

Introducing a New Mass Setting

Happy Easter! As we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection this Easter Season, we will be incorporating a new Mass Setting into our Liturgies at St. Rita Church.



The Mass Setting is comprised of the Mass Ordinary set into music (such as the Kyrie; Holy, Holy, Holy; Lamb of God, and so forth). The Mass setting helps us to participate actively in the Mass, whether we are actively listening (as we are right now) or singing as an entire assembly. After researching many Mass Settings that have been composed, we have chosen the "Mass of Christ the Savior" by Dan Schutte. This beautiful arrangement lends itself to a single singer and guitar or choir, organ, piano and added instruments.

The benefits of singing a new Mass setting are that we can grow our repertoire as an assembly, so that we can choose a different Mass setting while we journey through the different church seasons. We will not say goodbye forever to our current Mass setting (The Mass of Renewal). Indeed, we will return to that Mass setting or the chant Mass or other settings we learn as we celebrate the various seasons. You will hear our cantors beginning to sing the "Mass of Christ the Savior" and I believe you will find the music helps us enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ each time we celebrate Mass.

We look forward to the day when we will all be able to sing to the Lord with our lips, what we know in our hearts: that Christ is Risen, indeed!

From the Desk of Deacon Jim . . .

A Cause for Celebration!



What a week it has been. On Palm Sunday I asked us all to immerse ourselves in the mystery; to live Holy Week as a disciple of Jesus, not knowing today, Easter, would come. We pondered the questions of why God loves us so much and why Jesus had to die. And are we as passionate for God as He is for us? These questions were answered as we progressed through Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

The joy of a Passover supper on Holy Thursday showed us the love they all had for one another and the institution of the Eucharist, when the body and blood of Christ is understood to be Christ himself, being with us and part of us as we endeavor to live as Jesus modeled for us by the washing of the disciple's feet - love one another as I love you.

On Good Friday, we wept over the death of Jesus considering the love from Holy Thursday. We reflected on whether we similarly weep over the violence, the murder, the pain and suffering in our world, for all those we too are called to love as much as Jesus? His message from Holy Thursday.

Which brings us to Easter- the resurrected Christ! The events of the past week bring us the knowledge and the heartfelt compassion to embrace this day anew. With fresh eyes as it becomes clear to us that Jesus had to leave us in order for us to understand the resurrection, the doorway to eternal life. The way back to the Father.

But there is more to this than our relationship with God. It is our relationship with one another. By what transpired this past week, we understand what God has done for us, but just as important, what he has given us. The power of the Eucharist gives us all we need to be each other's salvation...By forgiving, by listening, by being selfless.

With that understanding of the Eucharist, if we doubt our ability to forgive others, to listen to others with an open mind...if we doubt our ability to stop judging, or if we doubt our ability to solve the world's biggest issues, aren't we really doubting God? Aren't we really doubting what we celebrate today?

So, as we continue to crawl our way out of this pandemic, reacquaint yourself with this gift - the Eucharist. Easier said than done, I know. I know this is still a challenge for many who have yet to be vaccinated or continue to weigh their risks. And that is ok...all through this pandemic, that act of concern and consideration is an act of love unto itself. But let's never forget the source of that love and the need to consistently feed ourselves, refuel ourselves and remind ourselves of God's presence through the reception of the Eucharist - the gift.

Easter Sunday The Resurrection Of The Lord

In the hope that you will enter more fully into the Mass!

“Do Not Be Amazed! He Has Been Raised; He Is Not Here.”

It is Easter! We have come to the climactic conclusion of our roller coaster Holy Week. First, Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, then the loving example of Jesus washing the feet of his disciples at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (*"As I have done, so you also must do."*) Then on Good Friday, the abject sorrow of Jesus' passion and death on the cross and burial. And now, the incalculable joy as we learn that *"He has been raised . . . He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you."*



There are two distinct liturgies for our Easter celebration, each with its own selection of scripture readings:

Holy Saturday Easter Vigil

The Vigil Mass on Saturday night features numerous Old Testament readings that highlight many of the key moments in salvation history beginning with the creation story ([Genesis 1:1-2:2](#)), *"In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless wasteland, and darkness covered the abyss . . ."*

Following this is the story of God testing Abraham with the sacrifice of his only son ([Genesis 22:1-18](#)) which is a foreshadowing of the sacrifice of God's only begotten Son, *"Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust. . . ."*

Then comes the story of God parting the Red Sea so the Israelites could escape their slavery in Egypt ([Exodus 14:15 - 15:1](#)), *"The Lord said to Moses, 'Why are you crying out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. And you, lift up your staff and, with hand outstretched over the sea, split the sea in two. . . ."*

The next reading is the prophesy of the Prophet Isaiah near the end of the Israelite's exile in Babylon ([Isaiah 55:1-11](#)). Isaiah looks forward to the day of liberation, *"All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk!"*

In our Epistle reading ([Romans 6:3-11](#)), St. Paul teaches us that as we also died with Christ, so too, we will receive new life in Christ, *"We are indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life."*

In our Gospel reading ([Mark 16:1-7](#)), we hear Mark's account of the resurrection, as Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James found the stone rolled back and the tomb empty, *"Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised. He is not here."*

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

The Easter morning readings are shorter and focus more succinctly on Jesus' resurrection. **The first reading** is from the Acts of the Apostles ([Acts 10:34, 37-43](#)) and is an excerpt of St. Peter's speech in Caesarea where he boldly proclaimed the risen Christ, *"You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. . . They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, . . . He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."*

Our Gospel reading ([John 20:1-9](#)) is John's telling of the events on Easter morning. *"Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them . . . They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter . . . When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head . . . For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead"*

On this glorious Easter Day, may we reflect on the words of Pope Saint John Paul II (Angelus - 1986): *"We do not pretend that life is all beauty. We are aware of darkness and sin, of poverty and pain. But we know Jesus has conquered sin and passed through his own pain to the glory of the Resurrection. And we live in the light of his Paschal Mystery - the mystery of his Death and Resurrection. 'We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song!'"* God, grant that we may sing Alleluia with our lives all year long.




