> BAPTISM: Celebrated every 2nd, 3rd & 4th Sunday after the 11 a.m. Mass. Remember that Godparents must be practicing Catholics who have reached their 16th year and have received all of the Sacraments of Initiation, (Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation). For those Godparents who are married, their marriage must be recognized as valid by the Catholic Church. Only one Godparent is required and not more than two. When two are acting as Godpar-

> ents, one must be male and the other female according to Canon Law. If the Godparent (s) are registered at another parish, they must obtain a Certificate of

Sponsorship from their pastor and have it sent to St. Joseph Church.

MATRIMONY: In accordance with Diocesan Policy, arrangements for a wedding should be made at least one year in advance. Before contracting a date with a venue, please call the Parish Office to schedule a wedding appointment with the Pastor.

MINISTRY OF THE HOMEBOUND, SICK AND DYING: Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for Holy Communion and/or the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick or Last Rites to be administered to those who are ill and for those undergoing surgery.

FAITH FORMATION: For the School year of 2021-22, classes for grades 7th, 8th and 9th meet in person twice a month, 2nd grade meets once a month in person and both have at home instruction when not in person. All other grades are at home instruction using the My Catholic Faith Delivered program. Please contact Shari Schultz, our PCL, at (908) 638-6453 for more information.

TENEBRAE SERVICE Join Fr. James & Dr. Al Cresi along



with the St. Joseph Choir at our very first **Tenebrae Service**, (ten-uh-bray) on **Spy Wednesday**, **April 13 at 7 pm.** Tenebrae is a unique and spiritual ceremony consisting of readings, music, responses, and candles. You will see in the sanctuary, what is called a **Tenebrae hearse**, which is a candelabra with 7

candles lit. After each reading a candle will be extinguished. This will slowly bring the Church to darkness, which provides a stark visual of how Our Lord was left all alone, in the darkness of the world. But there will remain, in the end, one hidden candle still lit, which will signify the burial of Jesus in the tomb. At last you will hear a loud noise from the choir loft, sounding like thunder, known as the **strepitus** which means "loud noise" in Latin. This sound represents the earthquake at the Crucifixion. The Service comes to an abrupt end, all will leave silently, reflecting on the ultimate price Our Lord paid for man's sin. All are invited to attend this moving service.

ADORATION ON HOLY THURSDAY On the night of Holy



Thursday, Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place from 8 pm to 11 pm, where the faithful remain in the presence of the Eucharist just as the Disciples kept a vigil with Christ.

The **tradition** goes back to Europe in the Middle Ages and has its roots even earlier, when Christians began to fast leading

up to Christ's Passion. As the Church evolved, the people began to celebrate the end of the rigors of fasting by eating a special meal on Easter Sunday that included many of the foods avoided during Lent. Beginning around the 15th century, parishioners began asking their pastor to bless this Easter food, often brought to the church in a basket. The sadness of Holy Saturday will soon give way to the joy of Easter Sunday, the joy that Jesus Christ is alive and has broken the chains of death forever!

Lenten Prayer Lord, let everything I do this day and in this Season of Lent, come from You and be inspired by You. I

long to be closer to You. Help me to remember that nothing is important in my life unless it glorifies You in some way. ... "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

Again He bent down and wrote on the ground.

And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So He was left alone with the woman before Him.

John 8:1-11

This passage comes from the story of the woman caught in adultery when she is dragged before Jesus to see if He would support her stoning. His response is perfect and, in the end, she is left alone to encounter the tender mercy of Jesus.

But there is a line in this passage that is easily overlooked. It is the line that states, "...beginning with the elders." This reveals an interesting dynamic within human communities. Generally speaking, those who are younger tend to lack the wisdom and experience that comes with age.

Though the young may find it hard to admit, those who have lived a long life have a unique and broad picture of life. This enables them to be far more prudent in their decisions and judgments, especially when it comes to the more intense situations in life.

In this story, the woman is brought before Jesus with a harsh judgment. Emotions are high and these emotions clearly cloud the rational thinking of those who are ready to stone her. Jesus cuts through this irrationality by a profound statement. "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

Perhaps, at first, those who were younger or more emotional did not allow the words of Jesus to sink in. They probably stood there with stones in hand waiting to start throwing, but then the elders began to walk away. **This is age and wisdom at work**. They were less controlled by the emotion of the situation and were immediately aware of the wisdom of the words spoken by our Lord. As a result, the others followed.

Reflect, today, upon the wisdom that comes with age. If you are older, reflect upon your responsibility to help guide the younger generation with clarity, firmness and love. If you are younger, do not neglect to rely upon the wisdom of the older generation. Though age is not a perfect guarantee of wisdom, it may be a far more significant factor than you realize. Be open to your elders, show them respect, and learn from the experiences they have had in life.

Prayer for the young: Lord, give me a true respect for my elders. I thank you for their wisdom stemming from the many experiences they have had in life. May I be open to their counsel and be guided by their gentle hand. **Jesus, I trust in You**.

Prayer for the elder: Lord, I thank You for my life and for the many experiences I have had. I thank You for teaching me through my hardships and struggles, and I thank You for the joys and loves that I have encountered in life. Continue to pour forth Your wisdom upon me so that I may help guide Your children. May I always seek to set a good example and lead them according to Your Heart. **Jesus, I trust in You**.




Let us continue to pray to St. Joseph
