SILENT NIGHT

It was Christmas Eve in the Austrian Alps. Fr, Joseph Mohr was distraught because the organ was broken, he wanted a song that could be sung organless, so he hastily wrote the words, "Silent night, holy night, all is calm, all is bright..." and gave them to his organist, asking him to compose a simple tune. That night December 24, 1818, "Silent Night" was sung for the first time as a duet accompanied by a guitar.



"Silent Night" was first published for congregational singing in 1838 in the German hymnbook, *Katholisches Gesang*. It was used in America by German-speaking congregations, then appeared in its current English form in a book of Sunday school songs in 1863.

Were it not for a broken organ, there would never have been a Silent Night

QUESTION?

DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 25, 2021 - The Nativity of the Lord

"He so loved us that for our sake He was made man in time, through Whom all times were made; was in the world less in years than His servants, though older than the world itself in His eternity; was made man, Who made man; was created of a mother, whom He created; was carried by hands which He formed; nursed at the breasts which He had filled; cried in the manger in wordless infancy, He the Word without Whom all human eloquence is mute (St. Augustine, Sermon 188)." The miracle of what happens at Christmas is truly an awesome mystery. Revealed in the silent ordinariness of life is God's intimate love for humanity and all that he made. The Word, existing for all time, comes and dwells among us. God kisses us. We can seek and soar with playful delight as a joy never known before fills our heart.
