

Parish Happenings – Property Management Committee September 2024

You may have noticed that the Rectory looks a little different. This summer the Porch & Porte Cochere underwent a restoration. Following a bidding process in the spring, TruNorth Construction was retained to replace the porch deck with a composite material, similar to the front porch. All five columns have been replaced with fiber resin columns and painted. The Porch & Porte Cochere beams have been reclad with PVC & dentil. New lattice work has been installed. Two new handrails have been fabricated and installed. The existing hand rail has been repainted. The downspouts & the lighting cables have been relocated to improve appearance.

The entire Rectory driveway has been torn up, regraded, and paved. A new catch basin cover has been installed. Topsoil & grass seed have been placed to improve the overall grades.

In addition, the rear church entrance ramp handrails have been prepared and painted.

Storm panels are being installed on the Sacristy windows to help sustain the integrity of the stained-glass windows, and to provide insulation value.

These and other efforts by the Property Management Committee are ongoing, such as tree/shrub trimming, lawn maintenance & painting.

accepted after that date. We will not accept books, CD's, DVD's or electronics. Please be sure the items are clean.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." (Mark 10:25)

Jesus uses tough language that we may not want to hear. However, we are <u>all</u> called to be generous with <u>all</u> of our gifts. Not just the ones we pick and choose, but all our gifts, and especially the one that means the most to us! That includes our time in prayer to God, our talent in participating in parish ministries and our treasure supporting our local parish and other charities.



On October 18th, we celebrate the **Feast of St. Luke the Evangelist**, our parish's patron saint. St. Luke is the author of the Gospel of St. Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. He never met Jesus in person, but came to know Jesus by talking to eyewitnesses to the events of Jesus' life, death and Resurrection. It is believed he was a physician and painted one of the earliest portraits of the Virgin Mary. He accompanied St. Paul on his missionary journey. St. Luke is believed to have died at the age of eighty-four "full of the Holy Spirit."

St. Luke's symbol is the winged ox, which represents sacrifice, service, and strength. You can see the winged ox resting at the base of our St. Luke's statue. St. Luke is the patron saint of physicians and artists.

Please join us in saying the **Novena to St. Luke** which begins on October 9^{th} and ends on the Feast day, October 18^{th} .
