

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



Everybody has an opinion these days. About everything. Or at least it sure

appears that way. It seems that nearly everything that happens, whether locally, nationally, or internationally, is soon followed by a barrage of all kinds of people weighing in with their opinions. So many of us tend to jump right on social media and begin either praising or condemning, either supporting or ridiculing, either building up or tearing down. We sure do seem to love hearing ourselves speak, love hearing what we have to say.

Of course, we don't just do it on social media. We sometimes do it in conversations with family and friends, making sure we say what we want to say before anyone else gets a chance. We sometimes do it in romantic relationships, harping about our concerns and needs and wants, without paying much attention to the concerns of our spouse or girlfriend or boyfriend. We even sometimes do it with our kids, correcting and scolding and "laying down the law" without even really trying to find out what our son or daughter is thinking or feeling. 'Speak first, listen later' seems to be the pattern for

many of us.

We hear in today's Gospel story about Jesus healing a deaf man: "He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." And he does so in a very physical way, by touching the man's ears and then touching the man's tongue. And I can't help but think that the order in which he performs this miracle matters, for it matches what we know from human experience to be true, that it is nearly impossible to speak with complete clarity if one has difficult hearing with clarity. In other words, it is a difficulty in hearing that results in a difficulty in speech; not the other way around.

Is that what's happening to so many of us? Have we fallen in love with the sound of our own voices, fallen in love with our own opinions and thoughts, fallen in love with what we have to say, that we are no longer really listening, no longer hearing the sound of the most important voice of all, the voice within?

Put another way, do we even try to listen to the voice of God before we speak? Or do we feel we've basically "heard" enough, been taught enough, experienced enough of life, and therefore there really is nothing else God needs to tell us? Do we simply talk and talk and talk, not realizing that what we are

saying is so far beneath who we are, so greatly diminished and impoverished, so lacking in kindness and compassion and understanding and love? Do we actually think that we can speak clearly - "speak" the words that God wants us to speak - without making sure that we are hearing just as clearly?

One thing is certain - we'll never hear God's voice if we never try to "tune in" to it. We'll never hear God's voice if we don't believe that He is truly trying to communicate with us. We'll never hear God's voice if we don't listen for it in the silence of our rooms and in the silence of our hearts. And we'll never hear God's voice if deep down we're afraid of what He might have to say; afraid of the changes He might ask us to make.

Let us pray that we might be open to the miracles God wants to work in our lives - miracles that will help us be more forgiving and generous and kind and compassionate and loving. That's what God wants for each of us and from each of us. But it can't happen if we continue to be deaf to the voice of God calling us to be more than we are today.

This is the story of Vincent Papale, a south Philadelphia native that went from zero to hero when he took a one-in-a-million chance and made the roster of the Philadelphia Eagles as a

walk-on. During the mid-seventies America was in an economic slump; unemployment was high, life in the inner city was difficult and for the unskilled laborer opportunities were few. Papale was an underemployed bartender whose wife left him because he

was headed nowhere. She took all the furniture from their row home and left behind a note that said Papale would never amount to anything. It was this note that hung over his head like the sword of Damocles.

He kept it with him wherever he went. He took it with him to his tryout for the Eagles. It was with him the day he played his first professional game (which turned out to be a disaster). It wasn't until he ripped that note to shreds and fully and faithfully came to believe in himself that he had his breakout game. It was like Jesus saying to the man in today's Gospel, "Ephphatha - Be opened."

In our world, it is not the physical healing that Jesus performed that we are called to imitate; rather, our act of healing is a practical one, a daily one, a more immediate one. When someone receives bad news and closes out the world around them we are called to say, "Ephphatha" - Be opened. When someone is rejected by their peers or friends that they loved and feels that no one cares for them we recite, "Ephphatha - Be opened." When someone who knows the truth has been silenced because no one respects his or her opinion, we must cry out, "Ephphatha - Be opened."

The way we say, "Be opened," is by saying the words of encouragement that others need to hear. What Vince Papale did in his simple yet profound act was not a self-serving situation; rather it gave hope to others like him. If one could do it, then others too. By opening himself up to belief he healed a wounded soul, a broken spirit, a forgotten man. Movies such as "Invincible" are regular fare: "Cinderella Man," "Seabiscuit," "Remember the Titans," "The

Rookie," "The Miracle" and on and on.

Why can't we get enough of these films? Because we know the truth of what Jesus did, He gave voice to the downtrodden; He opened the ears of those who had been walled in silence by being marginalized by society. We need to be both the one who is healed and the one who heals. We are to hear the cries of the poor. Open our ears, our hearts and our minds to the plight of those around us. We are to speak about the injustices that afflict our world; we are not to sit as if we were mute when we can speak and make a difference. But if we are to be healed, then we must heal others.

Pull the earphones from those who are listening to destructive and pessimistic lyrics. Say the good things, the words of hope that people need to hear. Call to participation those who are sitting idle on the sidelines of life. Let others hear, let others speak and in doing so they will say again, "That one, Jesus, does all things well; the deaf hear and the dumb speak."

Have a great week and here is a thought:


