

From the desk of Fr. Sullivan

Dear Friends,

This week marks three years since Archbishop Blair appointed me as pastor/rector of our beautiful Basilica. I thought after three years of being together, I would share some sentiments about that journey. When I was ordained a permanent deacon in 2008, with little or no intention of becoming a priest, I was assigned to the four churches in Torrington, then called the Torrington Cluster of Roman Catholic Parishes. I absolutely loved being a deacon. It was wonderful to serve both in the church and in society, running a business that I loved. For me, serving both the spiritual and the secular, was a perfect combination. Long story short and in God's time, the second call to priesthood came. After six years of diaconate, I was ordained to the priesthood in May 2014. Surprisingly, I was assigned to Torrington again, but now as a priest and living in the rectory. I love Torrington and was very saddened to receive a call in October 2015 notifying me that I was being transferred to Ansonia.

God is everywhere and people are people, and very quickly a deep love for the parish and people of Ansonia followed. At the Church of the Assumption, my building skills were used to the fullest and I was grateful for the opportunity to transform a school auditorium that had been closed for 50 years into a state-of-the-art gymnasium. We also were able to update a chapel in the rectory for daily mass, thanks to the generosity of a parishioner, Ron Greski, who just passed away last week. Ansonia was fulfilling and I felt God's life and presence there.


One afternoon in mid-January 2019, after three and a half years at the Church of the Assumption, I received a call from Fr. Bob Vargo (now deceased), the priest who assisted Archbishop Blair in making priestly assignments for our archdiocese. He said, "Jim, do you have a minute?" From the tone of his voice, I knew immediately that I was being moved and my heart sank. He began to go through a list of 12 priests also being transferred. Somewhere in the conversation, he must have mentioned Fr. Ford but I was still in shock and only heard a few of the names. He then said to me, "I'm sending you to the Basilica in Waterbury." I simply said, "What?" He responded "Is that okay?" It didn't really matter if it was okay or not, this was where they wanted me to serve. I simply said "Yes, that would be a dream come true." "Good," he said. "It is my hardest assignment in the Archdiocese."

I would have been very content to serve in Torrington or Ansonia for the remainder of my priesthood but admittedly, there is something very special to serve in your hometown and in a church where there are many memories from younger years. I hope and pray to be with you for many years to come. The Basilica is the first Catholic church in Waterbury and considered the mother church of the entire area. The potential for evangelization, spreading the good news of the Gospel, is immense and now even more so, with the beatification of our native son, Blessed Michael McGivney.

Please pray for the Basilica and the entire Archdiocese of Hartford. We need priestly vocations but we also need devoted laity. I truly believe the good Lord will abundantly bless us with both.


