**Gospel Reading****Mark 7:31-37**

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Again Jesus left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!" that is, "Be opened!" - And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

## Reflections on our Readings for The 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

(Readings can be found on Page 2)



***“Here Is Your God, He Comes With Vindication;  
With Divine Recompense He Comes To Save You”***

Our readings this Sunday draw a direct correlation between the prophesy of the Prophet Isaiah and the actions of Jesus. What Isaiah foretold long ago is fulfilled by Jesus who comes to save us, to open our ears and our hearts to the word of God.

**In our first reading (Isaiah 35:4-7)** Isaiah offers consolation and restoration to a people afflicted and oppressed by the evils of their time. In many ways, our world today is just as afflicted and oppressed by the evils of our time.

**In our Epistle reading (James 2:1-5)**, St. James teaches us that human dignity is not determined by wealth or status. Our faith in the "glorious Lord Jesus Christ" is the great equalizer. Christians show no partiality between the rich and the poor, the weak and the strong, the powerful and the powerless.

**In our Gospel reading (Mark 7:31-37)**, Jesus entered into the pagan territory of the Decapolis, where their ears were closed to the word of God. Jesus healed a deaf man with a speech impediment, echoing Isaiah's prophesy of our first reading. They were astonished and declared, "He has done all things well." This event not only underscores the healing power of Jesus, but also his divinity. "Here is your God . . . He comes to save you" is the echo from Isaiah.

Jesus' healing of the deaf and mute man should be seen also for its deeper, spiritual significance. It is Jesus who "comes with recompense to save us." It is He who opens our ears and hearts to the Gospel and allows us to speak what we hear. It is He who takes us away from the cacophony of voices that drown out God, who touches us and whispers in our ear, "Ephphatha - be opened!". And it is He who gives us the grace and the courage to proclaim the good news that we hear. *"Be strong, fear not!"*




**PARISH FAMILIES NEED OUR HELP**

### Message from your Parish Health Ministry Team

Yes, this message is about vaccines. We hear daily, on TV, radio, newspapers, etc. about Covid-19 and what current guidelines are and we are kept informed through our parish bulletin and staff. St. Rita's is kindly requesting (not requiring) that everyone wear a mask when you are in the church and meeting rooms.

Currently there is a surge in the number of Covid-19 cases, most of which are occurring in people who are unvaccinated and in younger people. The vaccine is available at most local pharmacies and we encourage those of you who are not yet vaccinated to do so as soon as possible.

Other than Covid-19, we are facing the annual seasonal flu which occurs mainly from October-March but can sometimes begin earlier and continue later. The flu vaccine is recommended for those 6 months and older. It is best to receive it before the flu season begins for the most effective coverage, although getting it at any time during the season can still help prevent infections.

Following are tips and actions which can protect you and others from the flu:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick, sneezing and coughing.
- Stay home from work, school, and crowded places.
- Cover your mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing (we know masks work)
- Wash your hands frequently and use hand sanitizers.
- Drink plenty of fluids and eat nutritious foods.

The CDC website [www.cdc.gov](http://www.cdc.gov) and the Monroe County Health Dept. have additional information regarding Covid-19 and the seasonal flu.




