**First Reading****Gen 22:1-2, 9, 10-13,15-18**

A Reading from the Book of Genesis

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you." When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son." As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son. Again the LORD's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "I swear by myself, declares the LORD, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing - all this because you obeyed my command."

**Gospel Reading****Mark 9:2-10**

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark  
Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.

## Reflections on our Readings for The Second Sunday of Lent

(Readings can be found on Page 2)



### “This Is My Beloved Son. Listen To Him.”

Our Sunday readings during Lent take a somewhat different regimen than usual. Our first readings highlight four key events in Salvation history. Last week was God's covenant with Noah after the flood. This week is God's covenant with Abraham on Mount Moriah. Our Gospel readings focus on key events in Jesus' life leading us to the cross.

**Our first reading** ([Genesis 22:1-2, 9, 10-13,15-18](#)) is taken from excerpts of the story of God calling Abraham to sacrifice his only Son “as a *holocaust*.” This is a fascinating story that has many parallels to the crucifixion of Jesus. Because Abraham did not withhold his “*own beloved son*”, God promised Abraham descendants “as *countless as the stars of the sky*”.

**Our Epistle reading** ([Romans 8:31-34](#)) was written by St. Paul to the Christians in Rome who were experiencing great persecution. St. Paul reassures his audience that, even in the midst of relentless persecution, they can be no less glorified in their suffering than God's own son, whom God “*handed over for us all*”.

**Our Gospel reading** ([Mark 9:2-10](#)) is the account of the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. It clearly defined for Peter, James and John that Jesus is truly divine. It helps us also understand that the suffering Jesus who will die on the cross for our sins is truly the divine son of God.

One of the things we may learn today is that God's call is personal and challenging. It is not always easy. We follow in the footsteps of God's own son. But we know where those footsteps lead. Beyond the suffering, beyond the hardships, beyond even death, we know God's unfathomable love for us will transcend it all. “*It is God who acquits us, who will condemn?*” When God calls to us, how should we respond? As Abraham, “*Here I am.*”

As we celebrate **Black History Month**, let us honor influential Black Catholics in our history. These are excerpts taken from the Our Sunday Visitor (OSV) Ministry website, Simply Catholic. Please pray and reflect upon this model of our faith. Enjoy!

**Dr. Lena Edwards**  
*Doctor advocated against abortion, sterilization*

Dr. Lena Edwards was born into a devout Catholic family in Washington, D.C., in 1900. The mother of six children, Edwards pursued a medical career as a means to help people.

The Catholic obstetrician was vocal in her opposition to abortion and sterilization and advocated natural childbirth. In her day, she worked among the poor and immigrants and taught at the Howard University Medical School.

A consummate and successful professional, Edwards was awarded the highest American civilian honor in 1964 by President Lyndon B. Johnson — the Presidential Medal of Freedom. A devout Catholic all her life, Edwards was a daily Mass attendee. Born on the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Edwards was very much devoted to him and the virtue of poverty.

She was a professed secular Franciscan and was awarded the Poverello Award in 1967, given to those who exemplify the ideals of the Franciscan founder. She died in 1986.


