

# WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



On Monday of this past week, the church honored St. Damien

deVeuster, also known as St. Damien of Molokai, known for his ministry to the lepers. Because of how quickly leprosy spread, and how deadly it was, those suffering from the disease were kept as far as possible from others, as on the Hawaiian island of Molokai, on a remote, inaccessible peninsula. It was there that the Belgian missionary Damien came, fulfilling a lifelong dream of mission work. Ordained in Honolulu in 1864, he came to the leper colony nine years later. At first part of a rotating team of chaplains, he later settled into a permanent ministry there. The story of the end of Damien's life is well known. In 1884 he

contracted leprosy himself, and could then address his flock, "We lepers..." He died five years later, in 1889. His story is certainly extraordinary, although often echoed these days by legions of medical professionals all over the world who put themselves in harm's way to treat those sick and dying from COVID. We have been blessed with multitudes of fearless, generous heroes like him who have and continue to expend themselves physically and emotionally to get us through this pandemic. One person in particular is in need of our prayers. Fr. Rick Frechette, as you know, has dedicated his life to the people of Haiti. In addition to dealing with the effects of COVID amid communities not able to social distance, you may have heard about the recent government

attacks against priests, religious and doctors. Fr. Rick says: "Things have been tough. I was able to gain the release of 3 of the 10 priests kidnapped; other efforts got the rest out. We had kidnapped staff, a teacher and a doctor. We closed all our works in protest. We had three people shot at our gates in recent days - all died. Managing their situations was tragic and sad. It's a tough road." Today let us give thanks for our modern martyrs of charity, and ask for Fr. Damien's intercession to keep them safe, and send them physical and spiritual strength, as they continue the work of Jesus of leading others to the Father's Kingdom of true and lasting peace.

# LEARN AND GROW

## REOPENING

As you know, Governor Lamont has sanctioned the relaxing of the restrictions put in place during the COVID pandemic. Beginning on May 19 - this Wednesday - social distancing guidelines have been eliminated, gathering sizes are no longer restricted, and the only requirement still in place is the wearing of facemasks indoors.

Following this announcement, Archbishop Blair has said that churches will also return to full capacity without social distancing for all activities, but the wearing of facemasks still continues for indoor gatherings, including Mass.

What does that mean for us here at Christ the King? In brief, beginning **next** weekend, it means a return to mostly normal (pre-pandemic) liturgies. Pre-registration is a thing of the past. All the entrances to our church will be open. All seats will be open as well. Holy water fonts will remain empty however.

We will return to entrance and recessional processions. Offertory collections will again be taken by ushers passing the basket. However, there will not be an offertory procession.

As masks are still required, Communion will continue as we have done it for more than a year now, but we will return to having people come forward beginning with the front pews. You come before the priest or Eucharistic minister leaving your mask on, receive Communion in your hand, proceed to one of the colored squares in front of the first pew, remove your mask while facing forward, place the host in your mouth, put your mask back on, and return to your

pew via the side aisle.

While we will be ordering a limited number of hymnals, all music used each weekend can be found on our website and can be accessed from your smart device in church.

Also beginning next weekend, the dispensation from attending Sunday Mass will no longer be in place. That means that all Catholics have the obligation to come for Mass and receive our Lord in Holy Communion **every week**. Of course, if you are ill, if you are at risk of being infected, or if you are homebound, then you are not obligated to attend. It is the Lord Jesus, in Holy Communion, that strengthens us to face the trials and tribulations of daily living, and so it is of utmost importance that we avail ourselves to this precious Sacrament weekly, allowing Jesus to lead us and guide us each and every day.

We will still provide Communion at 9:00am each Sunday for those who cannot be in large gatherings of people.

We thank Almighty God for having brought us to this day of reopening, and we continue to pray for all still affected by COVID around the world, for those working tirelessly to bring the vaccine to everyone, and for those who have died during this pandemic. St. Joseph, the Unnoticed Worker, intercede for us!
