



GODPARENT REQUIREMENTS

God Parents: I have had so many questions about God Parents, I thought I would try to answer some of those questions.

First, who can be God Parent to a Catholic child? Normally there is one God Father and one God mother, both of whom are fully initiated practicing Catholics. Fully initiated simply means you are Baptized and Confirmed and have received Holy Communion. There can only be one God Father and One God Mother. You cannot have two God Fathers or two God Mothers. Only one God Parent is needed for a Catholic Baptism and can be a male or female.

Secondly, can a Christian who is not Catholic be a God Parent for a Catholic Child? No, only a fully initiated and practicing Catholic can be a God Parent. Our Christian brothers and sisters are allowed to be Christian witnesses to a Catholic Baptism. So, you can have one fully initiated practicing Catholic and a baptized Christian of another tradition to be present at the Baptism.

Thirdly, can a person who was baptized Catholic but converted to another Christian religion be a God Parent or a Christian witness for a baptism. No, the Church considers a person who is baptized Catholic to always be a Catholic, even if they chose to become another religion. Since they are not practicing Catholics, they can't be a God Parent or Christian witness.

Fourthly, can a Catholic be a God Parent to a child who is not Catholic? No, because being a God Parent means that you will be accepting the responsibility of raising that Child in the Catholic Faith if something happens to the child's parents. This is something that the non-Catholic parents would not want.

Hope this answers your questions about God Parents. If I have left anything out. Let me know.


