A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter stood up in the midst of the brothers - there was a group of about one hundred and twenty persons in the one place -. He said, "My brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand through the mouth of David, concerning Judas, who was the guide for those who arrested Jesus. He was numbered among us and was allotted a share in this ministry. "For it is written in the Book of Psalms: May another take his office.

"Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Judas called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away to go to his own place." and his kingdom will have no end.


I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

Reflections on our Readings for The Seventh Sunday of Easter

***“God Is Love, And Whoever Remains In Love
Remains In God and God In Him”***

Our first reading and our Gospel reading this Sunday both mention that Judas ("the son of destruction") acted *"in order that the Scripture might be fulfilled"*. It is a reminder that God's plan, by his design, has unfolded since the beginning of creation. Our Epistle reading is a continuation on the theme *"God is love."*

In our first reading ([Acts 1:15-17, 20-26](#)), Peter and the Apostles, with the help of the Holy Spirit, replace Judas with the Apostle Matthias. They most likely considered the significance of the number twelve as important in representing the twelve tribes of Israel and the coming of the "reconstituted Kingdom of Israel" in heaven.

In our Epistle reading ([1 John 4:11-16](#)), we hear a continuation of last Sunday's epistle on the nature of God (God is love) and our response to God's love (love one another). John writes that God's entire being is love and God's love is expressed through the gift of his Son as expiation for our sins. And we are called to emulate that love by loving one another, in the same manner that Jesus has loved us.

In our Gospel reading ([John 17:11-19](#)), we hear a segment of what is known as Jesus' "High Priestly Prayer". It was part of his final farewell discourse that we have been hearing the past few weeks. In this prayer, Jesus prays directly with his Father on behalf of his disciples. He consecrated them to the Father in truth and to their mission on earth. Jesus spoke of his ministry in the past tense as he began to focus on what was to come.

The unity that Jesus spoke of between him and the Father is the same unity he spoke of between him and his disciples. Jesus is the bridge. This is the same union John spoke of in his epistle of love. *"Whoever acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God remains in him and he in God."* It is impossible to remain in God and not love one another, especially those for whom the world or our experience deems unlovable. When Jesus said *"love one another"*, he didn't mean just our own clan; he meant everyone, even our enemies. The more we love, the more we abide in God and God abides in us.



From the Desk of Deacon Jim . . .

What Celebrating Armed Forces Day Means for Unity



This weekend we celebrate Armed Forces Day; a holiday where we come together and thank the men and women of the United States Armed Forces. So let us do that

Thank you to all our veterans, all who currently serve, and for those who made the ultimate sacrifice for us. This holiday was first conceived by President Harry Truman and was established in 1949. The creation of a single day celebration for all five branches of the United States military made sense due to its recent unification under the Department of Defense.

I bring this up because it speaks of a unification of the different branches of the military. Each doing their part towards the same goal, the same mission. Which is exactly what Jesus is trying to get us to do. To be united in our mission. And what is that mission? Last week that mission boiled down to a simple yet elusive statement – “Love one another as I love you”. So, I ask, are we united in that mission?

Scripture talks frequently of unity with Christ and one another. What this most often means is united in love. For instance, in last week’s Gospel we heard “as the Father loves me, so I love you, remain in my love.” Unity is what we hear in our Gospel reading today, it is a section taken from what is referred to as the high priestly prayer where he prays this beautiful line, “Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one.” He prays for himself, his disciples, and all believers. Look at how that statement flows. God’s love for us, begins with Him, flows to his Son and then to us.

That is what it means to be united in love. It is His love that unites us and we are all loved by God. We are loved with all of our uniqueness, our diversity, our differences and yes our similarities. You see, what we all have in common, is that God loves all of us and He implores us to figure out how to do the same.

The theme at this year’s Prayer for Christian Unity was “*abide in my love and you shall bear much fruit*” and Pope Francis had these words:

“...the devil...is cunning: he magnifies others’ mistakes and defects, sows discord, provokes criticism and creates factions.”

“God has another way: He takes us as we are, he loves us so much ... he takes us as different, as sinners, and always nudges us towards unity.”

“Therefore, the solution to these divisions is not to oppose someone, because discord generates more discord. The true remedy begins by asking God for peace, reconciliation, unity.”

So, I ask, as we continue in our mission to love one another, what is stronger, the forces of unity or division? People always say let us find common ground. Well, that common ground is God’s love for us - the love that unites us. Let us start there. Our mission depends on it.




