'

That's why Jesus told so many stories and parables like the Lost Sheep, and like the Prodigal Son.

That one sheep went wandering off and got lost. And what was the shepherd's reaction? Did he say, 'Oh, too bad. That one didn't pay attention and is now lost. I have 99 others. No worries!'

Or did he go out and search for that lost one, and when he found it, he punished it for wandering off and causing so much trouble? No, he went out, found the one that was lost, and brought it back, and then threw a huge party, all because he had the Lost One back safe and sound. That was how much he loved his sheep.

When the Prodigal Son took his inheritance and left home, what was the father's reaction? He went out and looked every day hoping to see his son returning. And when, one day, he saw him coming back,

what was his reaction? Did he make him pay back his inheritance? Did he tell him to do penance, or give him a probation period, and earn his way back into the family?

No! Like the shepherd, the father, too had a huge party to celebrate, with open arms, the return of his lost Son!

In the same way, God wants desperately for each and every one of us to be with Him forever. And so, whenever any of us stray from Him, whenever any of us sin, He waits for us to come back. And when we do, He welcomes us back with open arms. He wants us to know that there is nothing we can ever do that will keep Him from loving us forever. There is nothing we can ever do that will prevent us from being in heaven. Nothing!

But, and this is important, but, He will never force us to return to Him. He invites us; He calls to us; He longs for us to return. But we have to want to return to Him. And that is why it is important to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation every few months, to make the conscious decision to turn back to God again.

If you haven't been to Confession in a while, Lent is a perfect opportunity to return. God wants to forgive us. God wants us to be with Him forever. But we need to turn to Him for the grace for that to happen.

Dear friends,

Lent continues into the forth week and we move closer to the Easter season.

Here is a little Lenten thought; "Take the Son."

A wealthy man and his son loved to collect rare works of arts. They had everything in their collection, from Picasso to Raphael. They would often sit together and admire the great works of art. When the Vietnam conflict broke out, the son went to war. He was

very courageous and died in the battle while rescuing another soldier. The father was notified and grieved deeply for his only son.

About a month later, just before Christmas, there was a knock at the door. A young man stood at the door with a large package in his hands. He said, "Sir, you don't know me, but I am the soldier for whom your son gave his life. He saved many lives that day, and he was carrying me to safety when a bullet struck him in the heart, and he died instantly. He often talked about you, and your love for art."

The young man held out this package. "I know this isn't much. I am not really a great artist, but I think your son would have wanted you to have this." The father opened the package. It was a portrait of his son, painted by the young man. He started in awe at the way the soldier had captured the personality of his son in the painting. The father was so drawn to the eyes that his own eyes welled up with tears.

He thanked the young man and offered to pay him for the picture. "Oh, no sir, I could never repay what your son did for me. It is a gift." The father hung the portrait over his mantle. Every time visitors came to his home, he took them to see the portrait of his son before he showed them any of the other great works he had collected.

The man died a few months later. There was to be a great auction of his paintings. Many influential people gathered, excited over seeing the great paintings and having an opportunity to purchase one for their collection.

On the platform sat the painting of the son. The auctioneer pounded his gavel. "We will start the bidding with this picture of the son... Who will bid for this painting? Who will start the bidding? \$100, \$200?"

Another voice shouted angrily, "We didn't come to see this painting. We came to see the Van Gogh's, the Rembrandt's. Get on with the real bids!" But still the auctioneer continued. "Who will take the son!" Finally, a voice came from the very back of the room. It was the longtime gardener of the man and his son. "I will give \$10 for the painting." Being a poor man, it was all he could afford. "We have \$10. \$10 is the bid, won't someone bid \$20?" The crowd was becoming angry. They didn't want the picture of the son. They wanted the more worthy investments for their collections.

The auctioneer pounded the gavel. "Going once, twice, sold for

\$10!" A man sitting in the second row shouted, "Now let's get on with the collection!" The auctioneer laid down his gavel.

"I am sorry, the auction is over." "What about the paintings?" "I am sorry. When I was called to conduct this auction, I was told of a secret stipulation in the will. I was not allowed to reveal that stipulation until this time. Only the painting of the son would be auctioned. Whoever bought that painting would inherit the entire estate, including the paintings. The man who took the son gets everything!"

God gave His Son 2000 years ago to die on a cruel cross. Much like the auctioneer, His message today is; "The Son! Who will take the Son?" Because, you see, whoever takes the Son gets everything.

Have a great week and here is a thought:

Recently at Mass, the gruff priest's homily was just four minutes long, a fraction of his usual ramblings. Why? "I regret to inform the congregation," he explained from the pulpit, "that my dog, who is very fond of eating paper, ate that portion of my sermon which I was unable to deliver this morning."

Following Mass, a visitor from another parish shook hands with the priest and said, "Father, if that dog of yours has any pups, I want to get one for my priest."

This week, we revisit Madagascar to meet Aimée.

Although Madagascar is one of the poorest countries in the world, the joy of its people is contagious, and their hospitality is overwhelming. The small communities that make up the country are tightly-knit, and they support each other through difficulties like climate change, chronic hunger and malnutrition. Seasonal drought is becoming more severe and lasts longer each year, which makes it difficult for families to harvest enough food to survive. One in every 2 children in Madagascar is undernourished. Through a CRS program, Aimée recently learned new ways to plant her vegetables, which has led to bigger harvests and more food and income for her family. She is also learning how to cook more nutritious meals for her children, who are healthier and happier as a result.

This week, we are asked to reflect that feeding the hungry can take many different forms. What is one way you can practice this work of mercy? Have you ever been hungry? If so, what did that feel like?
