From the Desk of Deacon Jim . . .

Ever ask, "I wonder what their story is?"

We are all made in the image and likeness of God. God loves us more than we can ever imagine. God forgives us over and over. He asks us to do the same for each other. We all know this. It is a cornerstone of our faith.

Yet, we often are challenged to live this way when we don't really know the person. I'm not just talking about someone on the other side of the world, I'm talking about those whom we interact with every day.

Let's try to change that! Beginning on Saturday September 25, following 5 o'clock mass, our racial justice team will host the first of 3 monthly sessions where, while we share a meal in a small group setting, we will also share the stories of our ancestors, how they arrived in the United States, why they made the journey and the struggles and triumphs along the way. We will use Pope Francis's encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti*- on the Fraternity and Social Friendship, as our guide.

Gospel Reading**Mark 9:30-37**

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus and his disciples left from there and began a journey through Galilee, but he did not wish anyone to know about it. He was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him.

They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."



Reflections on our Readings for The 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“If Anyone Wishes to be First, He Shall Be the Last of All and the Servant of All.”

In our readings this Sunday, we hear of the sinful, jealous, prideful nature of humankind contrasted with the humility and gentle love of God in caring for his chosen ones. There is a new understanding of discipleship that Jesus called his disciples to. It was hard for them to understand the ways of this new world in contrast to the world they knew only too well.

In our first reading from the Book of Wisdom ([Wis 2:12,17-20](#)), we hear of the wicked who put the “just one” to the test, eerily prophetic of the disdain the Jewish leaders had for Jesus. Like the “suffering servant” passage of last week’s reading from Isaiah, this passage is seen by scholars as a prediction of the passion of Christ.

In our Epistle reading ([James 3:16 - 4:3](#)), St. James calls out the wickedness and disorder of the world that seeks to destroy and offers the heavenly alternative - peace, gentleness and mercy. This “wisdom from above” is most evident in the person of Jesus. Jesus calls us to be like him.

In our Gospel reading ([Mark 9:30-37](#)), Jesus, for the second time in Mark’s gospel, predicted his passion, death and resurrection. His disciples just could not understand this. They argued instead about who among them would be the greatest. Jesus responded with further teaching about the nature of discipleship. He used a lowly child as an example of servant leadership.

This new nature of discipleship that Jesus preached was so contrary to the wisdom of the world both then and now. The humility of servanthood is the basis of what Jesus calls us to be. He came not to be served but to serve. We are called to do and be the same. There is a saying that may help put this into perspective, “If you seek greatness, you will be disappointed. Rather, seek to serve others and greatness will find you.” May we lose ourselves in the service of others.



Christ is alive and fully present in the Eucharist. Join us as we delve into the “source and summit” of our Faith with Fr. Robert Barron’s DVD-based program: *Eucharist: Sacred Meal, Sacrifice and Real Presence*. This spiritual study will give you a deeper understanding of the precious gift of Christ’s body, blood, soul and divinity that you can receive at each and every Mass.

This fresh look at the Eucharist brings to light its reality as sacred meal, the sacrifice necessary for communion with God, and the Real Presence of Christ.




