

NEXT SUNDAY'S SCHEDULE OF MASSES FOR PRIESTS

- * Today, the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, has been chosen by Pope Francis as **Sunday of the Word of God**—a special day every year for the people of the Church to a) study and embrace the awesome teachings in the Bible, and b) to celebrate and spread the Word of God. Not just by what we say, but by how we live! All baptized people are to be messengers of God's Word: "The word of God proclaimed in the celebration of God's mysteries does not only address our present conditions but looks back to past events and forward to what is yet to come." It is not too late to make a good resolution: to read at least a small part of the Bible every day.
- * Father John Kallattil arrived in India safely, and has finished eight days in quarantine with his brother priests before heading to his relatives. When he returns to New York, we will resume our 12 Noon Masses on Tuesdays to Fridays on February 9.
- * Please join me in praying today for priests associated with parishes near us. One of them is Father AJ Micciulla, pastor of Holy Family Church on Watchogue Road. He is easily recognized by his beard and motorcycle. Fr. Micciulla is quarantined as he waits for a kidney transplant in a few weeks. The wonderful kidney donor from his parish is recovering from Covid, so pray for her too.
- * I am sad to report the deaths of two priests with local connections. Msgr. Ferdinando Berardi, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church on Forest Avenue, and Msgr. Thomas Modugno, a former associate pastor, died within hours of one another January 10-11. Msgr. Thomas Modugno, retired and very sick with cancer, was 83. Msgr. Berardi, 71, was an active pastor, thought to be in good health. We had a Staten Island clergy meeting at his parish Monday afternoon, January 10. Bishop Whalen and I ate supper with him afterwards. Unexpectedly, he died in his sleep that night. He is greatly missed by his family and by his parish family. Cardinal Timothy Dolan, with many priests and parishioners in attendance, offered his Funeral Mass on Monday morning in Blessed Sacrament Church.
- * Also on January 11, many of our parishioners received a letter from Cardinal Dolan, who as our archbishop and compassionate shepherd for people in need, is fulfilling his responsibility of launching the CARDINAL'S ANNUAL STEWARDHIP APPEAL.

With the renewed lesson that we all need to do what we can do while we can do it, I am making one of the first pledges for this new Appeal, and asking all of you to join me in sharing some of what God has given us.

Ultimately, isn't everything we have something that comes from God? You benefit from your God-given talent, your intelligence, your education, to make a living. Yes, you contribute your labor and dedication, and deserve credit and thanks. But even before your efforts, you depended upon your family, your upbringing, your connections and those who loved and sheltered you and helped you.

Aren't all these good people, and all these talents and gifts, unearned and possibly undeserved? Christians wisely are very grateful for Christ and all He has done for us. Even someone who does not believe in God is thankful to others for their work for his or her comfort and security. For example: lose your job, and get a lead for a new one, and you become much more grateful for the next person who takes a chance on you, and then for your first pay check. And so, even if we were not previously grateful, our troubles should fill us with new appreciation for what we had—and with a desire to help others. Plenty of people are as good as us or better, but have not had the same opportunity to live in freedom and peace and prosperity.

Therefore I am urging you to answer this year's **Cardinal's Stewardship AppeaI**. Stewardship means taking care of what you have and using it wisely—and in this case, generously. Help yourself to be a better person, help our archdiocese and world to be a better place, by doing what we should do for the mission Jesus gave to the Apostles and us: Love one another as I have loved you.

Do we need more motivation? Cardinal Dolan has chosen for the Scriptural theme of our Stewardship Appeal poignant words of Saint Peter in the Gospel of John that remind us of a painful day when Jesus was being abandoned by many listeners after He told them that He was the Bread of Life, and that they needed to receive Him to save themselves. In fact, honoring the Pope's desire for us to focus today on the Word of God, let me copy for us parts of Jesus' Bread of Life teaching in the Gospel of John Chapter 6:

- V. 27 "Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life."
- V. 35 "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."
- V. 47 "Amen, amen, I say to you: whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life."
- V. 51 "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever."

The Apostles did not always love Jesus the way He wanted them to. Neither do we. We are tempted to be too worried about ourselves and our needs. Fear of poverty is reasonable; giving nothing to help others is not. Fear of running out of money later should not keep us from sharing some of what we have now, while we can. Live dangerously! (A comedian might say: *give it away before the tax man takes it.*) If you still remember Bob Hope—and think about what a great stage name he took—be sure to read some of his classic quips inside on page 4. And then look at page 5 for a quick picture of where needs are great and what our Cardinal's Appeal contributions, that we will soon be making, will do for many people who need both material assistance and the Bread of Life.

Our parishioners can make an appointment to meet with a professional counselor on Staten Island for up to six meetings, with only a \$10 co-pay per session.




