

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL

<div data-bbox="73 168 316 367" data-label="Image"> </div> <p><i>I have often reflected on the Beatitudes – those sayings/teachings from Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount.</i></p> <p><i>We have all heard them, and can undoubtedly quote most, if not all of them. And while I understand Jesus came to turn the world order upside down, nonetheless, on another level, they seem to make little sense taken at face value.</i></p> <p><i>Then I came across Elias Chacour’s book “We Belong to the Land” in which there is a marvelous description of the Beatitudes.</i></p> <p><i>He says that the verb ‘Blessed’ was originally written in Aramaic – the language of Jesus. As such, it does not have the passive quality we so often associate with it.</i></p> <p><i>It does not describe what will happen to someone – for example, ‘Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.’</i></p> <p><i>Elias says: ‘How could I go to a persecuted young man in a Palestinian refugee camp, for</i></p>	<p><i>instance, and say, “Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted,” or “Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of justice, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven”?</i> That man would revile me, saying neither I nor my God understood his plight and he would be right.</p> <p><i>When I understand Jesus’ words in Aramaic, I translate like this:</i></p> <p><i>Get up, go ahead, do something, move, you who are hungry and thirsty for justice, for you shall be satisfied.</i></p> <p><i>Get up, go ahead, do something, move, you peacemakers, for you shall be called children of God.</i></p> <p><i>To me this reflects Jesus’ words and teachings much more accurately. I can hear him saying: “Get your hands dirty to build a human society for human beings; otherwise, others will torture and murder the poor, the voiceless, and the powerless.”</i></p> <p><i>Christianity is not passive but active, energetic, alive, going beyond despair. . . .</i></p>	<p><i>“Get up, go ahead, do something, move,” Jesus said to his disciples.’</i></p> <p><i>When looked at this way, it is obvious that as disciples of Jesus we are charged with the responsibility to go forth and make the changes needed in the world around us, so that the Beatitudes – ‘Be-Attitudes’ – will make a difference in the lives of those in the world most in need. That is why Pope Francis, last Sunday, inaugurated the Global Synod as an opportunity for people everywhere to listen to the needs of our brothers and sisters, and as a church, to address those needs. ‘Communion, Participation, Mission’ is the theme of this Synod, asking every Catholic around the world to reflect on what we need to do better as a church to work together to build the Kingdom. Let us pray for the success of this Synod.</i></p> <p style="text-align: right;">Father Nick</p>

We struggle to understand; we ask “Why? Why does a good man or woman die? Why purgatory for so many? Without our faith, we can easily conclude that it is all just terribly unfair, that death has had the last word after all and is the final destination for everyone. Yet, that is not the Christian message. What is? Perhaps we can recall that: God is Love. The apostle</i></p>	<p><i>John tells us this. God’s mercy is infinite. The apostle Paul teaches us this. God wants all men and women to be perfect like him in eternal glory. Jesus himself told us this.</i></p> <p><i>We all long to see God face to face. We long to see his beauty, his glory and to be fully embraced by him in heaven. God made us this way. It is our destiny to be with him and perfect like him. You see, for us to be admitted to heaven, we must depart this world in a state of grace, a state where God’s Spirit in living within us. Without that grace, we will be separated from God in hell. But God’s mercy is such that he provides us the opportunity to reach spiritual perfection after death and before</i></p>	<p><i>we enter heaven in what we call purgatory where his love and mercy will burn away anything that would keep us from fully seeing him and from the perfect happiness which he promises. Purgatory is an expression of God’s mercy, his love, and his desire that we be with him.</i></p> <p><i>Yes, the imperfections of sin and the deception of Satan undoubtedly have brought sickness and death into our lives and into all of creation. It is a stain on God’s original plan, and this stain’s effects are experienced by each of us, all of humanity, indeed the whole of creation, but God has broken the back of Satan, shattered the chains of death, and destroyed the grip of evil.</i></p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Continued on next page</i></p>

"You will never have the last word, God says to Satan, for I have given all men and women the freedom to choose, to speak, and to live. They have the last say. I offer them life and happiness and peace. I offer them joy. You, O Satan, offer only darkness, despair, loneliness, selfishness, and separation."

We struggle with the mystery of life and death at times like today, yet we know that we live! We know that from nothing we became living breathing human beings. We witness the death of others but we live life and experience it directly. We cannot deny our life, that it exists, that it is ours and we cannot deny others their lives. This is a great temptation in our world today, i.e., to deny someone their life, to take life from them rather than giving and sustaining life in them. The choice is ours when faced with the mystery. God gives us life and he will not take it from

us even when we experience the mortality of our human flesh in this world. The people we honor on this feast day, I truly hope and believe, chose well, and may God in his mercy bless them abundantly and grant them quick admittance into heaven.

Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Things are going very well with the clinic under the direction of our fabulous Honduran team of one doctor, 1 nurse, a finance coordinator, registrar, lab tech and a pharmacy

Covid is still very prevalent in the country, but the vaccine has finally been more available. The team is seeing more patients who need weekly wound care. Lives are being changed through the work of our parish's clinic and it is thanks to your generosity.

A TALK ON RACISM

This Monday, October 25th at 7 pm in St. Joseph Hall, the Social Action Committee is sponsoring a talk titled "Why Does Racial Diversity Matter?" The speaker will be Nicole R. Miller, M.Ed, whose passion for diversity, equity and inclusion grew out her lived experience. Living in communities and attending schools during adolescent years, where she was often the only person of color, she found herself identifying with the dominant culture, which prevented her from fully understanding the impact race had on her life. This changed when she entered her freshman year at the University of Michigan, at 17, and she attended a pre-orientation program for students of color. From that moment, her journey of discovering

herself as a Black woman began. The genesis for Nicole's passion for teaching others about diversity, equity, and inclusion began as a member of the staff of Watkinson School in the early 2000's. In 2010, she joined the Goodwin University community, where she continued to create diversity, equity, and inclusion programs for students and faculty to engage them in conversations about the issues of race, privilege, and racism. Most recently, Nicole started the organization EquityCorps Group LLC. The mission of EquityCorps Group is to "Re-educate America One Community At A Time." We hope you will join us on October 25th for this very important talk.
