Dear brothers and sisters.

In the gospel this weekend we never heard what happen to the rich young man after he was told by Jesus to sell everything and give it to the poor. From the gospel we know the young man was attached to his properties, possessions and money, but we really do not know the end of the story, or if indeed he changed his heart, share with the poor, and finally put people first rather than the money.

Jesus presence and healing changed the ones who encounter him along the way; the blind see, the paralyzed walk, the deaf hear, so it could quite possible for many theologians that the rich young man who was in a sense living with a different kind of blindness and paralysis also changed by his encounter with Jesus.

It is quite possible that the story from the gospel of Mark has an open ended, as a way of telling us, that our lives too are open ended as well and that we have choices and we are the ones who will write the end of our stories, because we have the free will to change.

Not all the message from the Gospel is about material possessions there are other things that could be in our way of salvation, because we are so attached to many things or people, could be even the fear to change itself or the inability to trust or to love that prevent us from having a free heart to love and follow Jesus. It is hard for us sometimes to give many things that we want to hold into ourselves, things that most probably we do not need to carry anymore, things we do not really posses but rather they posses us and prevent us from growing. The gospel this weekend invites us to let go the things we don not need anymore and to look for what is really important in our lives; that is our salvation in heaven.
