**Gospel Reading****John 10:19-31**

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to John

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So, the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.



**"Peace Be With You.  
Even As The Father Has Sent Me,  
Even So, I Send You."**

This Sunday begins our liturgical Season of Easter. For the next seven weeks until Pentecost Sunday, our first readings will be from the Acts of the Apostles, as the Church helps us recall the birth of Christianity and the emerging Catholic Church. Our Epistle readings are mostly from the First Letter of John which helps us better understand the person and divinity of Jesus and deepen our spiritual awareness of the Christian community. The Gospel readings are from the Gospel of John which helps us reflect on the appearances of the resurrected Jesus and his words to his disciples.

**Our first reading** ([Acts 4:32-35](#)) helps us see that the early church "was of one heart and mind" as they lived in common. The more fortunate would voluntarily share their wealth with those in need so there was "no needy person among them."

**Our Epistle reading** ([1 John 5:1-6](#)) teaches us the importance of loving God and Jesus as well as living his commandments. The "water and blood" refer to Christ's baptism and the shedding of his blood. The Spirit was present in both events.

**Our Gospel reading** ([John 10:19-31](#)) is the story of the institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus appeared to the apostles and at once eased their fears by telling them, "Peace be with you." His very first action since his resurrection was to breathe on them and give them the power to forgive sins. We also hear of Jesus' appearance to Thomas, forever to be known as the "doubting and believing Thomas". Here, Thomas offers one of the greatest professions of faith, "My Lord and my God."

Today is also Divine Mercy Sunday, which calls our attention to the Mercy of God through the person of Jesus. Our prayer, "Jesus, I trust in you" helps us know that Jesus is always with us, especially when we think he is not.

***From the Desk of Anne Thomas . . .***

During the Easter season last year, I relied on Christ's promise of new life to get me through the early challenges of pandemic life. Now, I am surrounded by good news. I have family and friends who are newly eligible to make vaccine appointments. Having been recently vaccinated myself, I'm also planning to return to Mass in person for almost the first time in a year. In the Easter season this year, I am blessed with an abundance of hope!

Our hope comes from Christ on the cross, who suffered death and was buried, and rose again. Death brings new life, endings bring beginnings, and hope can come from difficult times.

Watching Mass at home with my twins has certainly been difficult. Their interest in screens begins and ends with Disney cartoons, and they don't have patience for their parents' divided attention. I leave the Sunday scene in the Thomas family living room to your imagination. They are disabled, and learn best through doing and experiencing. So the pandemic has deprived me of the best tool I had to teach them about Mass – actually being there!

Last winter, I was so proud to see how far they'd come. They were starting to dip their fingers in the holy water without prompting. They were learning to stay in the pew without getting upset (this was a *major* victory). A fellow parishioner reached for Connor's hand at the Sign of Peace, and for the first time ever, he reached back! I don't know how much of this progress is now lost, or when it will return. I'm not even sure how regularly I will bring them to Mass before there is a vaccine available to young children. I have hope, but I still worry.

Then again, Desmond once made a bee line straight to my nieces' old stuffed animals, stored in a bedroom closet, even though we hadn't been at my brother's house in a year. Maybe I don't have to worry about my kids' memories after all.

I share all this with you to say that no matter what your situation is, you are not alone. The parish staff and the whole community here share your hopes and your joys, your worries and your sorrows. You are seen. We are in one another's hearts and prayers, and God is with you. Perhaps you are eager to see the smiles behind our masks and shake hands again. Or maybe you will not join us in person until we reach herd immunity and your entire household is vaccinated. Or all of the above! We each have our own unique blessings and challenges – and yet we share them as a community, gathered in person or in spirit. I am grateful to be here with each of you, and I pray for you all.

***From our Music Director, June Frosino*****Introducing a New Mass Setting**

Happy Easter! As we celebrate the joy of the Resurrection this Easter Season, we will be incorporating a new Mass Setting into our Liturgies at St. Rita Church.



The Mass Setting is comprised of the Mass Ordinary set into music (such as the Kyrie; Holy, Holy, Holy; Lamb of God, and so forth). The Mass setting helps us to participate actively in the Mass, whether we are actively listening (as we are right now) or singing as an entire assembly. After researching many Mass Settings that have been composed, we have chosen the "Mass of Christ the Savior" by Dan Schutte. This beautiful arrangement lends itself to a single singer and guitar or choir, organ, piano and added instruments.

The benefits of singing a new Mass setting are that we can grow our repertoire as an assembly, so that we can choose a different Mass setting while we journey through the different church seasons. We will not say goodbye forever to our current Mass setting (The Mass of Renewal). Indeed, we will return to that Mass setting or the chant Mass or other settings we learn as we celebrate the various seasons. You will hear our cantors beginning to sing the "Mass of Christ the Savior" and I believe you will find the music helps us enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ each time we celebrate Mass.

We look forward to the day when we will all be able to sing to the Lord with our lips, what we know in our hearts: that Christ is Risen, indeed!




