From the Desk of Fr. Tim . . .

You Asked for It

From time-to-time parishioners ask me questions or bring up an issue with me or a member of the staff and we think these are some things that others may be wondering about as well. So, here is a first installment:

Q. Is Father Tim fully vaccinated? If so, why does he still wear a mask during Mass?

A. Yes, I am fully vaccinated.

I wear a mask during Mass for two reasons. The first is to be in solidarity with those who, for whatever reason, are still wearing masks. Even those vaccinated might want to wear a mask because they have a child who is too young to be vaccinated or because they care for someone who has fragile health.

The second reason is that I am the one breathing on the altar. Out of an abundance of caution, I feel less anxious, and some parishioners feel less anxious, when I wear a mask.

I do not wear a mask outside or at the homes of fully vaccinated friends and family. I do wear a mask in stores. Please get vaccinated. This is a community effort to keep ourselves and one another safe.

Issue: Fussy Children during Mass

Response: Every effort and all our energy should go into welcoming others to Mass, especially families with children. When a child is fussy or cries out or talks loudly (real words or words only known to them 😊) it can be startling the first time. It may draw your attention toward that family. Every time after that in which you are distracted from Mass, is on you. Every time you look toward the family, you must smile. You must give them your most joyous look of welcome and acceptance.

A few weeks ago, I thought I saw someone glaring at a family whose child was being loud. I must have been mistaken. Nobody from St. Rita would be that mean. Nobody here would ever wish that another person was someplace else. Our Mass is not for our own personal prayer. It is our communal worship of God through Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

If a child is inconsolable, it makes sense to walk the child to the back of Church to see if a change of scenery or position helps. If a child is being loud, that is perfect. It is a joyous song to God. We all can focus our attention and prayer even with the beautiful sound of an energetic child in the background.

We do have a "cry room" in the back of church. This room is normally for those whose child is inconsolable. It is for the comfort of the family and not for the comfort of the rest of the congregation. These days it is reserved for families with young, unvaccinated children. Our greeting area is also an option where Mass can be heard.

Every child is welcome and needed here at St. Rita. We must all be the ambassadors of hospitality and joy at their presence.

Issue: People's resting faces kind of look mean and angry.

Response: Smile

Have you seen people in stores or who are in other cars whose "resting face" looks mean and scary? Yours may look that way, too. So, smile! Try to spread joy, not fear, as you make your way through the world. Shake off your resting face and put the energy into a smile. Smile when you are in a car. Smile when you are in a store. Smile when you are at Mass. You are not invisible. Let your light shine!



Reflections on our Readings for The 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Who Then Is This Whom Even Wind And Sea Obey?”

Our Gospel reading this week closes with the question, “Who is this then whom even wind and sea obey?” We find the answer in today’s first reading and in today’s Responsorial Psalm.

Our first reading is taken from the famous 38th chapter of the Book of Job ([Jb 38:18-11](#)) where God asks Job, “Where were you when I founded the earth?”. In this passage, God asks Job who it was who made the sea and set its boundaries.

In our Responsorial Psalm ([Psalm 107:23-31](#)), we hear an almost identical situation to the scene in our Gospel passage. It is God who rescues the mariners and brings them to their desired haven.

In our Epistle reading ([2 Corinthians 5:14-17](#)), St. Paul reminds us that we who have died with Christ no longer live for ourselves but for Christ. We are “a new creation” in Christ.

In our Gospel reading ([Mark 4:35-41](#)), we hear the familiar story of the apostles fearing for their lives in a huge storm as Jesus slept in the stern of the boat. After being awakened, Jesus calmed the storm and chastised them for their lack of faith (trust in God). We often focus on the plight of the apostles in this story and their lack of faith, but many would say that there is a more important aspect to the story. This event is a very clear demonstration that Jesus is not just a creature of high order but he is the creator of all that is. He is, in fact, God himself, come to live among his people (Emmanuel). For who but God can command the winds to subside and the seas to calm?


