

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus sends 72 disciples in pairs to every town He had intended to visit. In some translations, the number is 70.

According to Jewish tradition, there were as many as 70 to 72 nations outside of Israel. Clearly, for Luke, Jesus intended to send the disciples on a worldwide mission to proclaim something new.

The Lord's intent is not to restore the old Jerusalem but rather to proclaim to all of the world the message, "*The Kingdom of God is at hand for you.*"

The worldwide mission continues even in our lives today. Most people — even Christians — do not know of the joy of embracing the Good News of God's Kingdom breaking into our world. They are so caught up in the affairs and news of our passing world and not on the things of heaven.

The worldwide mission belongs to you too. There is a sense of urgency in Jesus' message to "Go on your way" (even leaving money, sack, and sandals behind) and to spread the Good News.

Question:

How do you see yourself as a missionary for God's Kingdom?



Let us pray for the grace this week to labor wholeheartedly for the Kingdom of God, and to spread peace wherever we go.
