



Catholic Life Explained

Question: Why do we hold hands during the Our Father?

Answer: The practice of members of the assembly holding hands while praying the Lord's Prayer during the Mass is a custom that developed organically in the 1970s and 1980s. While some commentators acknowledge that the practice varies from place to place, it is a fairly universal reality in parishes across the United States. For some, this action symbolizes the communion of Christians praying together as one family of believers honoring the Father of All. Critics of the practice sometimes express concern that holding hands can be a distraction from the more significant unity that is experienced when we process to the altar to receive sacramental communion.

And so, we're left to ask, what is the answer?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the document that offers specific instructions for the celebration of Mass) is silent on the practice, saying only that "all the faithful say the prayer" with the priest. The website of the US Bishops simply observes that "No position is prescribed in the Roman Missal for an assembly gesture during the Lord's Prayer." And so, we are left to discern within ourselves and within our parish and religious communities what is an authentic

gesture of praise during this important point of the Mass. For some, it means continuing to hold hands, while for others, it may mean adopting another posture of prayer.

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.



If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator.

Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die.

People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God's help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?

Before Making a Resolution . . . Make a Confession

An approaching new year is everyone's favorite time to make resolutions. We're filled with hope, anticipation, and a little bit of "next year will be my best year ever!" As we celebrate the birth of Jesus and look forward to the promise of starting fresh, it is a fitting time to look ahead and make plans. We love to make resolutions. But confessions? Not so much.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is one of the most cleansing, grace-filled experiences of our faith, yet ask Catholics the last time they went to confession and all of a sudden, they get very sheepish. I'll admit, when a new year rolls around, I start "should-ing" myself - I should do this, I should start that. And for most of my life, Confession felt like one of those things I should do, without any real enthusiasm or true appreciation for it. I want to recognize Confession for the blessing that it is. So, before making a resolution for 2021, let's make a Confession of 2020. If we never face the weaknesses that are leading us down the wrong path or the ugliness we've created, how will we ever have the self-awareness and motivation to do things differently? How can we ever change to move forward?

Through his death and resurrection, Jesus freed us from sin. Period. The Sacrament of Reconciliation reaffirms this every time, and God offers us his mercy in a special way. If we only understood the grace available to us through this Sacrament, we would be running to the confessional every chance we got. For me, Confession used to be an obligation to fulfill at least twice a year during Advent and Lent. But about two years ago, I made the commitment to try and go to Confession every three months as a "tune up." I do as much for my car - why not my soul? Slowly, it has become a treasured practice.

Of course, COVID has changed the experience of going to Confession. Many parishes are not ready to do in-person confessions, or perhaps you do not feel safe attending if they do. If either is the case, you can still do a thorough examination of conscience. Take the time to reflect on how you have sinned "in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do." Making a confession to God, even if it's not with a priest present, is an act of humility. It's admitting that we're not perfect and we could've done better. Be honest with yourself and dig deep. Then, bring it all to Jesus. Tell him your sins; ask for his mercy; promise to do better. While it's not a Sacrament, it's certainly a helpful spiritual exercise.

An examination of conscience is as close as I'll get. Humbly asking the Holy Spirit to open my eyes to discern my actions, thoughts, and feelings will help me know if I'm on the right track. Going to Confession will give me the freedom that I seek, that we were made for. Trust me, there's plenty from 2020 I'm thrilled to leave behind. If I carry anything with me into the new year, I want it to be the feeling of God's total, loving mercy. Only then will I feel truly ready to make my resolutions for 2021.

Celebrate the Sacraments

Baptism: Baptism is celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month after the 11:00 am Mass and on the 4th Sunday during the 11:00 am Mass. Please call the Parish office at least two months in advance to make arrangements.

First Reconciliation & First Communion: Our Faith Formation Program begins with Grade 1. First reconciliation and First Communion is a 2-year program. Please call the Faith Formation office to register your child.

Confirmation: Confirmation is a 2-year program beginning in 9th grade. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the spring of their 10th grade year.

Matrimony: Couples are asked to contact the Parish at least one year in advance.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish office at anytime for Communion calls or visitation of the sick or elderly. Holy Communion may be brought to the home of any person who is temporarily or permanently homebound.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): RCIA prepares adolescents and adults for Baptism and full Communion into the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish office for information

St. Matthew's invites everyone to participate in our spiritual, educational and social life. Please complete a registration form and join our Parish family! Forms may be found on the Parish website, in the Gathering Space or you may contact the Parish office and we will mail/email the registration form to you. Registration is required for Religious Education Programs and for the reception of all Sacraments. **Only active, registered members of the Parish may receive sponsor forms for Baptism or Confirmation.** If you need a sponsor form, please contact the office and we will be happy to assist you.
