The families of St. Rita Parish need the support of our wonderful community.

Let me share with you a window into my life in the past year, which I hope will inspire you to consider how you might help all of our families in the year ahead.

I have a clear memory from late March of last year that will stick with me forever. My twins, then in year-round preschool, probably couldn't remember such a long break from school. We left the house for an afternoon walk, and Connor led me by the hand to the van. He is nonverbal, so he shows us what he wants instead of telling us. And on that day, he showed us in no uncertain terms that he wanted to GO SOMEWHERE. He refused even to walk past the van, and kept placing my hand on the door handle. I don't know where he wanted to go. Wherever it was, it was certainly somewhere other than our neighborhood sidewalk. He cried as I repeated, "No, sweetie." And I cried, lacking a way to explain that there wasn't anywhere to go. Spring and summer were rough on my kids. They were stuck in our small house with nowhere to go get their wiggles out, and no way to understand why their world had shrunk.

It's no secret, I think, that the pandemic has been especially challenging for families with children. My story is just one moment when navigating the loss of community life hit us hard. The families in our community have faced job losses, difficult childcare decisions, the impossible dance of working from home while your children are distance learning, illnesses and deaths in the family, and more. We can't undo the pain of the last year, but there is something you can do to help your neighbors in the year ahead!

As we move towards a life where we gather in person, many of our families are looking to St. Rita's to provide Faith Formation in the classroom again. It is up to us, the members of the community, to respond to that need. As much as I would love to be in all the classrooms teaching all of our kids, God did not grant me any superpowers to make that possible. But God did give all of us the gift of each other – our community, the Body of Christ.

Please consider if God is calling you to help our families as a Faith Formation or Youth Ministry volunteer. I promise, you don't need a degree in theology! The best catechists (teachers) are friends in faith. Christ works in all of us, through our many gifts and talents (and I'll help you, too). Thank you!

Reflections on our Readings for The 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

*"The Bread That I Will Give
Is My Flesh For The Life Of The World"*

Our readings this Sunday continue our exploration of the Bread of Life Discourse in the **Gospel of John, chapter 6** (the next four weeks). This Sunday, we begin to explore two specific themes: 1- The divinity of Jesus ("I am the bread that came down from heaven") and 2- The true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist ("the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world").

In our first reading (1 Kings 19:4-8), we hear the story of the prophet Elijah who was so distraught by the opposition to his ministry that he wanted to just give up. That's something that many people may identify with, especially in these difficult days. God heard Elijah's prayer and intervened through an angel by providing food for his long journey to the mountain of God. There, he would encounter God in the "tiny, whispering sound." Elijah's journey is similar to the Israelite's 40 years of wandering in the desert, eating miraculous food that came down from heaven.

In our Epistle reading (Ephesians 4:30-5:2), St. Paul describes how we Christians are to live in the Spirit. Nourished by the body and blood of Christ, we now have the grace and courage to be "imitators of God . . . and live in love".

In our Gospel reading (John 6:41-51), we hear a passage from the beginning of Jesus' Bread of Life Discourse. The "Jews" (probably people who knew Jesus and his family) found it hard to accept Jesus' claim that he was the Messiah, the "bread that came down from heaven". Jesus' first appeal to them was to believe ("whoever believes has eternal life"). Unfortunately, many could not see beyond their earthly concerns and refused to believe that Jesus was the Messiah. Jesus reminded them that belief in him is a gift given to them by the Father.

Both our first reading and Gospel passage lead us to the Eucharist—the bread come down from heaven. It is this spiritual food and drink that sustains us on our journey to the Father. In some ways, we are like Elijah, tired and disillusioned on the desert path towards the mountain of God. And then, by the grace of God, an angel of the Lord calls to us, "Get up and eat, lest the journey be too long for you." Perhaps this is what St. Thomas Aquinas had in mind when he wrote the song, Panis Angelicus. "The bread of angels has become the bread of men. . . Oh, miraculous thing! The body of the Lord will nourish the poor and humble servant."


Faith Formation




