An Update from Fr. Tim . . .

COVID-19 CHANGES IN REQUIREMENTS FOR MASKS AND DISTANCING

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Rita,

I am very glad to let you know that, here at St. Rita, there have been significant changes to the COVID-19 protocols which apply to seating and masking. New York State has adopted the CDC recommendations for fully vaccinated individuals and Bishop Matano has provided us with policy guidelines. These policies allow fully vaccinated individuals to no longer wear masks and physical distance in most indoor settings. Those who have not been fully vaccinated must continue to wear masks and maintain physical distancing while indoors.

While this is complicated, we are prepared to offer seating for a wide variety of circumstances. We all know that it is important to welcome all our parishioners to Mass!

Here are some of the priorities that St. Rita parish is taking into consideration:

- ◆ We are relying on the goodness and honesty of each of you to follow New York State guidelines and appropriately use the appropriate seating areas as noted below.
- ◆ We will do our best to maintain a safe space in which we can all gather to celebrate the Eucharist.
- ◆ We are striving to encourage all parishioners to return to the regular celebration of the Eucharist as soon as they are able. We are all missing one another!
- ◆ We continue to offer live streaming of our Masses for parishioners who are unable to attend Mass in person.
- ◆ We are making special considerations for the most vulnerable and for families with children too young to be vaccinated.

PLEASE NOTE: All parishioners are required to wear your mask as you enter and exit church.

For the 5:00 PM Saturday Mass and the 10:30 AM Sunday Mass:

Diocesan policies require us to provide two seating options at these Masses.

Seating Option 1: These pews will be labeled “No Physical Distancing and Masks Optional”

Those who choose to sit in these sections will not be physically distancing from other individuals or families. In these sections, individuals can choose to wear a mask or not.

Please follow the directions of the Hospitality Ministers as they direct you to the appropriate sections of pews.

Seating Option 2: These pews will be labeled “Physical Distancing and Masks Required”.

In these sections, all individuals will wear masks and maintain physical distancing protocols.

Please follow the directions of the Hospitality Ministers as they direct you to your specific seats. This will allow us to be sure to seat as many as possible in these sections.

8:00 AM Mass – NO CHANGES AT THIS MASS – Masks and Distancing are still required.

All seating will require wearing masks and maintaining physical distancing. All are welcome to attend this Mass; however, even the fully vaccinated will have to comply with these ongoing requirements.

This Mass option is intended to provide a safe space for the most vulnerable to attend Mass.

Also, this would be a good option for those families whose children are too young for vaccines.

All other COVID-19 restrictions Diocesan Policies for now. For example, the congregation is asked not to sing, no receiving Holy Communion from the chalice, no holding hands during Mass with anyone outside your households.

Reflections on our Readings for The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

***“Go, Therefore . . .
Baptizing Them in the Name of the Father
and of The Son and of The Holy Spirit ”***

As we transition from the Easter Season to ordinary time, the Church uses this opportunity to focus our attention on the central mystery of our faith, the Holy Trinity—the Triune God, three distinct persons in one God. It is the mystery of who God is in himself.

In our first reading (Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40), Moses spoke to the Israelites as they prepared to cross over into the promised land. He reminded them of the awesome glory of their one and only God. A God who loved them into existence and chose them for his special mission on Earth. Notice the focus on the oneness of God, the monotheism that was such a radical departure of everything the ancient world knew as true.

In our Epistle reading (Romans 8:14-17), we hear St. Paul encompassing in this short passage, the Trinity of God, the Spirit, the Father (Abba) and the Son (Christ). We are “Children of God” and “Joint heirs with Christ”. St. Paul teaches us that we are “joint heirs with Christ” and that we glorify God in our suffering.

In our Gospel reading (Matthew 28:16-20), we hear the conclusion of Matthew's Gospel as Jesus gave final instructions to his disciples, to “go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations.” It was in the name of the Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, that he sent them. This is perhaps the clearest indication in the New Testament of the knowledge of the Holy Trinity. Notice, Jesus used the words “in the name of” (singular), not “in the names of” (plural). Even with three distinct and separate persons, there is one God.

Many times throughout the day, we invoke the Holy Trinity in the simple, yet profound act of blessing ourselves. Rarely though, do we ponder the significance of this great mystery. Here is a brief explanation of the Holy Trinity found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 254):

“The divine persons are really distinct from one another. “God is one but not solitary.” “Father”, “Son”, “Holy Spirit” are not simply names designating modalities of the divine being, for they are really distinct from one another: “He is not the Father who is the Son, nor is the Son he who is the Father, nor is the Holy Spirit he who is the Father or the Son.” They are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: “It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds.” The divine Unity is Triune.”


