

**Gospel Reading****John 2:13-25**

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.



## Reflections on our Readings for The Third Sunday of Lent

(Readings can be found on Page 2)



### “I, The Lord, Am Your God.”

As we continue our Lenten journey, we are called to refocus our efforts on being in right relationship with God and with each other.

**Our first reading** ([Exodus 20:1-3,7-8,12-17](#)) is a listing of the Ten Commandments, given to Moses by God himself. It is evidence of a personal, loving God calling his chosen people into a covenant relationship. In the first three, God calls us into relationship with himself as the one, true and only God. In the remaining commandments, God calls us into relationship with each other, in a bond of love and respect - an image of the loving relationship God has with us.

**In our Epistle reading** ([1 Corinthians 1:22-25](#)), St. Paul presents the mystery of “*Christ crucified*” as the wisdom of God. It is a stumbling block and foolishness for many; for how could the humiliating public execution of one man lead to anything but death and disgrace? But we Christians know that the wisdom of God defies human understanding.

**Our Gospel reading** ([John 2:13-25](#)) is the story of Jesus chasing the money-changers out of the temple. His was rightfully angry that the holy dwelling place of his Father was no longer treated with reverence. Jesus used this setting to point to his crucifixion when he himself, the true Temple of God, would be destroyed and raised up again in three days.

Developing a right relationship with God is much the same as being in right relationship with our spouse, family or friend. It is a life-long endeavor. It is an exercise in communication - both ways. Coming into tune with God is what happens in prayer. Prayer helps us tune out the static of our world and tune in to the frequency of God. Then, we should listen.

*From the Desk of Deacon Jim . . .***The Heart of the Law**

One of the great things about our faith are the traditions and rituals that help us navigate our earthly existence, reminding us of God's presence; providing various ways to engage in a personal relationship with Christ our Savior. You see, God knows we need many ways to connect with Him because He made each of us unique in our own way. We are His creation! That unto itself is beautiful and should be celebrated.

Similarly, scripture speaks to each of us individually. I marvel at how a scripture passage can speak to me one way and my wife another! And that same reading, a year or two later, another meaning...each time bringing deeper and deeper insights into how to live a Christlike life.

This week, as we hear of the Ten Commandments and of Jesus losing His temper in the temple, I was struck by a sense of sternness. The Ten Commandments are full of "shall not's." And then we have Jesus losing his cool, a trait we do not usually associate with Jesus. What are we to make of that?

When I reflected further, I was drawn back to how I try (emphasize try) to live like Jesus- with gratitude, empathy, compassion, forgiveness. You see, when we live with gratitude and with compassion, we are better able to rid ourselves of the sins and vices of our world- those we hear of in the Ten Commandments.

So rather than approaching the shall not's as a check list of things not to do, the message I hear today is living life loving each other, helping each other, trusting each other, forgiving each other...living that way helps us avoid the sinful trappings of our world.

And that reality of our lives on earth is what Jesus himself was confronted with in the temple. He reacted in a very human way. But there is also the realization that His message of love, compassion, mercy is the only way for us to thrive (not just survive!) in our world.

May God continue to bless us on our Lenten journey!


