

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



So, this last Sunday of August can mean only one thing—school is about to

start again. As I write this, it is still uncertain as to what the protocols will be. Here at our own Corpus Christi School, we were fortunate to have offered in-person education for almost the entire school year last year. That took a lot of planning, a lot of patience, a lot of coordination, and, yes, a lot of prayer.

You see, we have the benefit of being able to turn to Jesus for anything and everything we need in the course of the school year. We know that it is only with Jesus at our side that we can accomplish anything. It is only by the grace of God that

we can stay healthy and avoid the effects of COVID. It is only because of God that we can persevere through whatever is asked of us, even being masked while indoors.

Those children at Mass this weekend will be given “A Backpack Blessing” on a laminated card that can be attached to your backpack so that you will be reminded, through everything you will face this coming year that Jesus is walking with you.

The blessing reads:

Lord, bless this backpack and the student who carries it. As we begin this new school year, give these students strength when they feel weary, focus when they feel overwhelmed, and

determination to complete the tasks before them.

Mostly, give them courage to accept all that will happen this wonderful school year.

Be with them always, in the classroom, on the school bus, and at home.

Allow them to know Your presence in all they say and do. Remind each student of the awesome future before them, and let each subject and teacher be a source of discovery and growth.

We ask this through Your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Know that we here at Christ the King will keep all students, teachers, and faculty in our prayers throughout the 2021-22 school year!

Dear friends,

What a wonderful thing it would be if we could wash our sins away in the

shower; if we could become pure in God's eyes with the right kind of soap!

Unfortunately, even the ‘deep-cleansing’ concoctions which teenagers use to rid themselves of troublesome skin problems just won't reach down deep enough to get rid of sin.

In today's Gospel account Jesus begins with a critique of the religious customs that the Pharisees introduced into Mosaic Law. This body of rituals was designed to supplement God's written law and intensify its requirements of ritual purity. The controversy of this episode

arises out of the ‘unclean hands’ of the disciples. To the Pharisees, this looked like religious laxity, a charge they wished to bring against Jesus.

Jesus sharply rebuked the Pharisees, labeling them hypocrites and reminding them that the true intention of the Law was purity of heart, not purity of hands. This moral purity was to be measured not by what passes through the mouth, but what comes from the heart.

‘You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.’ Blindly, the Pharisees elevated the traditions of ritual purity to be equal to the laws of God which had been revealed to Moses. By ‘clinging to these human traditions’ their

worship of God was mere lip service devoid of living faith. Throughout the Gospels the Pharisees are depicted as engaging in rigid ritual and hollow worship. This particular episode warns us of the dangers of hypocrisy. We must not become modern-day Pharisees, quick to criticize and condemn. We must not judge the relationship that other people have with God. Nor should we give a perfunctory lip-service to God, devoid of meaning. Rather, we must be a people of gentle hands and compassionate hearts, always knowing that our words will only be empty rhetoric if they are not lived out through our deeds, and through our deeds we move our hearts closer to God.

Excerpts from August 21 letter from Father Rick Frechette:

Dear friends,

Our strategy is well underway, in collaboration with local authorities (State or Church or both), and is

fourfold:

1. Our medical team is working daily with the people at the various tragic sites, with their base at Port Salut,
2. St Luc Hospital (among other hospitals) is receiving medically evaluated patients,
3. We are sending loads of supplies daily to our emergency medical team, to other St Luc clinics in the affected areas as they restart their function, and to hospitals and clinics in Jeremie and Les Cayes as we receive requests,
4. We are starting to put a solid roof over people's heads.

Please pray for those who are struggling and suffering, as well as for those who have died.

We so appreciate the strength of your prayer, and your sacrifices to help at this urgent moment.

The ongoing weekly food collection continues throughout the year, and any non-perishable food items can be brought to any mass all year long. The sandwich project is resuming in September and the shelter meals are resuming in October, both for ImmaCare in Hartford.

FUNDRAISERS FOR OUR HONDURAS HEALTH CLINIC

We will be having a mum sale the weekend of **September 11th & 12th** and a special monetary collection **September 18th & 19th** for our health clinic in Honduras. Centro Médico la Amistad is located in a very poor village of El Progreso, Honduras. This clinic opened two days per week in February 2015 and is staffed totally by Hondurans with our oversight and funding. Much needed health care is being provided for families not only in Olivos, but to over 50 surrounding villages. Our mission is to provide each person and their family with comprehensive and quality health care. With a caring team of professionals and inspired by Christian principles, we respect the dignity and needs of each individual. The clinic has been very popular because we are providing good, cheap medical care and we have medications, which a lot of the government-run clinics do not have much of. We do charge people a very small fee (the equivalent of \$2.00), but some people can't

even afford that and are never turned away.

Examples of people being seen are: A 30-year-old female patient with a fungal infection in her great toe. The nail needed to be removed and wound care was done and the necessary medications were given. A 6-year-old boy was treated for an abscessed thumb with surgical drainage of the abscess and antibiotics given.

The cost for the mums will be **\$10 each or 3 for \$25**. If anyone would like to help sell the mums at any Mass the 14th & 15th and if any young people are needing service hours, please call Nancy Kiely at 860-989-5548 (cell) or 860-721-0197 (home). For the monetary collection the weekend of September 18th & 19th, checks can be made out to Christ the King Social Action and mailed in if you're unable to attend Mass. 100% of the funds collected will go towards the operation of this health clinic. AOH CAMPAIGN TO BUILD AN IRISH CANAL WORKERS MEMORIAL



The Ancient Order of Hibernians Hartford Division 2 is fundraising to build a monument to help remember a forgotten Irish-Catholic cemetery in Windsor Locks.

The memorial will honor the 400 immigrant laborers who left their homeland in Ireland and came to the area between May 1827 and November 1829 to build the canal bypassing the treacherous rapids of the Connecticut River.

In particular, we will honor those canal workers and family members that are buried in an unmarked Catholic cemetery that is located about 100 yards and across the canal from where the memorial will be placed.

The memorial will be located at the Windsor Locks Canal Trail State Park near the Montgomery Mills Apartments.
