

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL



"You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

We hear these words of Jesus in the Gospel today. They can be interpreted in two different ways. The first is the easy way, the one that allows us to see this sentence in isolation and come to the conclusion that Jesus is essentially telling us, "So don't even try." And if that's the interpretation we want to embrace, then our spiritual lives, our spiritual journeys as Christians, will pretty much come to a screeching halt. If we truly believe that we can't possibly know anything about God or what He might want from us, then there really is no point. If it's impossible to know, then there is no value in trying.

But there is another way to interpret these words, another

way of understanding what Jesus is saying. And this is one that is consistent with our faith, consistent with what we believe as Church, what we believe as people who call Jesus our Lord and God. And this interpretation is one in which we can imagine Jesus following up his statement by telling us, "But that's precisely what you need to try to do—think as God thinks."

In other words, we are to become as best as we can just like God—to think as He thinks, to see as He sees; to want what He wants; to love as He loves us. Just like our earthly parents have shaped us, so should our heavenly One do the same - help mold us into the beautiful person He created us to be.

There is one big difference, of course. In many ways, our moms and dads shaped us without our full consent, shaped

us simply because of the environment they created for us, that is, what they did and what they said and how they treated us as we were growing up.

But in a very real sense, God rarely works in us without our consent. And not because He can't. That's not it at all. Rather, God chooses to act this way because He completely respects our freedom, and respects our ability to choose to be open to His grace or not open to it, and respects our ability to choose to say "yes" to Him or not. And that means that we have the ability and responsibility to choose the kind of person we become.

May we be strengthened to go forth this week, and in all we will say and do strive to think and act as God thinks and acts.

Last week on Wednesday September 8, we celebrated the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, commemorating the birthday of the Blessed Mother of God, Mary, to the loving family of St. Joachim and St. Anne, her parents.

Mary's Nativity marked the moment when the salvation of God began to come forth into the world, as God slowly revealed to us all the truth about Himself and His plans for us. Yet, this is an even more

amazing story as God chose not the rich and powerful, the influential and the great to conduct His work of salvation, but instead, He chose a mere ordinary woman, from likely a poor family in Nazareth, on the peripheries to be the one whom He chose to be the Mother of the Savior.

And why is this significant for us? It shows us that God chose us all sinners, unworthy as we may be, and called us to be His disciples and followers, and just as He has chosen Mary, to be the one bearing the Messiah, and made her to be full of grace, we too are called to embrace God and His love, and to be

filled with His grace. We have all been called from our most ordinary backgrounds, from our various occupations and lives, to be the genuine and loving disciples of the Lord.

That is what all of us must recognize as God calls all of us to be His faithful laborers and workers, in the world, in our communities and among our own circles of friends and relatives, and among those whom we encounter daily in life, to our acquaintances and neighbors, and even to strangers whom we met along the way.

WHAT IS AMIRAH?



Amirah is a non-profit organization that provides aftercare, resources, and opportunities to women who have survived different forms of sexual exploitation, sexual trafficking, and prostitution.

They do this through a long-term residential program (Safe House), outreach services (community resource center, special programs), policy work, and educating communities. Presently, Amirah has a Safe House in the Boston area and Greater Hartford has just opened an Amirah Safe House. It is Amirah's practice to utilize what they learn from their work and then advocate for changes in policies that make recovery and independence possible for more women.

Christ the King has joined the Greater Hartford Archdiocese in supporting Amirah and its Safe House in Greater Hartford. Some members have also participated in volunteer training for the Safe House. Our Social Action group has also joined in Amirah's prayer group. We will periodically include prayers in the bulletin and hope you will join us.

OUR PARISH HEALTH CLINIC NEEDS YOUR HELP

The Social Action Committee is sponsoring a mum sale this weekend, **September 11th & 12th** to raise money for Medical Center la Amistad, our parish's health clinic in Honduras. The beautiful mums come in a variety of colors and are being sold for \$10 each or 3/25. We will be having a monetary collection (the second collection) next weekend, **September 18th & 19th**, also for the clinic. For the monetary collection, checks can be made out to Christ the King Social Action and mailed in if you're unable to attend Mass. 100% of the funds collected will go towards the operation of this health clinic. Centro Médico la Amistad is a small health clinic located in an impoverished village called



Monte de los Olivos, in El Progreso, Honduras. It is staffed by 6 Hondurans (Doctor, Nurse, Lab Tech, Pharmacy Tech, Registration person and Finance Coordinator) and open 2 days per week. Recently, a 25 year old man was treated with medications and a minor surgical procedure for an abscess in his left hand, where the doctor removed a thorn causing the abscess. This past 1-½ years has been very challenging with the Covid-19 Pandemic, and two of our staff came down with Covid despite using the necessary precautions and social distancing. Finally, the vaccine has started to reach Honduras and all of the staff have been vaccinated. The numbers of Covid cases remain relatively high, so once again, we will be unable to travel there this year. Your support of these 2 fundraisers for our health clinic is greatly needed and much appreciated!!

AOH CAMPAIGN TO BUILD AN IRISH CANAL



The Ancient Order of Hibernians Hartford Division 2 is fundraising to build a monument to help remember a forgotten Irish-Catholic cemetery in

Windsor Locks.

The memorial will honor the 400 immigrant laborers who left their homeland in Ireland and came to the area between May 1827 and November 1829 to build the canal bypassing the treacherous rapids of the Connecticut River.

In particular, we will honor those canal workers and family members that are buried in an unmarked Catholic cemetery that is located about 100 yards and across the canal from where the memorial will be placed.

The memorial will be located at the Windsor Locks Canal Trail State Park near the Montgomery Mills Apartments.
