DIOCESE APPOINTS FIRST PARISH LIAISON

"I'm not here to audit or admonish; I'm here to consult" That's the answer Stephen Sycks, the new parish liaison officer for the diocese is giving when he calls on pastors for the first time. So why is the diocese providing a financial consultant to parishes, and what is the basis of the consultation?.

Paul Schasel, director of the Office of Fiscal Affairs, who has been looking to fill the position for a while, makes it clear: "We have some parishes which are large enough and with sufficient resources to operate their parish well. Others are struggling from a lack of resources or experience to deal with the challenges that parishes face today."

"I'm grateful to Steve for launching this new service to our pastors and administrators," added Bishop McManus. "Priests no longer have the opportunity to spend years mentoring with various pastors and may not be sure where to turn for administrative help as they begin their first pastorate."

The challenges parishes face are numerous, Mr. Schasel and Mr. Sycks point out.

Along with encouraging parishioners to come to Mass regularly, many pastors are dealing with aging buildings and deferred maintenance, human resource issues that arise especially with insurance and other benefits, and fund raising to keep the parish offertory income in line with operating expenses.

"While our mission as a church is not to make money, you can't address mission without resources. The old axiom is simple, but blunt: 'no money, no mission,'" said Mr. Sycks.

Mr. Sycks is no stranger to parish life, fund raising or looking at budgets. Early in his career he spent years as a commercial loan officer analyzing operating budgets and balance sheets when small companies, in particular, applied for business loans. He points out, "It's amazing how often people don't look at how the numbers tell a story about an organization's health" and this often would lead to conversations and dialogue about what the numbers were saying.

Mr. Steve Sycks is visiting our parish this coming Tuesday at 3 pm to meet with Fr. Henry and Glen Hunt our finance chair person, to give us ideas and advices that will help us with our parish finances.

Our goal is to work our best for our parish and everything done to the glory of God.

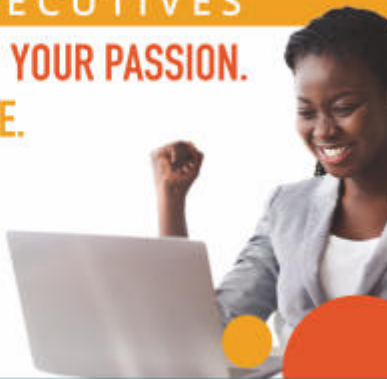
