

LENTEN RECIPE

Shrimp Scampi

Ingredients

12 oz. linguine

1 1/2 lbs extra large shrimp, peeled and deviened

3 Tbsp extra virgin olive oil

3 Tbsp unsalted butter

4 garlic cloves, minced (4 tsp)

1/2 cup dry white wine*

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

1/8 tsp red pepper flakes (optional)

2 Tbsp fresh lemon juice

1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley

Instructions

Cook linguine according to package instructions. Reserve 1/4 cup pasta water before draining in case you'd like to thin the dish later.

Meanwhile, melt butter with olive oil in a 12-inch skillet just over medium heat. Add garlic and saute 1 - 2 minutes until just lightly golden (don't brown or it can taste bitter).

Add wine and simmer until reduced by half, about 2 - 3 minutes.

Add in shrimp in an even layer season with salt, pepper and red pepper flakes and cook until shrimp turn pink, about $1 \frac{1}{2} - 2$ minutes per side.

Stir in lemon juice and parsley, then toss shrimp and sauce with pasta. Thin with pasta water as needed. Serve immediately.

Use cloth instead of paper in your kitchen


