Catholic Ministries Appeal Begins

We did it before and we can do it again!

Thank you for all you have done to maintain our parish as a vibrant faith community during these challenging times. Your positive energy, participation and support are greatly appreciated!

We kicked off the CMA this past weekend at Masses. **“Forward in Faith”** is the perfect theme for this year’s Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) since we are all navigating our way in an effort to *move forward* through the pandemic and continue our journey in faith and service to others

The first mailing of the CMA from Bishop Salvatore Matano and myself was sent last week. Your gift supports ministries like: Catholic Charities; Urban, Rural and Multicultural programs and ministries; IT support; Human Resources; Building and Property Management; and Educating Seminarians. These ministries directly benefit our parish.

While the overall Diocesan goal has not increased, our share has increased by \$7000. If our goal has increased, then I know that the goal of a struggling or smaller parish has decreased. This is one more ministry we are supporting! Last year we exceeded our goal by \$7000, so our increase for the sake of those smaller churches, is possible. Last year we had 83 new households participate and the average gift for the 525 participating households had increased!

If you missed seeing the CMA video, you can watch it online on our website. Please pray about your support this year and make your commitment as early as possible. Strongly consider pledging over 7 or 8 months and in this way being able to increase the amount you are able to give.

**Gospel Reading****Mk 10:2-16**

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery; you shall not steal; you shall not bear false witness; you shall not defraud; honor your father and your mother." He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So, Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. 

Reflections on our Readings for The 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Go, Sell What You Have and Give to the Poor and You Will Have Treasure in Heaven; Then Come, Follow Me.”

Our readings for this Sunday teach us the importance of detachment from the things of this world—be it wealth, pleasure, power or honor. It is only by emptying ourselves of these things that can we make room for God in our lives.

In our first reading from the Book of Wisdom (Wis 7:7-11), the author prefers the Spirit of Wisdom to all of the riches the earth has to offer. And yet, “All Good things together came to me in her company and countless riches at her hands”. This parallels so wonderfully what Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel, “Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven.”

In our Epistle reading (Hebrews 4:12-13), we learn that the Word of God (Jesus) penetrates our very soul. Nothing is hidden from him. It is he who knows all and it is to him that we must render an account.

In our Gospel reading (Mark 10:17-30), Jesus contradicts the prevailing understanding that wealth and possessions were a sign of God's favor and blessing. To Jesus, they were a distraction that could lead us away from the Kingdom of God.

Jesus teaches us that our attachment to the things of this world can only distract us from complete dependence and obedience to God. We must be ready to give them up at a moment's notice. In today's Gospel passage, the rich young man was given a choice—choose Jesus or choose your wealth and possessions. Sadly, he chose the latter. How would we choose? It may be time to consider - do our possessions possess us; or can we detach ourselves from the things of this world to focus completely on the Kingdom God?



Enjoy a Safe and Healthy Fall Season Follow these tips to help you and your family enjoy a healthy and safe autumn:

- ◆ Be cautious of back to school traffic. Drive with children in mind.
- ◆ Clear leaves to prevent slip and fall accidents. In the fall we get a lot of rain and causes surfaces to be slippery especially when covered with leaves.
- ◆ Have fireplaces and furnaces cleaned and serviced. Furnaces, wood stoves and fireplaces have been sitting unused and could be a hazard without proper inspection and service.
- ◆ Make sure your batteries are working. Test and replace batteries in smoke detectors. House fires are common in the fall.
- ◆ Practice caution when taking your kids trick or treating. Be sure costumes don't limit vision, use flashlights and inspect treats!
- ◆ Wear something reflective when walking at night. It gets dark earlier so be prepared.
- ◆ Be prepared for cold and flu season! Wash your hands frequently, use hand sanitizer and get a flu shot!




